## Euharlee Council considers use of Jolly Building

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Mayor pro-tem Craig Guyton gavelled the Euharlee City Council's work session to order Tuesday.  
First on the agenda was the disposition of the Jolly Building, a structure donated to the city by the Jolly family for use by the Girls Scouts and Boy Scouts. Representatives of the Bartow foster care system also asked to use of the building too.

Shawna Lewis, the Division of Family and Childrens Services resource development case manager, spoke to the council. "I work with developing foster homes and foster parents," she said. "Currently there are 147 kids in DFCS custody with 39 foster homes. With that many kids, we have so many uses for this building. When people come to donate items — baby beds, clothing, whatever, we have to decline because we have nowhere to keep it. This building would allow us the stor-

age needed for donations."  
Lewis said the building would also be used as a place for training foster parents. "We are constantly having to find businesses with enough space for the training," she said. "There's also a need for space for continuing education and the foster parents association meetings."  
Sherry Bowser, president of the Bartow Adoptive-Foster Parents Association, said they have been looking for a home for many years.

"We have gone from church to church to church," she said. "We really need the space and the Jolly Building would serve that purpose."  
Guyton wondered if the city's policy of only allowing 5013(c)(3) organizations to use city property would present a problem since DFCS is a state entity.  
The BAFPA, a 5013(c)(3) organization, would run the facility rather than DFCS due to that conflict of interest.  
Council also discussed proposals for

maintenance of the cemetery adjacent to the former Euharlee Presbyterian Church, which was donated to the city after the church ceased to use it.  
"We were gifted the church property because their trust was declining in value and we helped with the upkeep," Guyton said. "One of the things they asked of us was that church members be buried there, which we agreed to. Because of that, I

## Adairsville PD makes major drug bust

In what is being called one of the largest methamphetamine busts in Adairsville history, the Adairsville Police Department seized more than 2 1/2 pounds of methamphetamine, 4 ounces of marijuana and several hundred pills after a traffic stop on Highway 140 early Wednesday morning.  
The driver of the car, 39-year-old Adam Hall, and the passenger, 36-year-old Sahnna Lau, both of Calhoun, have been arrested and charged with trafficking methamphetamine, possession with intent to distribute methamphetamine, possession of more than 1 ounce of marijuana, possession of marijuana with intent to distribute and four counts of possession of a controlled substance.  
"This is one of the largest methamphetamine seizures in Adairsville history," an APD press release said Wednesday afternoon. "We would like to extend our appreciation to Calhoun PD for assisting us with

the help of their K-9 officer. It is always beneficial when agencies have a good working relationship that can help each other in getting drugs off our streets and out of our community."  
According to the press release, APD officers stopped the vehicle at about 2 a.m. Wednesday after observing "a busted windshield" and suspicious activity when the car was parked at two different businesses in Adairsville. The officers observed the car parked at a gas pump at Patty's Truck Stop on Highway 140 for approximately an hour. A short time later, officers saw the vehicle parked at the QuikTrip.  
As the car left QT and turned onto Highway 140, officers stopped it, and found the driver, Hall, was wanted for parole violation.  
After speaking with the passenger, Lau, who was the owner of the car, the officers asked to search it. Lau refused consent to search, and the officers contacted Calhoun



Police to ask for a K-9 unit. After performing a "free-air sniff," police were alerted to narcotics inside the car. Officers found a camouflage backpack in the rear seat within arm's reach of Hall and Lau. The backpack had 2 1/2 pounds of methamphetamine in various plastic containers and bags, more than 4 ounces of mari-

juana, several hundred Schedule I, II, III and IV pills, several digital scales, glass smoking pipes and more than \$8,000 in cash.  
In addition to the drug offenses, Hall was charged with traffic offenses for starburst windshield and driving with an expired license.

# Man convicted in 1996 killing to be executed

ATLANTA — A man convicted of killing an off-duty prison guard after asking him for a ride outside a Georgia Walmart store is scheduled to be executed next month.

Robert Earl Butts Jr., 40, is scheduled to die May 3 at the state prison in Jackson, state Attorney General Chris Carr said in a statement Monday. Butts and Marion Wilson Jr., 41, were convicted and sentenced to death in the March 1996 slaying of Donovan Corey Parks.

Wilson's case is currently pending before the U.S. Supreme Court.

Attorneys for Butts have argued that his trial defense was ineffective and failed to thoroughly investigate his case or to present mitigating evidence, including a childhood characterized by abuse and neglect, that could have spared him the death penalty. State and federal courts have rejected his appeals.

But his lawyers argued in a federal court filing last week that a Georgia Supreme Court opinion published in January opens the door for a federal judge to consider his claims of ineffective assistance

of counsel. Authorities said Butts and Wilson were gang members, and evidence was presented at Butts' trial that showed the two had gone looking for a victim when they drove Butts' car to a Walmart store in Milledgeville, in central Georgia. A witness saw the pair standing behind Parks in a checkout line, and the store's receipts showed Butts bought a pack of gum right after Parks bought pet supplies, according to a Georgia Supreme Court summary of the case. A witness heard Butts ask Parks for a ride. Parks agreed and Butts climbed in the front passenger seat while Wilson sat in the back behind Parks. After they'd driven a short dis-

tance, Butts showed Parks a shotgun and ordered him to stop the car, the summary says. Parks was dragged from the car, ordered to lie face-down on the ground and was killed with a single shot to the back of his head.

Butts and Wilson then drove to a service station in Gray and put gas in Parks' car before driving to Atlanta to try to sell the car. Unsuccessful, they bought two cans of gasoline, drove to a remote part of Macon and set fire to the vehicle. They walked to a nearby public phone where Butts called his uncle to arrange a ride back to the Walmart to get Butts' car.

Investigators recorded the license plate numbers of the vehicles in the Walmart parking lot that night, including Butts' car. They found a shotgun loaded with unusual ammunition under Wilson's bed, and a witness said Butts had given it to Wilson to hold temporarily, according to the summary.

Butts would be the second inmate executed by Georgia this year. Carlton Gary, convicted of raping and killing three older women and known as the "stocking strangler," was put to death

March 15.

Georgia executes inmates by injection of the barbiturate pentobarbital. Since 2013, the Department of Corrections has gotten the drug from a compounding pharmacy

whose identity is shielded by state law, and department records from past executions show the drug is generally produced within the two weeks leading up to an execution date.

## Prosecutor says McIver coveted his wife's money

ATLANTA — An Atlanta attorney who fatally shot his wife coveted her money and killed her intentionally, a prosecutor argued Tuesday. A defense attorney rejected that, saying his client adored his wife and the case against him is an "accident in search of a motive." Everyone agrees that Claud "Tex" McIver, 75, fatally shot Diane McIver in September 2016. But jurors, who heard from dozens of witnesses over roughly four weeks of testimony, must now decide whether he did it on purpose.

Prosecutor Clint Rucker said in his closing argument that there was clear, compelling and overwhelming evidence that McIver intentionally killed his wife. He did it because he was financially dependent on her and feared losing that support, Rucker said.

"When he killed Diane McIver, it was like hitting the lottery," Rucker said. "If she stopped supporting him in the manner to which he was accustomed, he had a problem."

But defense attorney Bruce Harvey called the prosecution's case a "tale of innuendos and undelivered promises." McIver depended on his wife's largesse and loved her dearly, defense attorneys said.

In the absence of a strong case, the prosecution did everything they could to vilify McIver and decided, "We are going to make this jury not like him," defense attorney Don Samuel said, adding, "That's their mission."

The McIvers were wealthy and well-connected. He was a partner at a prominent labor and employment law firm and served on the state election board. She was president of U.S. Enterprises Inc., the parent company of Corey Airport Services, where she had worked for 43 years.

Dani Jo Carter, a close friend of Diane McIver, was driving the couple's Ford Expedition on the evening of Sept. 25, 2016, as the three returned from a weekend at the McIvers' horse farm in Putnam County, about 75 miles east of Atlanta. Diane McIver was in the front passenger seat and Tex McIver was in the back seat behind his wife.

With traffic heavy on the interstate, Carter exited in downtown Atlanta. Concerned about the area where they exited, Tex McIver asked his wife to hand him a gun that was in the car's console. Bill Crane, a family friend acting as a

spokesman, told news outlets several days after the shooting that when the SUV was approached by people at an intersection, the McIvers were nervous about unrest surrounding Black Lives Matter protests and feared a carjacking.

A short while later, McIver fired the gun, hitting his wife in the back. Carter drove to Emory University Hospital, where Diane McIver died.

An attorney for McIver told news outlets a few days later there had been no concern about unrest or protesters, but rather about people who were in the street in an area frequented by homeless people. Prosecutors said McIver tried to pressure Crane to withdraw his statement and charged him with influencing a witness, but the judge

dismissed the charge last week.

The McIvers' marriage was the second for both of them and they kept their finances separate.

Diane McIver was a shrewd businesswoman with a sharp tongue who often lent money to those close to her but kept detailed records on the status of the loans, Rucker said.

Tex McIver had lost his equity partnership in his law firm and his income had dramatically decreased, Rucker said. A \$350,000 loan his wife had given him was secured by the horse farm. She had made it clear she wanted to leave the farm to their godson, something she could do if she foreclosed on the loan and took control of the farm, prosecutors said.

Stephens said he isn't worried about the shortfall and anticipates meeting the budgeted amount.

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## Trump, Abe don't agree on tariff exemption for Japan

PALM BEACH, Fla. — President Donald Trump and Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe said Wednesday they did not reach a deal that would exempt Japan from new U.S. steel and aluminum tariffs, as Abe had wanted.

Instead, the leaders announced they had agreed to start talks on a new “free, fair and reciprocal” trade agreement between the two countries following two days of talks.

“If we can come to an arrangement on a new deal, that would certainly be something we would discuss,” Trump said when asked about the tariffs during a joint press conference at his private Mar-a-Lago club.

But he said the current trade deficit between the two countries was too high to merit an exemption now. According to the U.S. Department of Commerce, the trade deficit was \$56.1 billion last year.

It was a disappointment for Japan. Most other key U.S. allies — among them Australia, Canada, the European Union and Mexico — have already been granted exemptions to Trump’s protectionist measures. And Japan has previously voiced reluctance to negotiating a bilateral trade deal with the U.S., saying it would prefer the U.S. rejoin the Trans-Pacific Partnership.

But Abe, whose visit comes as Trump prepares for a historic summit with North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, appeared to win assurances from Trump that he and the president were on the same page when it comes to the Kim meeting.

Perhaps the most significant for Abe: Trump’s promise to raise with Kim the issue of Japanese citizens who have been abducted by the North.

Trump said it was clear from their discussions that the abductees were “one of the truly most important things on Shinzo’s mind.” Trump said he wanted to see the “families reunited as soon as possible.”

Pyongyang has acknowledged abducting 13 Japanese, while Tokyo maintains North Korea abducted 17. Five have been returned to Japan. North Korea says eight others have died and denies the remaining four entered its territory. Japan has demanded further investigation, and Abe has made the issue one of his top priorities.

The U.S. has also been pushing for the release of three Americans held captive.

CIA Director Mike Pompeo raised their plight during his meeting earlier this month with Kim, according to a senior White House official who was not authorized to disclose the sensitive discussions and spoke to The Associated Press on condition of anonymity.

Trump expressed optimism Wednesday, saying that officials had been working “very diligently” to secure the Americans’ return and that there was a “good chance” it would happen.

But on trade, Trump made clear he would prefer a bilateral trade deal with Japan instead of rejoining the 11-nation TPP Pacific Rim trade pact.

“I don’t want to go back into TPP, but if they offered us a deal that I can’t refuse on

behalf of the United States, I would do it,” Trump said. Still, he added, “I like bilateral better. I think it’s better for our country, I think it’s better for our workers, and I much would prefer a bilateral deal, a deal directly with Japan.”

Trump and Abe also appeared to agree to disagree on the issue of steel and aluminum imports. Abe argued during the press conference that Japanese imports “would not exert any negative influence” on the security of the United States and said the high quality of Japan’s steel and aluminum products would be difficult to replace.

The visit included a mix of business and pleasure. Trump and Abe spent Wednesday morning golfing at one of the presi-

dent’s nearby golf courses. On Tuesday evening, the president and first lady hosted Abe and his wife at an intimate al fresco dinner on Mar-a-Lago’s patio. And the group reconvened for a second, larger dinner Wednesday evening.

Despite their disagreements, officials from both countries insist the personal relationship that Trump and Abe share has never been stronger. The leaders have bonded over “golf diplomacy” in both the U.S. and Japan, and U.S. officials note that Trump has met with Abe more than any other foreign leader.

During the trip, Abe praised Trump for his courage in agreeing to meet with Kim and said that Kim’s willingness to meet was a sign that the pressure campaign

against the North was working.

But he also urged caution, saying there should be “no reward” given to the North just because the reclusive country is responding to dialogue. He said that “maximum pressure should be maintained.”

On Tuesday night, media outlets reported that Pompeo recently traveled in secret to North Korea to meet with Kim ahead of a U.S.-North Korea summit planned in the next two months. Trump confirmed the meeting in a tweet Wednesday, saying “a good relationship was formed” heading into his anticipated summit with Kim.

“Denuclearization will be a great thing for World, but also for North Korea!” Trump wrote.

## Trump calls sketch released by Daniels ‘a total con job’

President Donald Trump said Wednesday that a porn actress is pulling “a total con job” by promoting an artist’s sketch of a man she says threatened her to keep silent about an alleged sexual encounter with Trump years ago.

The sketch depicts a white male in his 30s or 40s and carries a description of him as “lean but fit.” Stormy Daniels, whose legal name is Stephanie Clifford, told ABC’s “The View” on Tuesday

that it’s the man who menaced her and her young daughter and warned her in 2011 to stay quiet about a 2006 tryst with Trump.

In an early morning tweet from his Palm Beach estate, Trump said: “A sketch years later about a nonexistent man. A total con job, playing the Fake News Media for Fools (but they know it!)” It appeared to be the first time Trump tweeted directly about the porn actress.

Daniels’ lawyer, Michael Ave-

natti shot back on Twitter, noting a recent FBI raid on Trump’s personal attorney’s office, saying it uncovered “EXISTING documents and recordings showing con job after con job pulled on REAL people and very REAL American citizens (who didn’t know it).”

He added that Trump was a “completely uninged, undisclosed opponent who is prone to shooting himself in the foot.”

Avenatti has increased a

\$100,000 reward to \$131,000 for information leading to the man’s identification. The figure could be a reference to the \$130,000 that Daniels says she received from Trump’s lawyer Michael Cohen just before the 2016 election in exchange for her silence. Daniels is seeking to invalidate the nondisclosure agreement.

The case took on new significance last week when FBI agents raided Cohen’s office, looking for information on topics including

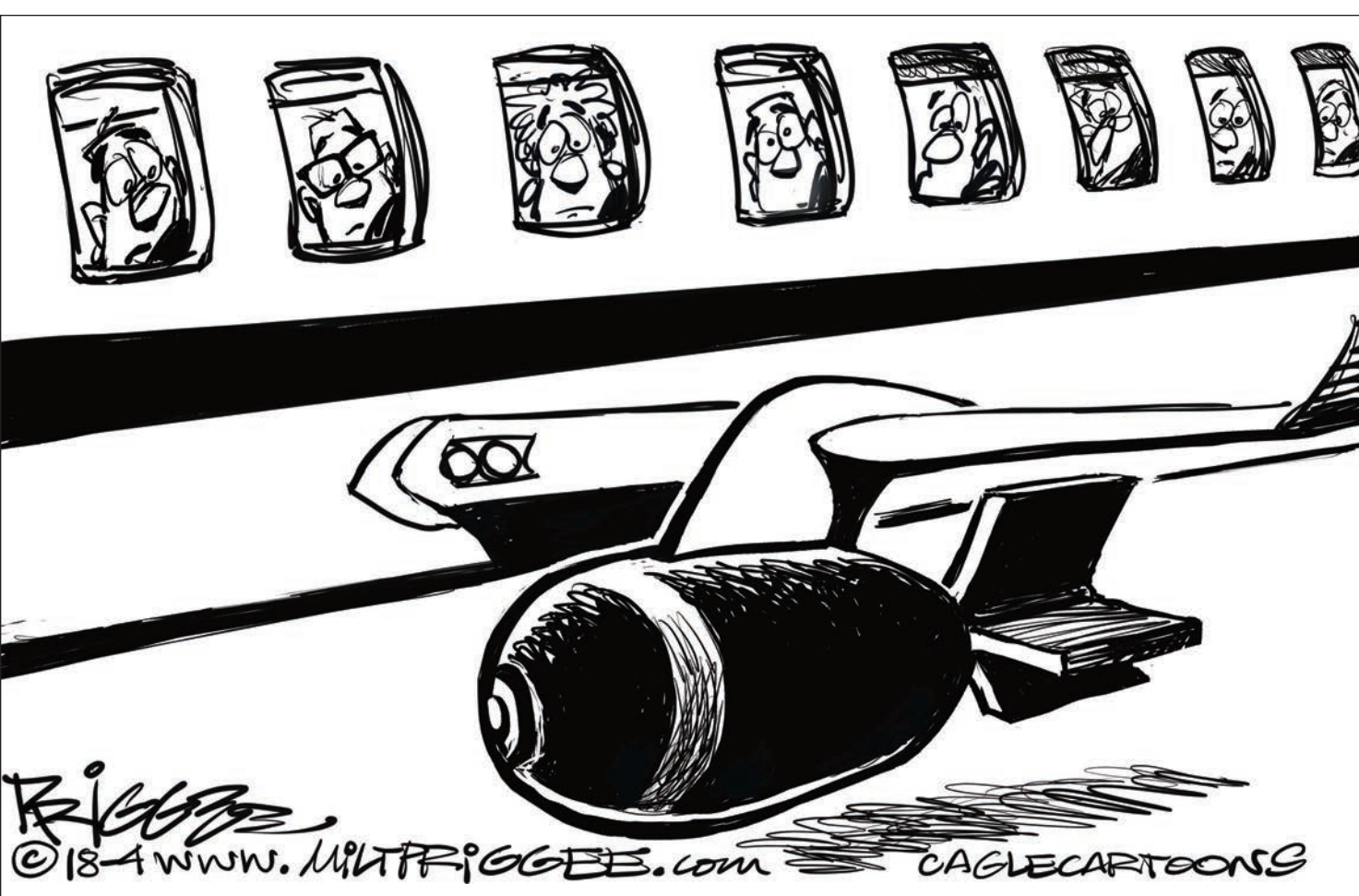
the payment to Daniels.

Cohen asked a federal judge in Los Angeles to delay Daniels’ case for at least 90 days after the raid and argued his rights would be violated if he was forced to give a sworn deposition. Avenatti has objected and pressed for the case to move forward. U.S. District Judge James Otero scheduled a hearing for Friday morning.

Trump answered questions about Daniels for the first time recently, saying he had no knowl-

edge of the payment made by Cohen and didn’t know where Cohen had gotten the money. The White House has consistently said Trump denies the affair.

After Daniels first alleged on CBS’ “60 Minutes” several weeks ago that she had been threatened, a lawyer for Cohen demanded that she publicly apologize to Cohen for suggesting he was involved. Daniels responded by filing a revised federal lawsuit accusing Cohen of defamation.



## Atlanta airport: Jet reports engine smoke, returns safely

A Delta jet that departed Atlanta for London on Wednesday reported smoke coming from one of its engines and returned safely to the airport where firefighters doused the engine with powerful sprays, authorities said.

A Delta Air Lines spokeswoman, Liz Savadelis, said via email that there were 274 passengers and 14 crew members aboard the flight, which experienced an issue with its Number 2 engine before returning to Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport and being met by emergency crews.

Airport spokesman Andrew Gobeil told The Associated Press no one was hurt. Tweeted photographs on social media showed airport firefighting trucks blasting the jet’s right wing with billowing white sprays.

An airport tweet said “shortly after 6pm, smoke was reported coming from the engine of a departing aircraft. The aircraft immediately returned.” In a subsequent tweet, the airport said: “Units hosed down the aircraft’s smoking engine. The aircraft is being towed” with passengers back to the concourse.

Delta’s statement said passengers and crew disembarked safely.

“The airplane was towed to the gate, where customers deplaned through the jetway and will be accommodated on a different aircraft,” the statement said. It said the safety of passengers and crewmembers is Delta’s top priority and “we apologize to our customers on this flight.”

The Delta statement made no specific mention of engine smoke. Savadelis declined to comment on specifics of what happened when asked about that.

Opening lead — seven of hearts.  
The Rule of Eleven is a marvelous device, but, like any other rule, it must be applied with discretion.  
Let's say you're East in today's deal and partner leads the seven of hearts, which you have every reason to believe is his fourth-best card. Dummy follows low, and you have to decide whether to play the jack or the ace.  
By applying the Rule of Eleven, you know that South has one card higher than the seven. (You deduct seven, the card led, from 11. This tells you that there are four hearts

higher than the seven in the North, East and South hands. Since you see one of them in dummy and two in your hand, South has exactly one.)  
South's heart higher than the seven cannot be the queen. If declarer had that card, partner would have the 10-9-8-7 and would have led the ten, not the seven. Declarer therefore has the ten, nine or eight — and your partner has the queen.  
However, this does not mean that you should play the jack merely because you know it will win the trick. This would be a shortsighted view to take.  
Instead, you weigh the advantage of winning with the jack against the advantage of winning with the ace and returning the jack in order to establish partner's suit.  
On balance, the odds favor playing the ace followed by the jack. In the actual case, this defense succeeds when West overtakes the jack with the queen and forces out the king. Eventually, South, who cannot make nine tricks without first conceding a trick to partner's ace of diamonds, goes down one.

Note that if you play the jack at trick one — paying blind obedience to the Rule of Eleven — declarer easily makes the contract after foreing out the diamond ace. You win the battle, but you lose the war.

## In-flight explosion creates pressure for inspections

**PHILADELPHIA** — The engine explosion aboard a Southwest Airlines jetliner puts new pressure on airlines and regulators to act faster to inspect fan blades like the one that snapped off and triggered an accident that killed a passenger.

The initial findings from investigators show that Tuesday's emergency was eerily similar to an engine failure on another Southwest plane in 2016. That breakdown led the engine manufacturer to recommend new inspections of fan blades on many Boeing 737s.

Investigators say a fan blade snapped off as Southwest Flight 1380 cruised at 500 mph high above Pennsylvania. The failure set off a catastrophic chain of events that killed a woman and broke a string of eight straight years without a fatal accident involving a U.S. airliner.

"Engine failures like this should not occur," Robert Sumwalt, chairman of the National Transportation Safety Board, said Wednesday.

Sumwalt expressed concern about such a destructive engine failure but said he would not yet draw broad conclusions about the safety of CFM56 engines or the entire fleet of Boeing 737s, the most popular airliner ever built.

Metal fatigue — microscopic cracks that can splinter open under the kind of stress placed on jetliners and their engines — was blamed for an engine failure on a Southwest plane in Florida in 2016. Both that plane and the jet that made a harrowing emergency landing Tuesday in Philadelphia were powered by CFM56 engines.

Manufacturer CFM International, a joint venture of General Electric Co. and France's Safran SA, recommended last June that airlines using certain CFM56 engines conduct ultrasonic inspections to look for cracks.

Last month, European regulators required airlines flying in Europe to conduct the inspections that were recommended by CFM.

In the U.S., the Federal Aviation Administration proposed a similar directive last August but has not yet required the inspections.

The FAA proposal would have given airlines six months to inspect the fan blades on engines that had flown more than 7,500 flights, and

18 months on more lightly used engines.

Federal investigators were still trying to determine how a window came out of the plane, killing the woman seated next to it who was wearing a seatbelt. No plastic material from the window was found inside the plane.

Family members have identified the woman as 43-year-old Jennifer Riordan, a banking executive and mother of two from Albuquerque,

New Mexico. Passengers say Riordan was partially blown out of the window and Philadelphia's medical examiner said Wednesday that she was killed by blunt impact trauma to her head, neck and torso.

Investigators also said the plane landed at unusually high speed because the pilots feared losing control if they flew slower. Sumwalt said the plane touched down at about 190 mph, while a jet of that size would typically land at around

155 mph.

The leading edge of the left wing was damaged by shrapnel from the engine explosion.

It is unclear whether the FAA directive that would have forced Southwest to quickly inspect the engine that blew up. CEO Gary Kelly said it had logged only 10,000 cycles since being overhauled.

Critics accuse the FAA of inaction in the face of a threat to safety.

Robert Clifford, a lawyer who is suing American Airlines over another engine explosion that caused a fire that destroyed the plane, said the FAA should have required the inspections — even if it meant grounding Boeing 737s.

"There is something going on with these engines," he said, "and the statistical likelihood of additional failures exists."

William Waldock, a safety expert at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, said he expects that this week's incident will push the FAA to require more detailed inspections of fan blades, but the details and pace will depend on whether investigators find fatigue in other fan blades on the broken engine.

"The first thing they probably are going to do is pull every single one of those other blades off and X-ray them to see if they've got a similar type of failure waiting to happen," he said.

The Southwest CEO protested that it is too soon to say whether Tuesday's incident is related to any other engine failures.

Kelly said Tuesday's plane had flown 40,000 cycles. A cycle is one takeoff and one landing. Boeing delivered the plane to Southwest in July 2000.

Kelly said the plane was inspected on Sunday and nothing appeared out of order. A spokeswoman said it was a visual inspection and oil service of the engines. The NTSB's Sumwalt said, however, that the kind of wear seen where the missing fan blade broke off would not have been visible just by looking at the engine.

There are several types of inspections that airline planes must go through, ranging from an "A check," which is done about every eight to 10 weeks, to more-rigorous B, C and D checks.

## Largest maker of bump stocks will stop accepting orders

LOS ANGELES — The largest manufacturer of bump stocks, which allow semi-automatic weapons to fire rapidly like automatic firearms, announced Wednesday that it will stop taking orders and shut down its website next month.

The announcement comes about a month after President Donald Trump said his administration would "ban" bump stocks, which he said "turn legal weapons into illegal machines."

The devices became a focal point of the national gun control debate when they were used in October when a man carried out the deadliest mass shooting in modern U.S. history.

About a dozen bump stocks were found among the weapons used by Stephen Paddock when he unleashed a hail of bullets from his

high-rise Las Vegas hotel suite, killing 58 people and leaving more than 800 others injured.

Slide Fire Solutions, which is based in Moran, Texas, posted a message on its website saying the company will stop taking orders at midnight on May 20. The company provided no other details and did not say why it was shutting down.

There was no immediate response to a request for comment sent through Slide Fire's website and the company's founder and CEO, Jeremiah Cottle, did not immediately respond to a LinkedIn message seeking comment. The Brady Center for Gun Violence filed a lawsuit against Slide Fire after the Las Vegas mass shooting and alleged that the company "provided a product that turned a semi-automatic gun into the functional equivalent of a machine gun, thereby evading longstanding federal law."

"Bump stocks should not be available for sale to the general public, and they should never have been allowed to be sold," said Avery Gardiner, the co-president of the Brady Center. "I'm sure in the lawsuit, we'll learn more about their announcement about closing their website and what they plan to do with their assets, including their patent. This sure seems to be a positive development."

The Justice Department said last month that it had started the process to amend federal firearms regulations to clarify that federal law defines bump stocks as machine guns.

That would reverse a 2010 decision by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives that found bump stocks did not amount to machine guns and could not be regulated unless Congress amended existing firearms law or passed a new one.

different pioneer crafts, games, activities and music. It is a family-friendly way to enjoy Red Top's history. Guests can learn pioneer skills and enjoy pioneer fun."

By highlighting skills of a bygone era, Tucker hopes the techniques will be rediscovered and revitalized, not forgotten.

"The Friends of Red Top Mountain State Park volunteers wear many hats for the Spring at the Homestead event," Tucker said. "This is an opportunity for volunteers to exhibit their own individual talents by demonstrating and making items used during the pioneer era, when the Vaughan cabin was built and used as a home in the 1860s. Volunteers, most dressed in period clothing, enjoy working at several arts and crafts stations, such as needlework, soap making, natural fiber dyeing, candle dipping, butter churning and pioneer children's games.

"... I hope attendees get a better appreciation for what women of the era had to go through to live every day in those long dresses. I'm kidding, of course, but I do hope people learn more about life during the middle 1800s, and how many common items we take for granted today were made by hand. Some of these crafts are becoming lost arts and if Spring at the Homestead can spark an interest to keep a craft like tatting, for example, going strong then that would be a big benefit. 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
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# Cosby's star witness says accuser spoke of plot to frame

 The chief accuser at Bill Cosby's sexual assault retrial talked about framing a celebrity before going to police with her allegations in 2005, a key defense witness testified Wednesday as the TV star's lawyers began putting on their case.

Marguerite Jackson, an academic adviser at Temple University, said Andrea Constand told her she could fabricate sexual assault allegations and "get that money" from a civil suit, bolstering Cosby's efforts to show Constand made up the allegations against him to extort a big civil settlement.

Jackson's account was immediately challenged by prosecutors, who suggested she wasn't on the trip where she says her conversation with Constand took place.

Her appearance on the witness stand was one of the most highly anticipated moments of a retrial that has Cosby, 80, defending himself against criminal charges that he knocked Constand out with pills and then sexually assaulted her at his suburban Philadelphia home in 2004. Cosby's lawyers call Constand a "con artist" who set him up. The famed comedian paid her nearly \$3.4 million in 2006.

Jackson recounted a conversation she said she had with Constand on a road trip to the University of Rhode Island with the Temple University women's

basketball team, where Constand was working as operations director.

After watching a TV news report about a celebrity who had been sued over allegations of sexual assault, Jackson said Constand told her: "Oh wow, something similar happened to me." Constand said she never reported the assault because her assailant was a "high-profile person" and she knew she couldn't prove it, Jackson testified.

Jackson, who said she roomed with Constand on the trip, told jurors she encouraged Constand to come forward. She testified Constand then switched gears, saying: "No it didn't, but I could say it did. I could say it happened, get that money. I could quit my job. I could go back to school. I could open up a business."

Jackson said the conversation happened Feb. 1, 2004, a few weeks after Constand says Cosby molested her. Constand denied rooming with Jackson and testified Monday she didn't "recall ever having a conversation with" her.

During Jackson's cross-examination, a prosecutor produced Temple records showing Jackson's travel to other away games but not to the one at the University of Rhode Island. The defense did not produce any records to support Jackson's claim she was on the trip.

Jackson testified she was aware of

the 2005 criminal probe, Constand's subsequent lawsuit and her big financial settlement with Cosby, but never told anyone in Cosby's camp — even though Cosby was represented at the time by Patrick O'Connor, the chairman of the board at Temple, where Jackson got her degree and has worked for 31 years.

She said a comedian she met on a cruise put her in touch with Cosby's lawyers in November 2016. They got to talking about Cosby after the comedian offered to buy her a drink and promised, "I won't put anything in it," she recalled.

"They came in. Took my statement. The whole nine," Jackson said. "They called me to testify, then they didn't allow my testimony." Judge Steven O'Neill blocked Jackson from taking the stand at Cosby's first trial last year, ruling her testimony would be hearsay after Constand told the jury she didn't know her. That trial ended without a verdict after jurors deadlocked.

The judge changed his mind about Jackson for the retrial, giving the defense case a huge boost. Outside court, Cosby spokeswoman Ebonee Benson said investigators intentionally ignored Jackson's allegations because they've "always known how damaging this testimony would be."

The defense case was scheduled to resume Thursday.

Prosecutors wound down their case earlier Wednesday, introducing the comedian's explosive testimony about giving quaaludes to women before sex — an old admission that's taken on new significance after a half-dozen women testified earlier in the retrial that he drugged and violated them, too.

A police detective read a transcript of the 2005 testimony as prosecutors saved for the very end of their case. Cosby's own words about using the 1970s party drug "the same as a person would say, 'Have a drink.'"

Cosby was deposed in 2005 and 2006 after Constand filed suit against him. The deposition was hidden from public view until 2015, when The Associated Press petitioned to have it unsealed, leading prosecutors to reopen the criminal case and file charges. Jurors at Cosby's first trial also heard excerpts from the deposition.

In a transcript read to the jury Wednesday, the "Cosby Show" star said he obtained seven prescriptions for quaaludes from his doctor in Los Angeles in the 1970s, ostensibly for a sore back, but added he didn't use them himself because they made him tired. "Quaaludes happen to be the drug that kids, young people were using to party with, and there were times when I wanted to have them just in case," Cosby testified, according to the transcript.

## Flaherty's HR powers Braves

ATLANTA — Ryan Flaherty homered and drove in four runs, Brandon McCarthy outpitched Vince Velasquez and the Atlanta Braves beat the Philadelphia Phillies 7-3 on Wednesday night.

McCarthy (3-0) allowed one run on five hits and two walks in 5 1/3 innings.

Flaherty's three-run homer off Velasquez (1-2) in the fifth gave Atlanta a 3-1 lead. The Phillies got within one in the seventh before Dansby Swanson's homer off Edubray Ramos in the bottom of the inning put Atlanta ahead 4-2. Flaherty added a run-scoring single in the Braves' three-run eighth.

Velasquez allowed three runs in six innings.

Phillies left-hander Hoby Milner hit Freddie Freeman's left wrist with a pitch in the eighth. It was near the spot where Freeman had a fracture last season. Freeman winced, stood at the plate for a few seconds and then walked straight to the dugout to take himself out of the game.

Charlie Culberson, running for Freeman, scored on Kurt Suzuki's single. There was no immediate report on Freeman's status.

Flaherty's first homer of the season came hours after the Braves signed Jose Bautista to a minor league contract. Bautista will report to extended spring training and will play third base — Flaherty's position.

The Braves also activated Johan Camargo from the disabled list before the game. Camargo was expected to be the team's starting third baseman before suffering a right

oblique strain.

With Camargo healthy and Bautista now looming, Flaherty's grip on the starting job was in jeopardy — even though he began the day leading the NL with his .354 batting average. He strengthened his job security by hitting a 93-mph fastball from Velasquez into the seats in right-center.

The homer, the first allowed by Velasquez this season, drove in Preston Tucker, who walked, and Swanson, who singled.

The Braves, who won two of three in the series, have won their first four home series for the first time since 2000, when they won five straight to open the season.

## Woodland still has outside shot at playoffs

Wednesday's Region 7-AAAAA baseball matchup between Woodland and Hiram pitted a team battling for a postseason berth against one rooted to the bottom of the standings.

And that's exactly how the game played out. However, the roles were reversed with the fifth-placed Wildcats getting routed by the last-placed Hornets in a 12-2, five-inning defeat at home on Senior Day.

After the game, Woodland head coach Colby Coursey seemed to be at a loss for words. He did know one thing for certain, though.

"We definitely underestimated our opponent," he said.

It's hard to argue with that assessment. Hiram (6-19, 3-12) hit three consecutive singles to open the game, and the tone had already been set.

Koby Stansel escaped the inning with only one run having crossed the plate. Although, the Wildcats (15-14, 8-7) would have gotten out of the frame unscathed if they would have completed a double play.

The Hornets tacked on two runs apiece in the second, third and fourth innings.

They then put together a five-run fifth, highlighted by Dalton Skinner's three-run homer off the left-field foul pole, to end the one-sided contest early.

In total, Hiram, which had averaged just 3.5 runs per game in region play, pounded out 18 hits. Six of those knocks were doubles, including three in the third inning.

After allowing just the one run in the top of the first, Woodland looked set to match or possibly take the lead in the bottom half.

Garrett Cornett walked and Toby Queen singled to put two on with nobody out. But a pair of strikeouts and a caught stealing kept the Wildcats off the board.

Woodland finally got to Skinner, who pitched a complete game for Hiram, in the third to pull within 5-2.

Again it was Cornett and Queen setting the table — this time with back-to-back singles. Stansel came through with a double to plate Cornett, and Queen later scored on a wild pitch.

A popout and another runner caught stealing allowed Skinner to avoid further damage, and Woodland managed just one hit — a fifth-inning single by Dylan Webb — the rest of the evening.

It was a stunning way for the Wildcats' final

home game to transpire.

Last Wednesday, Woodland sat in second place after finishing off a sweep of then-second placed Kell. Now, after three straight losses, the Wildcats will need a win Friday in Game 2 against Hiram, plus a lot of help, to make the playoffs at all.

The look on Coursey's face after the game said it all: He has no idea how the season derailed so quickly.

All the second-year head coach can do at this point is that things fall the Wildcats' way come Friday.

Only Carrollton and Villa Rica have locked up playoff spots in the ridiculously balanced region, while Kell and Rome sit at 9-6 in the region with Woodland and East Paulding just one game back.

It's believed that the only scenario where the Wildcats would reach the playoffs is if the following three things happened Friday: Woodland beats Hiram, Kell defeats East Paulding and Carrollton downs Rome. That scenario should put the Wildcats in at the No. 4 seed due to holding a tiebreaker over the Wolves.

"It would take a miracle," Coursey said, "but, at this point, we definitely aren't playing like a playoff team."

## Wife of San Antonio Spurs' Popovich dies

The Popovichs have two children and two grandchildren. They met at the Air Force Academy in 1970s when he was an assistant coach for the Falcons. Erin's father, Jim Conboy, was Air Force's head athletic trainer.

Gregg Popovich has coach San Antonio since 1996, leading the Spurs to five NBA titles. San Antonio will face Golden State on Thursday night in Game 3 of their first-round playoff series.

Popovich ran the Spurs' practice Wednesday. They Warriors lead the series 2-0.

# VAR decisions at World Cup to be explained on giant screens

FLORENCE, Italy — Fans attending World Cup matches in Russia won't be left wondering about the reasons behind decisions of the video assistant referee.

After the VAR's decision is made, replays will be shown on giant screens inside the stadiums accompanied by a written explanation.

It's all part of the VAR information system that FIFA unveiled Wednesday.

FIFA will place someone in the VOR (video operations room) who will listen in to the VAR's decisions and communicate them to both TV commentators and stadium personnel operating the giant screens.

"So we will have graphics on the giant screens, we will have replays after the decision on the giant screens, and we will also inform the fans about the outcome of a VAR incident and review," said Sebastian Runge, group leader of football innovation at FIFA.

With the VAR making its tournament debut during the June 14-July 15 World Cup, FIFA is holding its final training camp this month for the 99 match officials — 36 referees and 63 assistants — who have been selected to go to Russia.

Thirteen VARs have been pre-selected and are being trained at Italy's Coverciano complex, and FIFA referees chief Pierluigi Collina said more VARs and VAR assistants will be chosen from the 99 match officials.

Three of the 13 VARs come from Italy's Serie A and two from Germany's Bundesliga — elite competitions that already use video assistants.

The VAR can support the referee in four game-changing situations: goals and

offenses leading up to a goal, penalty decisions and offenses leading up to a penalty, direct red card incidents and cases of mistaken identity.

Still, VARs in both Italy and Germany have received vehement criticism for long delays and bungled decisions this season.

On Monday, Mainz was awarded a penalty during halftime against a rival Freiburg side that had already left the pitch for the break — prompting the unusual scene of a team returning from the changing room to defend a penalty.

"Yesterday we had already discussed this incident here and gave match officials and VARs clear indication about what should be done if something similar in FIFA competition — specifically the

World Cup — happens," Collina said without providing further detail.

Collina added that the VAR should not be overused, adding that ideally it would intervene at all in a match.

"The goal of VAR is to avoid major mistakes," Collina said. "The objective is not to have clear and obvious mistakes committed on the field of play. This is the target, the goal is not to re-referee the match using technology."

"There will continue to be incidents when a final answer will not be given and there will be different opinions," Collina added.

Among other items involving the VAR: MOSCOW CONTROL CENTER

FIFA will follow the Bundesliga model of a central control center for the VAR rather than using trucks outside stadiums.

"We will have all of the referees based in Moscow so there won't be any stress in terms of travel," Collina said.

For each match, Collina will select one VAR and three assistant VARs.

Training operation rooms presented to media included six monitors for the VARs and two more for technical assistants enabling the VARs to see requested replays.

There could be up to four technical assistants in the room for World Cup matches.

### OFFSIDE CAMERAS

FIFA will install two extra cameras at matches to monitor offside decisions.

The cameras will be in addition to the 33 cameras used for broadcasters and they will be installed under stadium roofs.

Broadcasters will not have direct access to the cameras but if they are used by the VAR then broadcasters can show the video.

Runge added that three dimensional technology — considered the ultimate strategy for determining offside — is not ready for real-time access yet.

### SWEAT AND STRESS

VARs will not officiate more than one match per day.

"It's not like watching a match on the sofa sipping coffee," Collina said.

Collina, who officiated Brazil's 2-0 win over Germany in the 2002 World Cup final, explained why the VARs will wear track suits similar to referees' on-pitch attire.

"The reason is at the end they sweat as much as someone on the field, because the tension is very high," Collina said.

"They can't do two matches per day — it's too stressful."

### COMMS AND HACKING

The Moscow control center will be connected to match officials via a fiber optic network.

If the network fails, the backup plan includes an old-fashioned land telephone line and a telephone stationed near the fourth referee for emergency use.

"Worst-case scenario includes a backup plan on site. That's when the IBC is down — no power, no fiber network," Runge said. "Then we have a plan in place where the fourth official would become the VAR and the fourth official would be replaced by the reserve referee."

"We have a cabin in the broadcast compound from where we send all of the feeds to the IBC anyway. That cabin can be turned into a smaller, light version of the VOR."

Hacking has also been considered.

"We are aware that there might be something but our IT department put measurements in place that will protect us from that," Runge said.

### POST-MATCH BRIEFINGS

In extraordinary circumstances, FIFA will hold post-match briefings to explain decisions in greater detail.

"If something should happen that we think should properly and accurately be explained — and it doesn't matter if it's related to VAR or something different — if it is a matter to explain the background of a decision, as an exception certainly we will do it," Collina said.

"But it won't be a post-match press conference for every match, explaining every single decision taken during every single match."

## Ohtani to make next start despite blister, could DH tonight

ANAHEIM, Calif. — Shohei Ohtani is expected to make his next start for the Los Angeles Angels after the Japanese two-way sensation was limited to two innings in his third career start Tuesday because of a blister on the middle finger of his right hand.

Ohtani gave up three earned runs and four hits in a 10-1 loss to Boston, suffering his first loss after winning his first two major league starts.

"We'll monitor all the way

through this week and just see where he is," Angels manager Mike Scioscia said Wednesday. "It's something he has had before and he's managed and he's not very concerned with it, but we will definitely, obviously, pay a lot of attention to it this week."

Scioscia said the blister would not keep Ohtani from being available to hit against the Red Sox today, but his possible inclusion as the designated hitter would depend entirely on lineup considerations. Ohtani is batting .367 with three home runs and 11 RBIs in eight games.

## Garcia feeling at home heading into Texas Open

SAN ANTONIO — Sergio Garcia has a long history with Texas even before he became a part-time resident.

He made his PGA Tour debut as a pro in 1999 at the Byron Nelson Classic and caused an immediate sensation with the gallery outside Dallas when he made eight birdies in 15 holes and had a chance for a 59 when he had a 4-iron into the par-5 16th hole. He finished par-par-bogey for a 62 and tied for third that week.

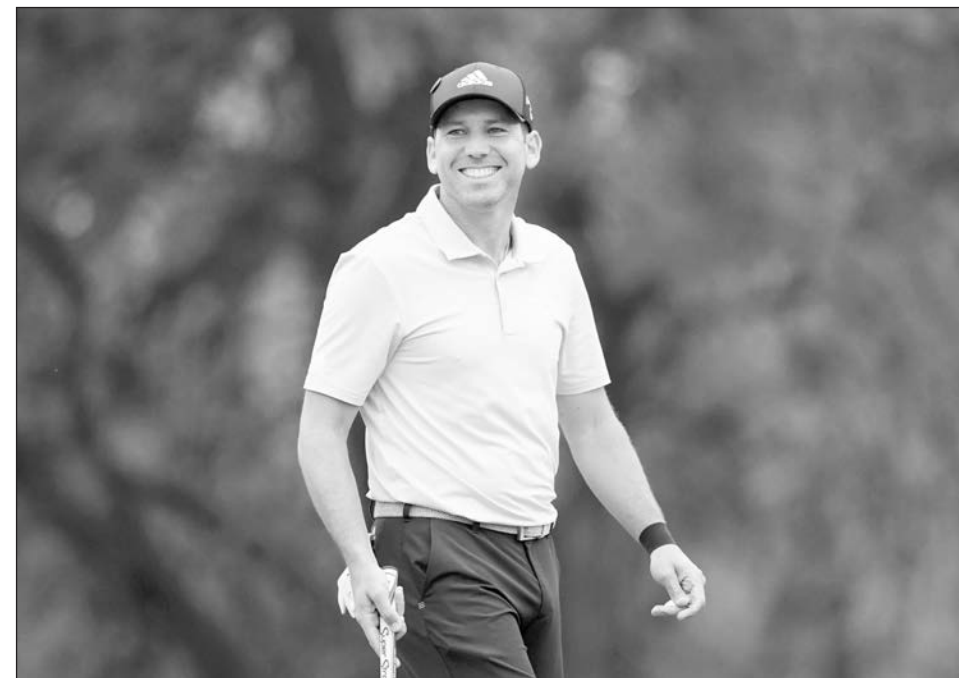
Two years later, the Spaniard won his first PGA Tour event at Colonial, the first of three victories in the Lone Star State.

Now, the connection extends to family. He married Angela Akins last summer, and he's based out of the Austin area when he's playing in America. That's where he was last week after missing the cut at the Masters, for a family gathering of both parents and plenty of doting on Azalea, their 5-week-old daughter. "Changed a lot of nappies," Garcia said. "We went to the ranch a couple of times. We practiced a little bit with my dad. I played a member-member at Austin Golf Club with Ben Crenshaw — we managed to win it, too. So just kind of kept myself busy."

Garcia also has a connection to the Valero Texas Open.

He was the consultant to Greg Norman in designing the AT&T Oaks Course at the TPC San Antonio, which will be used for the ninth straight year at the Texas Open. Garcia played that first year and broke par only once while tying for 45th.

Now he's back to compete against a field that includes Adam Scott, Ernie Els and defending champion Kevin Chappell. Also in

the field is Joaquin Niemann of Chile, the No. 1 amateur in the world who makes his pro debut this week at 19 — the same as Garcia when the Spaniard turned pro.

"It doesn't feel that long ago I was in that situation and I was looking up to my idols and my role models in golf and trying to learn anything I could from them," Garcia said. "So it is fun, and it's an honor, to be in the other side of a situation. He's a great kid. Obviously, he's got a lot of talent. I think he can do a lot of beautiful things out there on the golf course."

Both missed the cut at the Masters, and Garcia can point to one hole.

He was a few feet away from his 6-iron into the par-5 15th going up the ridge to about 15 feet. Instead, it rolled back down into the water. His next four shots, all with a wedge, spun past the hole, down the green and into the water. Garcia wound up with a 13 — the

highest score ever recorded at No. 15 at Augusta National — and shot 81. By then, his hopes of making the cut as the defending Masters champion were all but gone.

So are the memories. He has been around golf too long, good days and bad, to let something like that linger.

"At the end of the day, you've got to realize that sometimes it happens. Sometimes it goes the wrong way, and without doing much wrong, it can happen," he said. "But you learn from it and you move forward and try to be better."

The Texas Open falls into a quiet part of the PGA Tour schedule — two weeks after the Masters, three weeks before The Players Championship. That won't be the case the next year. With a long-term sponsorship deal, the Texas Open in 2019 moves to the week before the Masters, the last chance for a player to qualify for Augusta National by winning.

## Proposed Illinois ban on youth tackle football dead for now

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. — A proposal aimed at delaying the effects of helmet-banging head trauma by banning Illinois children younger than 12 from playing tackle football lacks the votes this spring, its sponsor said Wednesday.

Rep. Carol Sente said parents and taxpayers "need more time to absorb the evidence" of a link between repeated blows to the brain and chronic traumatic encephalopathy, a dementia-like, degenerative disease characterized by memory loss, violent urges, depression and other cognitive troubles.

Opposition to restrictions on America's most popular sport stifled it for now. Sente, a Vernon Hills Democrat, said she will not call the legislation for a House vote before the General Assembly's scheduled May 31 adjournment. But the bill stays alive until year's end, and Sente, who is not seeking re-election in November, raised the possibility that the issue might be ripe for a vote this fall.

"This is cutting-edge research that is evolving weekly," Sente said. "As the evidence reaches parents, I believe more individuals will delay when their child starts playing tackle football. If they don't have options like flag football, I believe in time parents and youth will steer away from football entirely."

Legislation similar to Sente's is in play this spring in New York, New Jersey, and California. Last month, a Maryland House committee voted down a prohibition on tackling before age 14.

Sente's plan is named for former Chicago Bears defensive back Dave Duerson, who took his own life at age 50 in 2011 but preserved his brain for research that ultimately revealed the markers of CTE, which can only be confirmed after death.

The medical journal JAMA reported last summer that CTE was found in 110 of 111 brains of former NFL players whose brains were donated for research.

CTE is often associated with concussions, but experts contend the real danger is from the thousands of hits that a football player sustains throughout a season. The results are cumulative and Sente sought to protect the youngest children with underdeveloped brains and protective nerve coating.

Some fans argue that when a kid plays football is best left up to parents. They say that a delayed introduction to the gridiron means young kids won't learn necessary skills to safely succeed later, even if they play the non-contact flag-football version.

Jon Butler, executive director of the Pop Warner youth football organization, which operates in 37 states and suits up 225,000 players aged 5 to 15, said CTE research is in its infancy and "we have a lot to learn." He cited Pop Warner limits its practice-time contact, bans head-to-head contact drills, and has begun a "rookie-tackle" league on a smaller field.

"We're going back to teaching blocking and tackling the way we did 40 years ago, using your shoulders and arms and not the head, which intuitively makes a lot of sense anyway," Butler said.

## Alvarez suspended for 6 months for doping violations

LAS VEGAS — Nevada boxing regulators gave Canelo Alvarez a reduced penalty for doping violations Wednesday, potentially allowing him to return to the ring in September against Gennady Golovkin.

Alvarez was given a six-month suspension instead of the standard one year for first-time violators. His May 5 fight with Golovkin was called off earlier because of the doping, but with the Nevada Athletic Commission suspension retroactive to February he would be available for a possible fight with Triple G on the traditional Mexican Independence Day weekend in September.

Golovkin, meanwhile, announced Wednesday he would fight Vanes Martirosyan in Carson, California, on the May 5 date he was supposed to meet Alvarez.

Caroline Bateman, a Nevada deputy attorney general, suggested a punishment of six months from the day of Alvarez's first positive test on Feb. 17. She said Alvarez also must undergo drug tests, but added no fine was recommended because past fines have been based on future purpose.

Bateman said during the commission meeting that Alvarez has been cooperative since testing positive, which was a contributing factor in handing down a punishment less than the standard disciplinary sanction of one year.

"The only input from the Triple G side, because we feel Triple G is the most damaged person in the situation scrambling to save the May 5 date, it would have been nice to see Canelo getting a fine," said Golovkin's promoter, Tom Loeffler, who attended the hearing. "But we respect the commission's ruling."

Alvarez wasn't present at the meeting. "I hope he's learned a lesson, that he is responsible with what he puts in his body," commission Chairman Anthony Marnell said. "And I hope to see him fighting in Nevada soon. If he follows the agreement as it's laid out then he would be able to come back and fight like any other fighter."

Alvarez was supposed to face Golovkin for his unified middleweight title next month at the T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas, but the fight was called off after the commission issued a complaint against Alvarez for testing positive to the banned performance-enhancing drug clenbuterol in his hometown of Guadalajara, Mexico.

The fight would have been a rematch of their bout last September, where Alvarez got a controversial draw in a fight many thought Golovkin had clearly won.

Alvarez blamed contaminated beef in Mexico for his positive test and vowed to plead his case before the commission. But with Alvarez suspended because of the positive test and so little time between the hearing and the fight promoters decided to cancel the bout.

"Although most professional sports, international anti-doping agencies and United States boxing commissions treat meat contamination differently from other positive tests, Nevada does not. Canelo and Golden Boy Promotions respect the rules of Nevada and are therefore satisfied with the settlement agreement reached today," Golden Boy Promotions said in a statement issued after the meeting.

Alvarez had been a steady attraction in Las Vegas on the Cinco De Mayo weekend, and a consistent star on pay-per-view. The red-headed fighter is one of the most recognizable athletes in Mexico and one of the country's biggest sports heroes.

"Canelo looks forward to returning to the ring in September for Mexican Independence Day weekend to represent Mexico and boxing in what will be the sport's biggest event of the year," Golden Boy's statement said. "He is ready to continue his remarkable record of fighting at the highest level."

Loeffler said Golovkin could be ready for a September date with Alvarez. But he said Golovkin must focus first on his upcoming fight. "Right now, we're focused on May 5," Loeffler said. "If Triple G doesn't win May 5, there's no talk about a Canelo rematch in the future. If Triple G is successful May 5, then the biggest fight in the sport of boxing is still Triple G and Canelo, and that's the fight we would try to make."

# Cavaliers hold off Pacers to even series

LeBron James scored 46 points and added 12 rebounds as the Cleveland Cavaliers bounced back from a poor performance in the opener by holding off the Indiana Pacers 100-97 on Wednesday night to even their Eastern Conference series at one game apiece.

Dazzling from the start, James scored the game's first 16 points and had 29 at halftime, dominating the way he has in so many previous postseasons.

But in a season in which nothing has been easy for the Cavs, Cleveland was lucky that Indiana's Victor Oladipo missed a wide-open 3-pointer that would have tied it with 27 seconds left.

Kevin Love scored 15, but Cleveland's All-Star center injured his left hand, the same one he broke earlier this season, with 3:43 left. Love's status could affect the remainder of this series — and perhaps Cleveland's season.

Kyle Korver added 12 points, all on 3s, and made several hustling plays for the Cavs.

Oladipo scored 22 — he was in early foul trouble — and Myles Turner 18 for the Pacers, who shocked the Cavs with an overpowering win in Game 1.

Indiana clawed back from an 18-point deficit and was within 95-92 when Oladipo, who scored 32 in the opener, somehow came free but missed maybe his easiest shot in two games. James grabbed the rebound and made three free throws over the final 22 seconds as the Cavs avoided falling behind 2-0 on the series.

Game 3 is Friday night in Indianapolis.

The 33-year-old James was expected to be more aggressive than in Game 1, when he was unusually passive, deferred to teammates and suffered the first playoff-opening loss of his career.

But James was his unstoppable self again, and there wasn't a whole lot the Pacers could do about him in the first half.

Cavs coach Tyronn Lue shook up his starting lineup, going with

Korver and J.R. Smith over Jeff Green and Rodney Hood. Green didn't score in the opener and Hood only started because Korver was dealing with a sore right foot.

While the changes weren't that

surprising, Oladipo leaving after 62 seconds was stunning.

Indiana's lightning-quick guard picked up an offensive foul and then got his second when he knocked over James, who was set-

ting a screen.

With Oladipo off the floor, the Pacers didn't have an offensive answer to James.

Nobody does.

The three-time champion was in attack mode from the start. After not attempting his first shot in the opener until 1:52 remained in the first quarter, he dropped a short jumper just 16 seconds into Game 2. And he was just getting started.

James made his first five attempts and scored Cleveland's first 16 points, making a pair of 3-pointers and then picking up assists on 3s by Love and Korver. James outscored the Pacers 20-18 in the first 12 minutes.

Sidney Crosby scored his fifth goal of the series and became the Pittsburgh Penguins' career postseason points leader in a 5-0 win over the Philadelphia Flyers on Wednesday night.

The Penguins lead the first-round playoff series 3-1 as its shifts to Pittsburgh for Game 5. Matt Murray stopped 26 shots for his second shutout of the series and the two-time defending Stanley Cup champion Penguins are a win away from playing in the second round for the 11th time in the last 12 seasons.

## Mets rally for 9 runs in 8th to stun Nationals

Yoenis Cespedes launched a grand slam during a nine-run outburst in the eighth inning that rallied the New York Mets past the Washington Nationals 11-5 on Wednesday night, preventing a three-game sweep.

Todd Frazier tied it at 4 with a two-run single and pinch-hitter Juan Lagares put New York ahead for the first time with a two-run double off ineffective setup man Ryan Madson (0-2).

Shut down by Tanner Roark for seven innings, the first-place Mets broke loose in the eighth and improved to 13-4 with a stirring victory against their NL East rivals.

Ryan Zimmerman homered twice, tripled and drove in four runs for the Nationals, who pulled off their own big comeback in the eighth inning of the series opener.

Two nights later, New York returned the favor.

Roark limited the Mets to two hits and left leading 4-2. Michael Conforto, Cespedes and Asdrubal Cabrera singled off Madson to load the bases with nobody out in the eighth. Jay Bruce fouled out before Frazier smacked a two-run single up the middle and advanced to second on the throw home.

After an intentional walk to Adrian Gonzalez loaded the bases again, pinch-hitter Wilmer Flores struck out. Lagares then lined a two-run double the other way, just inside the right-field line at the outer edge of the infield grass, to put the Mets up 6-4.

Sammy Solis walked Amed Rosario and Conforto to force in a run. Cespedes connected for his sixth career slam — the third by the Mets already this season — off A.J. Cole, sending fans into a frenzy.

Both of Cespedes' hits in the inning came on 0-2 pitches.

AJ Ramos (1-1) worked a perfect inning for his first win with the Mets since being acquired from Miami last July.

Howie Kendrick reached on an infield single for Washington in the first and Bryce Harper drew his 24th walk, most in the majors. Zimmerman, batting .121 at that point and struggling to make opponents pay for bypassing Harper, came through with a drive to left-center off Steven Matz for his second home run of the season.

Matz steadied himself after a 33-pitch first inning and retired his final 10 batters. He was pulled for a pinch hitter in the fourth after throwing 74 pitches.

Cabrera doubled to open the fourth and scored on Gonzalez's single. Zimmerman had a chance to start an inning-ending double play, but his throwing error from first base allowed another run to score on Jose Lobaton's RBI grounder as the Mets cut it

to 3-2. After Mets pitchers retired 16 in a row, Zimmerman's leadoff triple in the seventh got past a diving Bruce in right field, and Moises Sierra followed with a sacrifice fly to make it 4-2.

Zimmerman also hit a solo homer in the ninth.

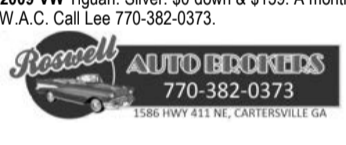

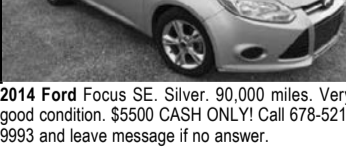

# New York Red Bulls puts its focus on accommodating fans with special needs

Red Bulls general manager Marc de Grandpre was so committed to making sure young fans with autism and their families were welcomed to the team's matches that he gave up his office.

Inspired by his 10-year-old daughter Julia, who is on the autism spectrum, de Grandpre paved the way last spring when the Red Bulls became the first Major League Soccer team to create a "sensory room" to provide a safe space for young fans who might get overwhelmed in a stadium environment.

The Red Bulls' GM got the idea from the Cleveland Cavaliers, who had just opened a similar room at Quicken Loans Arena. The only problem? Red Bull Arena was short on space.

"There was one space that would make sense for these families to be able to go and have a quiet area, some respite, and still be able to watch the match. And that was my office," he said.

The Red Bulls worked with Autism Speaks in designing the room. Today the quiet space is dimly lit with pale walls. There are fidget toys and other games as well as visual aids to help provide a distraction and calm anxiety. The windows allow parents and siblings to keep an eye on the match.

"What's been amazing to see over the span that we've had this available, the number of families who are season ticket-holders or come to our matches who have kids or loved ones on the spectrum would come to a match sort of

walking on eggshells, not sure when the moment would come that could trigger some behavior where they'd either have to leave or try to find a calm place," de Grandpre said. "Now they come to the arena knowing this is a permanent room that's available to them at any time."

But the Red Bulls' interest in accommodating kids with autism and other special needs goes beyond a room. Employees are specially trained to make sure families are helped appropriately and guided in the right direction.

The Red Bulls' efforts will be on display this weekend when the team hosts the Chicago Fire. The Red Bulls have had an Autism Awareness promotion each season since 2015 with a portion of the proceeds going to Autism Speaks.

Julia's journey made such initiatives important for de Grandpre.

"I think some kids on the spectrum sometimes don't always have a big social network or group of friends," he said. "Julia perceives the team — she calls them her friends. She knows that this Saturday is special, she calls it her night with her friends."

Red Bulls coach Jesse Marsch said the cause is "something that we care a lot about and our club's relationship with the de Grandpre family and Julia de Grandpre has meant that whenever we have this night that it is special and that it is fun. And any time we have Julia around it is exciting."

The Cavaliers worked with an Alabama-based nonprofit KultureCity. According to co-founder Dr. Julian Maha, the organization has helped sports teams across the country with programs developed

to help visitors with a range of sensory issues, including people who have PTSD or those who have had strokes.

"I have a non-verbal boy who is 10 years old, which was kind of the driving factor in doing this because he's a big sports fan. We started about two years ago and now fast-forward to two years later and we're in about 100 different venues. They vary from sports, from NFL to NBA to NHL, to concert venues, to museums, to aquariums, places all across the United States," Maha said.

Other NBA teams have followed the Cavs, including the Utah Jazz and the Sacramento Kings, who both recently opened sensory rooms with the help of KultureCity. Maha said not all teams have the space for such rooms, but there are other things they can provide, including bags that have noise-canceling headphones and sensory toys.

The Seattle Seahawks, who started making similar bags available to kids in 2015, also provide a badge so that gameday staff can quickly identify kids who might need extra help. Last year, the NFL's Pro Bowl also put an emphasis on catering to fans with autism and their caregivers.

As parents of a child on the spectrum, de Grandpre said he and his wife debated whether to involve Julia in the Red Bulls' initiatives, but they wanted to be an example.

"We were open about what we deal with every day and hopefully it's helped make this event a success, helped raise awareness and helped a few families along the way," he said.

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
