Proponents file initiative petition with clerk to revoke city charter

Wednesday, a notice of filing for the initiative petition that has been circulating since October was signed by the Altus City

Clerk-Treasurer. The notice of filing i
In October, former council members Rick Steen and Jerry Don Henry and local citizen Patricia Blackman signed as proponents of the initia-

tive petition.
The initiative petition proposes the question: "Shall the City of Altus revoke the charter under which it is now operating, and adopt and be governed under the stat-

utory Aldermanic form of government form of municipal government as provided by the laws of Oklahoma?"
According to Oklahoma Statutes (Title 11, Ch. 1, Article XV, Sect. 15-103),

an initiative petition has to have signatures equaling 25 percent of the total number of votes cast at the preceding general election.

Mary Poppins takes flight this week

Late night rehearsals by a high-flying cast will culminate Dec. 6-7 when Altus High School presents Mary Poppins. The cast will present several day-time showings for local and area schools before performing at 7 p.m. each night in the Eula B. Peterson Auditorium.
Tickets for the all-school production went on sale Wednesday. Tickets for reserved seating are \$10 and may be purchased from 11:30 a.m.

to 1:30 p.m., Monday through Wednesday in the AHS choir building. General admission tickets in the balcony are \$5 and can be purchased at the door.
This year's musical, directed by Choir Director Nick Young, Jennifer Burrow and choreographer Leah Wall, is the story of the Banks family, who, while seeking a new nanny finds their answer in Mary Poppins, a mysterious woman who drops in bringing magic, adventure and a little common sense to the family.

What's unique about this performance is that previous years' plays have raised enough money for the Altus High School All School Production team to pay for a contract with "Flying by Foy," which specializes in onstage flight. Flight by Foy has installed a temporary harness and pulley track system that will allow three of the students to fly during the performance. Police have 'no tolerance' for passing unloading school buses

After receiving many complaints over the past several weeks about motorists passing or overtaking a school bus while loading or unloading children, Altus police are cautioning motorists about the violation.
"Our children's safety is a priority and some drivers are disregarding or simply ignoring the well-being of those children," Altus Police Chief Tim Murphy said. "Violations of this type will not be ignored and Altus police are taking a 'no tolerance' approach against motorists who pass or overtake a school bus while children are loading or unloading. Those drivers will be ticketed!"
Murphy said if you're the driver of a vehicle that approaches a school bus that has the red loading signals activated, STOP until those lights are no longer flashing. "Look out for those children because they may not be looking out for you."
Oklahoma Statue 47-11-705 states: "The driver of a vehicle meeting or overtaking a school bus that is stopped to take on or discharge school children, and on which the red loading signals are in operation, is to stop the vehicle before it reaches the school bus and not proceed until the loading signals are deactivated and then proceed past such school bus at a speed which is reasonable and with due caution for the safety of such school children and other occupants."
According to Murphy, violations of the statue are punishable by a fine of no less than \$100, but the municipal court fine is \$105 dollars and the violation could result in the suspension of the driver's license. Murphy says motorists should be aware of their surroundings.

A memorial service will be at a later date.



Altus police have arrested a man in connection with a recent burglary at a local pawn shop. On Friday, Nov. 23 at approximately 8:45 p.m., police responded to an alarm call at 719 East Broadway, Go Pawn. According to Altus Police Chief Tim Murphy, the suspect entered the building after breaking out a window at the back of the business. The suspect is seen, on surveillance video, taking several firearms from a display case.

On Wednesday, Nov. 28 at about 1:30 p.m., police

North Willard. As investigators were approaching the area, a man matching the description of the suspect was seen running into a home at 1227 ½ North Willard. That house was immediately surrounded. After about 2 hours of negotiating, the suspect refused to surrender to police and tear gas was later deployed into

the home. The suspect exited the house a short time later and was taken into custody without further incident.

The suspect, identified as 19-year-old Richard Flores, was transported to the Jackson County Jail on charges of second-degree burglary. OSU fans donate most to Bedlam live auction

Organizers were still counting the money raised in Wednesday’s Bedlam Tailgate fundraiser but it should come close to reaching its annual goal of \$8,000. And while the Oklahoma Sooners won a nailbiter on the football field, 48-47, on Nov. 10, the Oklahoma State University fans spent the most money at the live auction at the First United Methodist Church of Altus. The live auction tally: OSU \$1,870, OU \$730.

Noel, the church’s annual giveaway to Jackson County children. The church partners with the Jackson County Department of Human Services to make sure parents can provide gifts for children. Every participant gets an age- and gender-appropriate gift as well as a hat and gloves, socks,

a Bible and a Christmas storybook. Last year, the church provided gifts for more than 700 children. Project Noel began in 2007 to provide Christmas gifts for needy children from birth to high school seniors. Participants had until yesterday to sign up for vouchers for Project Noel which will culminate in the giveaway from 8 to 11 a.m. on Dec. 15. The church raises close to \$20,000 a year for Project Noel. Organizers divided the Bedlam dinner venue into OSU and OU sides and reportedly had a “neutral”

table reserved for those who follow other colleges and universities. Most seats were taken on the OSU side of the venue, but even a few Sooners sneaked over to the OSU side. John Plummer, 92, was sitting comfortably in the OSU section, despite wearing OU colors and a hat. He was sitting with his friend Bob Beers, 97, at an OSU table. Plummer said he didn’t go to OU but has always favored OU athletics. Beers said he didn’t attend OSU but had a son who did. Plummer is a World

War II veteran who served in the Army Air Corps. He worked for 34 years for Eastern Pipeline Company. He moved to Altus from Alva in 2014 to be near his daughter, Kim Leverett. Postman Michael Collingbourne sat on the OU side but said while he’s an OU fan, he lives in a “divided house.” That’s because his 9-year-old daughter, Chloe, wants to be a veterinarian and that program is offered through OSU. It was all in good spirit and by the time the live auction started, they

pulled more than 50 silent auction items from the tables. Among the silent auction items were school-themed items such as Crimson and Cream Christmas tree lights and even an OSU toaster. The highest bidders for the live auction included \$500 for six bottles of Napa Valley red wine, \$550 for two tickets for the Oklahoma City Thunder vs. San Antonio Spurs on Jan. 12, \$500 for a four-person turkey hunt on the Red River and \$425 for a food basket that included baked goods, apple butter and other goodies.

Initiative Petition No. 2018-0030, the notice of filing states, “appears to be sufficient to filing with the City Clerk of the City of Altus, presentation to the Mayor of the City of Altus, and consideration by the City Council of the City of Altus.” But the proposed question isn’t on the February ballot yet. There is a 10-day protest period in which “Any qualified elector of the City of Altus may file a protest...or an objection to the count made by the City Clerk of

the City of Altus.” Those filing a protest or objection must do so in the District Court of Jackson County within 10 days of publication of the notice, which is scheduled to run in this edition of *The Altus Times*. Signed copies of the initiative petition had to be submitted 90 days after the petition was filed. However, the proponents of the initiative petition only have until Dec. 13 to submit the resolution to the Jackson County Election Board to get on the Feb. 12 ballot, according to Election Board Secretary Jennifer Wilson.

cat is also neutered, by the way.

I have combatted this problem by buying expensive urine-cleaning solution and using it on whatever my cats spray — which is always near a window or door. I wash drapes, rugs, furniture, floors and whatever else I must. However, the damage the outside cat has done is costly. He has ruined my front door, the window frames and the porch. They are deteriorating in spots where the urine has saturated them. My new Pergo floors are warped from where my cats have sprayed back by windows and doors. I took up all my carpeting for this reason.

My male cats are also on a medication that is supposed to deter the territorial behavior.

However, with this cat constantly outside, I'm fighting a losing battle.

My neighbor believes that cats should be free to roam in nature. She has lost cats to coyotes and disease, but she is a free spirit and believes that her cats should be, as well. She can be very nasty. She has confronted us on a couple of issues (not about the cats), and frankly, she is quite impossible to deal with. I have never spoken to her about the cat, but I have spent thousands of dollars on this matter. My cats are being medicated at great expense every month.

I love cats; I'd never want to see her cats hurt or get sick. I don't believe there is a workable solution, but I needed to at least vent. Is there a way that I do not see? What do your other readers do in such situations? I will have to replace my entire front door


and the screen door, as well as my Pergo floors. — Put-Out Neighbor

Used safely, fuel-burners make it easy to chase away chill

Fuel-burning appliances such as fireplaces and wood stoves are popular and reliable ways to chase away winter's chill. However, operating these types of appliances, especially this time of year, does come with some risks.

"Fireplaces, wood stoves and other fuel-burning appliances can represent fire hazards, but taking a few easy precautions can cut your risk," said Gina Peek, Oklahoma State University Cooperative Extension housing and consumer specialist.

Consider that National Fire Protection Association statistics show 49 percent of all home heating home fires occur in December, January and February. As a basic safety measure, Peek recommends keeping fuel-burning appliances in good working order.

"Fuel-burning appliances should be inspected and cleaned every fall by a professional," she said.

While using the appliance throughout the cold season, carefully inspect wood stoves for cracks or bulges before each use. Check the legs, hinges and door seals, and clean out the stove, as well.

"Take a look outside. Chimneys should be free of obstructions and cracks," Peek said.

Burning the right type of fuel also will cut the risk of a fire sparking up. In wood burning stoves use only dry, seasoned hardwood. Pellet stoves use dry, seasoned wood pellets.

"As tempting as a large roaring fire might be on an especially cold evening, build small fires that burn completely and generate less smoke," Peek said.

Start by placing logs at the back of the fireplace or on a supporting grate. Do not overload the fireplace. Make sure the damper is open before lighting the fire and leave it open until the ashes have cooled. This allows gases to escape.

Avoid burning cardboard, trash or other debris in the fireplace or wood stove. Do not use flammable liquids to light or relight the fire.

When fireplaces and wood stoves are in use, children and pets, as well as decorations, curtains and other flammable materials should be kept at least 3 feet away.

Fireplace screens should cover the entire width of the fireplace and be sturdy enough to block any logs that begin to roll.

"No fire should be left unattended," Peek said. "Before you leave the house or go to bed, douse the flames and ashes with water."

After the ashes are cooled completely, put them in a metal container with a tight-fitting lid and store the container at least 10 feet away from the house or other buildings.

Finally, install smoke detectors and CO alarms on every level of your house. All fireplaces and wood stoves can generate both smoke and carbon monoxide.

"Working smoke detectors and CO alarms will significantly increase your family's chances of surviving a fire. Test them regularly and change the batteries at least once a year," Peek said. "Also, take the time to create a family escape plan and practice it regularly so everyone knows what to do and where to go in case of a fire or other emergency."

Get your car ready before winter

When the weather forecast starts with "baby, it's cold outside," Oklahomans need to get prepared for winter weather.

Preparing is more than going to the grocery store for bread, milk and eggs. Drivers across Oklahoma need to make sure their vehicle is in good condition, and it is a good idea to prepare an emergency kit for your vehicle, too, said Gina Peek, Oklahoma State University Cooperative Extension housing and consumer specialist.

"If you've lived in Oklahoma for even a short amount of time, you know the weather can change quickly. Being organized and prepared ahead of a storm is a much better

plan than waiting until there's half an inch of ice covering every outdoor surface," Peek said. "Making sure your car or truck is in tiptop shape will help ensure you're able to make it from point A to point B as easily as possible."

Consider putting together a winter emergency kit in your vehicle. Some items to include are a windshield scraper, first aid kit, flashlight, water, some nonperishable snack foods, blankets and jumper cables. You also may want to keep a small bag in the car containing an extra hat, socks and gloves or mittens.

Most of these items can fit into a small plastic container that will keep them organized and handy in the event they are needed.

If you get to your car

and it's covered with snow and ice, take action.

"Be sure to clear off your entire windshield, side windows and back windshield. Scraping a spot the size of a salad plate to see through isn't safe for you or others on the road," she said. "Having a clear view through the windshield is imperative."

When the weather is cold and your windshield is covered with frost, snow or ice is not the time to discover your windshield wiper equipment does not work. Replace the windshield wipers if necessary. They are not terribly expensive and can make a big difference when you are on the road. Check your windshield wiper fluid as well. If it needs topped off, use a wind-

shield wiper fluid that contains deicer.

Also, check the coolant fluid levels in your vehicle. Coolant is commonly called antifreeze. It will help your car operate in colder temperatures.

Consider a tune-up, if needed. A professional will check the car over for safety.

Peek said tire traction is essential at all times, but especially on slick winter roads, so make sure your tires have adequate tread.

"Typically, Oklahoma winters are somewhat mild in comparison to other parts of the country, but we all know how quickly storms can move in and make travel dangerous," Peek said. "Being prepared ahead of time can certainly make things easier in the event of a big storm."

Competition fosters product development innovation

"We were fortunate to have a great group of students participate in this year's event and present their creative and innovative ideas," Bellmer said. "The competition is becoming a popular event, attracting students from different departments on campus and even other colleges and universities around Oklahoma."

Other products entered in the competition included Bomb Bucha, SeeNut and BeaNut Bar, PhytoPhit, Knafa, Pollinator Pumpkin Puffs, Nutty Apple Protein Mix, Wine Bread, Lentil Kefir Drink, Queso on-the-Go and Gluten-Free Cricket Powder Bread.

Foul trouble sinks Lady Pioneers, 83-63

Monday night's game against the Redlands Community College Lady Cougars is one the Western Oklahoma State College Lady Pioneers probably want back, especially considering the poor shooting performance that led to an 83-63 loss to open up conference play.

Despite the Lady Pioneers' struggles from the field, there was still an opportunity for Western to overcome an 11-point deficit and make the game interesting.

Instead, Western's attempt to overcome the deficit paved the way for questionable shot selections that did more harm than good and allowed Redlands to surge ahead by 20 points in the fourth quarter to walk away with the win.

With Ariel Williams sitting out for the for the third time in the past six games due to an injury, the Lady Pioneers were left without one of their top scoring threats and it

showed. Without Williams, the Lady Pioneers struggled mightily from the field, making just 23.1 percent of their shots.

The worst of it came from Western's second-in-command, Paradise Jackson, who fell into a slump and could not shoot her way out of it. Jackson led the Lady Pioneers with 23 points but those points came at a price. In 26 shot attempts, Jackson made just eight, and 15 of those attempts came from 3-point range.

The only other Western player to score more than 10 points was Emmy Cobb who started the game for the Pioneers and scored 12 points on four makes from 3-point range — Cobb finished 4-for-7 overall. Delecia Brown added eight points but made just two of her 15 shot attempts from the field. Brown added four more points at the free-throw line.

Other scorers for the Lady Pioneers were Rhamsey Wyche who had seven, Kaya Lovell who had four, Marquetta Jackson-Rogers who

scored two and Alexis Young and Caitlin Gillespie who each added one free throw.

Western was able to limit turnovers and had just 10 in the game to Redlands' 16, but the Lady Pioneers had trouble scoring points off the Lady Cougars' turnovers. Western also had some trouble out-rebounding the Lady Cougars, pulling down 32 to Redlands' 41.

In fact, the only area of the game where Western performed much better than Redlands was from deep with the Lady Pioneers making six more shots from 3-point range than the Lady Cougars.

Another area where Western converted a higher percentage of shots was at the free-throw line, but, to be fair, the Lady Cougars' shot 20 more free throws than the Lady Pioneers. Between the two teams, there was an abundance of fouls called in the game. Combined, Western and Redlands attempted 68 free throws with the Lady Cougars converting 32 of their 44 attempts and the

Lady Pioneers converting 18 of their 24 attempts.

Western also seemed to be fouling all the wrong players. Of the seven players who shot free throws for Redlands, two of the players, Brooklyn Judkins and Reneya Hopkins, combined for 27 attempts. Judkins finished 12-of-14 at the free-throw line and Hopkins finished 10-of-13.

With the Lady Pioneers losing the game by 20 and Redlands adding 32 extra points at the free-throw line, a little more patience and a lot less fouls would go a long way for Western.

The Lady Pioneers rebounded with a, 92-32, win over Southwestern Christian's junior varsity team on Tuesday and played Enid's Northern Oklahoma College Lady Jets on Thursday but results were not known by press time. The Lady Pioneers will be back in action on Tuesday, Dec. 4 when they host Clarendon for Homecoming at 5:30 p.m.

Okafor leads Pioneers to 73-61 win over Redlands

It has been an up and down season for the Western Oklahoma State College Pioneers, but conference play for Western started off as well as it could with the Pioneers taking down Redlands Community College, 73-61.

A two-point deficit at halftime didn't slow down or discourage the Pioneers in the second half as the team came back and outscored the Redlands Cougars, 38-24, to rebound from a recent two-game losing streak. The win moved the Pioneers to 5-5 on the season and dropped Redlands to 2-8.

The Pioneers were able to secure the victory thanks to strong performances from sophomore Obiajulom Okafor and freshman Dylan O'Hearn. As has become common this season, O'Hearn was efficient while Okafor's much improved game continued to shine on the court with the Pioneers.

Okafor missed just two shots from 2-point range, finishing 6-of-8 from the field and 6-of-10 at the free-throw line for a team-high 18 points. Okafor was also the team's top rebounder, pulling down 10 for his second double-double of the season to lead Western's 43-rebound effort.

The Pioneers' struggles at the 3-point line continued with the team making just 25 percent of its shots, but Western could afford the misses with a more efficient 2-point shooting game where the Pioneers made 51 percent of their shots. When you add that to the strong defensive effort from Western, there was plenty of room for error for Western.

Redlands had trouble from both 2- and 3-point range and seemed to live and die by the three which caused more problems for the struggling team. Out of 22 attempts from deep, the Cougars made just four. What's worse is the Cougars struggled from up close as well, making just 36 percent of their shots.

Redlands depended on Damion Thornton, Anthony Love and Kenny Springs to keep them in the game. The three players shot a collective 62 percent from the field and each scored more than 12, but with the rest of the team shooting an abysmal 17 percent from the field, there wasn't much hope for the Cougars.

On the other side of the court, the only player to struggle in the game for Western was Patrick Terry who finished 2-for-8 for four points. For the remaining Pioneers who spent time on the court, everything seemed to go smoothly.

O'Hearn made four of his nine shot attempts for 13 points and Jeshon Jones finished third on the team in scoring with 12 points.

Lavorris Givins led all players coming off the bench with nine points and missed just one shot during his time on the court. Cameron Enzor, Terry, Damien Sears and Webster Simeus each chipped in four, Chamar Dumas finished with three and Bronzae Giddens ended the day with two.

At 5-5 on the season and 1-0 in conference play, the Pioneers enter a stretch of games that could help them improve to 10-5 on the season by the time Christmas break rolls around with only one team on the schedule appearing to pose much of a challenge to Western — Clarendon. The Pioneers previously lost, 104-81, to Clarendon on Nov. 20.

Western took on Enid's Northern Oklahoma College Jets on Thursday but the results were not known by press time. Today it will host On Point Hoops at 2 p.m. before closing out the weekend against Southwestern Collegiate Institute for the Deaf at 4 p.m. Sunday.
