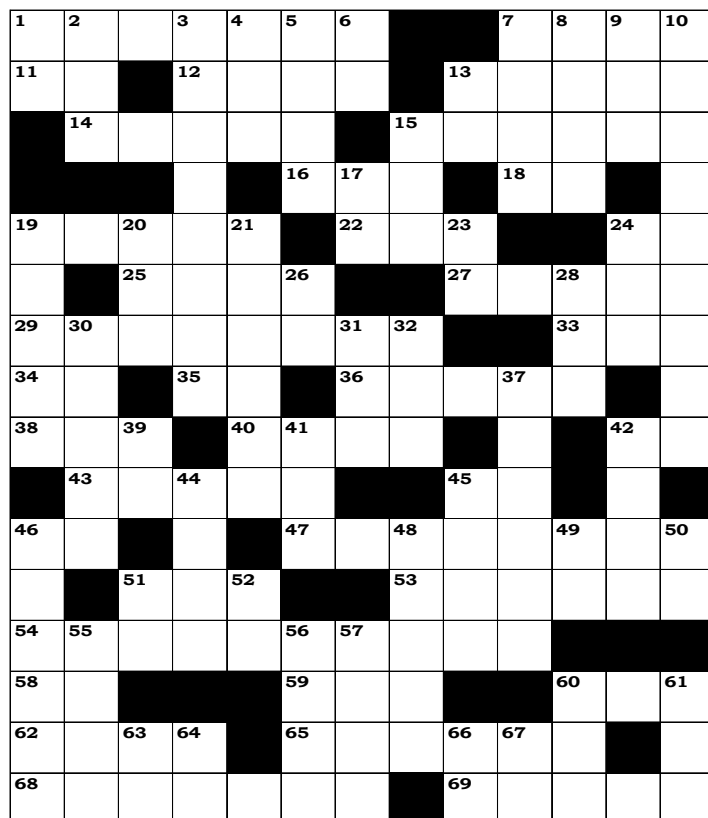


Puzzle #815
