Budget tight, but stable

LIVINGSTON — The Parish Council tonight will consider adopting a \$44 million 2016 parish budget ordinance after reviewing it last month and giving favorable reviews.

The general fund operating budget will increase from \$9.9 million in 2015 to \$10.6 million next year, while special revenue budgets rise from \$22.4 million to just over \$23 million and debt service falls from \$9.8 to \$9.4 million for a total operating budget of \$43 million, about a \$900,000 increase. The capital budget shrinks from \$2.8 million to \$1 million.

Parish Finance Director Jennifer Meyers in her introductory message to the Council noted that the parish has received \$7.68 million in federal and state grants to support infrastructure projects, hazard mitigation, tourism, fire protection and recreation.

Delahoussaye court fight continues

LIVINGSTON — A hearing on Tuesday to determine whether the state can move forward in prosecution of former parish environmental consultant Corey Delahoussaye was kicked back to Jan. 14.

Delahoussaye was accused of 59 counts of overbilling Livingston Parish on debris cleanup in the wake of Hurricane Gustav.

Attorney John McLindon, who represents Delahoussaye, said the hearing set for Nov. 30 was moved to early next year to further review the case in which the 21st Judicial District and the state Inspector General's Office alleged

Firemen get rare training op

DENHAM SPRINGS — A local training drill last week gave rookie firefighters a baptism by fire.

Firefighters from Livingston Parish Fire Districts 4 and 5 got a type of training they rarely get outside of an actual emergency.

The donation of a condemned house on Spiller's Ranch Road opened the door for rookies to

experience their first indoor fire.

"We can sit in a classroom and talk, watch Power Points and work smoke machines all day long, but until you get the heat with it, it's a totally different animal," Fire Protection District 5 Captain Chad Robertson said.

It marked the first time in 10 years that the fire department received the donation of

an abandoned house.

Fire departments cannot settle for any house offered to them, District 5 Fire Chief Joe Koczowski said.

In fact, the criteria makes such homes hard to find.

"We look for something that doesn't contain asbestos and nothing full of carpet, something that would be a good training facility," he said. "If we're

going to get a structure we can set on fire, we need something we can get legitimate training from."

As Robertson, District 4 firefighter Justin Bray, District 5 firefighter Tate McGee and others spread wood and hay in bedrooms and other areas of the house, a couple of rookies stood

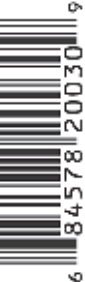

Denham steps toward savings

DENHAM SPRINGS — The Denham Springs City Council last Monday night took the unanimous final steps toward re-financing \$10,000,000 worth of sewer bonds, a move that could save the City up to \$300,000 over the final life of the debt.

After a quick move to approve taking the bonds to market for pricing, Councilman Robert Poole mentioned that the State Bond Commission will still have to approve the final bond sale. Limits set by that institution require that the City save, after costs, at least 2 percent after the re-finance. Should the amount come in lower than that threshold, the Commission will cancel the sale.

Afterward, the City had to deal with an abandoned house located at 232 Pine Street in Cockerham Acres subdivision. According to local citizens who spoke at the meeting, the house has become almost a blight on the street and the neighborhood.

“The neighborhood has expressed patience for a while, but it’s going down fast,” said

Lynn Deville, of 610 Elm Street. “There’s standing water in the back yard, and the house itself is deteriorating rapidly.”

Eye witnesses state that the bank which owns the lien on the property placed signs stating that the house is not habitable by humans and that they would maintain the grounds until such time as the property is sold. Those same witnesses claimed that the house was clearly being used by individuals for “nefarious” purposes, and the bank was not keeping the grounds clean.

According to Councilman Jeff Wesley, the home has been abandoned almost three years and the City has had to help maintain the property before. He brought the item to the Council because he believed it was time to take appropriate steps to condemn the building.

Denham Springs Mayor Gerard Landry stated that the property had, at one point, been under contract for sale. Unfortunately, clear title could not be enforced due to multiple liens on the property.

City Attorney Stephanie Hulett said that multiple calls had been made to both title holders, but they were currently in discussions on how best to solve their own situations internally. She suggested, in the mean time, the City begin the condemnation process - step one of which would be to send City Building Inspector Rick Foster out to assess the site. From there, the City could send notice to the lending institutions, and if no steps were taken to complete the sale and clean the property, the City could move forward with condemning the property and tearing down the house.

The Council approved unanimously to begin the condemnation process.

down at the end of the year after 20 years in office, noting the spectacular growth in revenues as the parish has grown, then reminded the Council that it has little discretion in spending most of those funds.

The parishwide sales tax and property taxes for road maintenance now generate \$20 million a year, Meyers said.

“I remember when we first started it was \$5 million right after the tax passed,” Harris said of the sales tax revenues.

That road fund generates about \$11.25 million annually, from which \$4.7 million go to pay off bonds for previous road construction. This past year the Council accepted a \$6.45 million road projects program based on revenue available to repave and improve roads on its priority list.

The general fund remains strapped as parish government must partially fund various governmental operations as mandated by state law that include the court system, district attorney and local marshals and justices of the peace, the Clerk of Court, Coroner, Assessor and Registrar of Voters. The new budget calculates \$2.3 million from the general fund must go to cover the parish responsibility to those agencies.

The parish also struggles to pay for the expenses of the parish jail, an estimated \$4 million annually that includes

difficult to project accurately. She projected a \$180,000 deficit in the jail fund for 2016 compared to \$500,000 this year.

“That’s a thin line depending on how sick the inmates are,” she told the Council Finance Committee last month.

Overall, the jail’s medical and dental services costs have declined since 2013 from \$470,000 annually to an estimated \$238,000 this year.

Jail operations got some good news during that Nov. 19 Council meeting when it accepted a low bid from its current provider Contract Pharmacy Services to provide prescription medications for inmates at a dispensing fee of \$1.90 per prescription. That was an 82-cent savings over a rival bid from Diamond Pharmacy Services, said jail medical administrator Cheryl Smith. She said the jail fills an average of 506 prescriptions a month, which means that the new lower price has the potential to cut those costs by \$5,000 a year.

The health unit is another special fund administered by parish government, which is now headquartered on the second floor of the health unit building. Revenues for the health unit, largely from a dedicated property tax millage, are projected at \$1.1 million, while expenses are just over \$1 million. Voters this May approved renewal of half of the existing health unit millage, a cut the Council proposed because the agency had generated a \$6.6 million surplus from its 5 mill tax. The new millage now on the books is 2.5 mills, which should support operations and allow the agency to keep its surplus, but not grow it.

“This Budget provides critical services needed by the community,” Parish President Layton Ricks concluded in the budget message. “The demand for the related costs of providing these services continues to increase. It is essential that we continue to carefully align community needs with available resources. In short, the real challenge presented to Parish Government is that we make critical decisions at the appropriate time, which will result in the best use of the limited resources available to the Parish.”

that Delahoussaye maintained false public records through time he documented for work he billed the parish.

Delahoussaye’s firm, C-Del, billed the parish \$145 per hour.

McLindon said the issue remains whether the state Inspector General’s Office had the right to investigate Delahoussaye in the first place since he is a private citizen.

“My argument is that they don’t and that they’re limited to investigate the executive branch of government or a contractor, and clearly Mr. Delahoussaye was never a contractor,” McLindon said.

McLindon said he does not believe the 21st Judicial District Attorney Scott Perrilloux or Assistant District Attorney Greg Murphy acted wrongly in the investigation.

“Our problem is with the Inspector General’s Office, which didn’t have the right to investigate him or issue search warrants, although they do have the right to issue subpoenas,” McLindon said.

McLindon said he hopes to have the matter settled outside of court before Jan. 14, but Perrilloux said Tuesday afternoon the matter would

probably still head to court.

“We still have pre-trial issues that need to be resolved, but there haven’t been any meaningful discussions to resolve it,” Perrilloux said.

“What we had Monday was a mutual decision to continue the hearing.

“We’ve already evaluated our position on the case, and we’ll be ready for the hearing when it comes up in January,” the D.A. said.

Delahoussaye worked for the parish on cleanup from Hurricane Gustav from October 2009 until Aug. 27, 2011, when the parish terminated C-Del’s contract on a 5-4 vote.

District Judge Brenda Ricks in a February 22 hearing ruled that the state has no probable cause to prosecute Delahoussaye.

Perrilloux appealed the decision, which went to the state’s 1st Circuit Court of Appeal in May, but the appellate court punted the case back to district court because it wanted more evidence.

The documentation also detailed the time for which Delahoussaye billed the parish on each of those dates. The time frames on which he billed the parish coincided with the time he allegedly engaged in leisure activities or med-

ical treatment on parish government’s watch.

The prosecution alleged that Delahoussaye billed Livingston Parish government a total of \$17,182.50 for his activities while he claimed he was doing work related to the cleanup.

The bills included \$8,700 for golf rounds, food and drink at Grey-stone Country Club, 34 hours of treatments at The Aesthetic Medicine and Anti-Aging Clinic in Baton Rouge at a tab of \$4,930, tanning sessions at Anytime Fitness which totaled \$797.50 and four hours conducting personal business at the Baton Rouge office of URS, a provider of engineering, construction and technical services.

Delahoussaye maintains that he has been targeted for persecution because he blew the whistle on improper multi-million dollar debris cleanup bills from a firm that has since filed suit against Livingston Parish after FEMA denied the claims.

A federal arbitration panel in 2014 upheld FEMA’s ruling that the bills for removal and disposal of ineligible material should not be paid.

Delahoussaye worked with FEMA as a paid consultant in defending its position.

repayment of bonds for construction of the new parish jail that opened in 2008. A portion of the 1-cent parishwide sales tax dedicated to jail construction and expenses will generate an estimated \$3.8 million of that, leaving the general fund responsible for the other \$200,000.

Meyers and previous parish financial managers have treated some of the general fund appropriations as “loans” to the jail fund that might be reimbursed later if those jail tax revenues exceed the operational needs. The current figure being carried on the books that the jail fund owes the general fund is \$7.9 million. Meyers said the parish is close to breaking even this year on jail revenues and expenses, dependent largely on the cost of medical care that is

Unique visitor at DSHS

DENHAM SPRINGS – U.S. Rep. Garret Graves addressed the federal budget, immigration, ISIS and other issues just before the Thanksgiving holidays in Denham Springs, but the discussion did not take place in a typical town hall meeting. The freshman Congressman fielded questions on those issues during a chat with the Advanced Placement U.S. Government and Politics classes at Denham Springs High School. Students did not hold back on questions for the Baton Rouge Republican lawmaker, who represents the 6th Congressional District, which includes Livingston Parish.

He was elected to the open seat in 2014 as his predecessor, Dr. Bill Cassidy, successfully ran for a U.S. Senate seat that year. Graves also fielded questions on same-sex marriage, Syrian refugees, the Keystone pipeline and the slate of Republican presidential candidates.

“We discussed A to Z – everything from healthcare and education and everything in between,” Graves said. “It gives you great hope for the future because of how well versed they are, not only on local issues, but the issues involving refugees, trade issues ... a very diverse range of topics.”

“It gives me encouragement to see how well versed they are,” Graves said.

The federal debt – and how to reduce it – dominated much of the discussion.

Students voiced concern on how the burgeoning deficit will affect their future.

“They recognize the implications of irresponsible spending today and how it compromises their future,” Graves said.

Graves stayed on campus to dine with students in the cafeteria, where he visited workers as part of the National Nutrition Association’s Congressional Lunch Challenge.

He made the visit to DSHS at the invitation of Livingston Parish School Board member Buddy Mincey Jr.

LSU football flatlines: good, but not great

Jeff David wrote this column December 6, 2009, following the completion of a 9-3 LSU season just like this past one. See how many parallels you find between then and now.

For the first time in four years, I was able to attend more than one LSU home football game, including the finale against Arkansas, a thriller won in overtime. The Tigers also slipped through with narrow victories on the road against both Mississippi State and Georgia, the latter won after a controversial call against the Bulldogs for excessive celebration in the end zone after what was assumed to be the winning touchdown.

Out of eight conference games, LSU lost three, eked out three, and covered their spread as favorites against Vanderbilt and Auburn. They also recorded rent-a-win victories over ULL and hapless Tulane. The assumed victory over my wife's alma mater Louisiana Tech proved tough to come by. LSU was the best team in Louisiana college football in 2009, but not by much.

The closeness of three of the five SEC wins and the fact that Louisiana Tech came into Tiger Stadium and took LSU down to the wire showed just how close the team came to actually having a losing season. The Tigers finished 9-3 under fifth-year coach Les Miles, but they could have easily lost any of the four close ones.

As unsettling as the season was for Tiger fans in retrospect, there are silver linings among the clouds. Most experts and non-experts (like me) predicted the Tigers would go 10-2 in 2009, defeated only by Alabama and Florida. That would be followed by a bid to the Capital One Bowl in Orlando against a Big 10 opponent, probably Iowa.

Well sure enough, the Tigers are expected to land in that Capital One Bowl bid and play the Iowa Hawkeyes in Orlando in January despite having one more loss on their record than was generally predicted.

Trouble is, that loss was to Ole Miss. We warned Coach Miles in writing in this space

before the season started that the true road to hell for LSU football coaches was Highway 6 to Oxford, Mississippi. Right on cue, Miles blew a chance to win the game at the end with poor decisions and poor clock management.

In a state where we all regularly thank God for Mississippi, a loss to Ole Miss is simply unacceptable. LSU coaches do not get fired for losing to Alabama. They do get fired for losing to Ole Miss. That's a lesson from history.

As for the future, despite the cries in some corners for Miles' head (he's another Charlie Mac, it is said), the \$3.9 million a year coach with a five-year guarantee will return for 2010.

With the huge problems the Tigers experienced on offense this year, however, it is possible that he will decide to replace Offensive Coordinator Gary Crowton. Crowton, a former head coach at BYU, carries a reputation as an offensive genius, but there were times this season when his players did not appear to be on the same wave length as their coach.

LSU is blessed with so many skill position players on offense, it's tough to give them all an opportunity to show what they can do. Still, there were actually several plays during the Arkansas game when the Tigers had only 10 men on the field for an offensive play. There's no penalty for that, but it certainly indicates a lack of organization on the O side of the ball.

The case for keeping Crowton is that despite the obvious disorganization on offense, the real problem the last two seasons has been an inexperienced Jordan Jefferson at quarterback. Jefferson will be returning in 2010 as a junior with two full seasons as the QB under Crowton. It would be wrong to change



coaches now just as Jefferson seems to be coming into his own.

LSU will lose departing seniors Charles Scott and Trindon Holliday as well as running back Keiland Williams and LSU's best receiver Brandon LaFell. But returning will be RB Stevan Ridley and prized redshirt freshman Michael Ford from Leesville, whose high school team lost in the playoffs two years ago to my alma mater Zachary despite Ford's 200-yard plus performance.

The big question for LSU's offense in 2010 is the offensive line. The Tigers will lose their two talented tackles, and the three interior linemen were clearly a source of weakness against the best defensive linemen from Alabama and Florida. Les Miles, himself an O lineman at Michigan, has supposedly

recruited some upcoming redshirts who possess the size and power to compete at the top level of SEC football. All the skill players in the world won't matter if there's no blocking up front.

On defense, LSU loses three key senior linebackers along with defensive end Rahim Alem, two defensive tackles, and Walker cornerback Chris Hawkins. That's a lot to replace, but the Tigers should have some very talented new faces. Chief among them, watch for Alem's replacement Sam Montgomery, a huge recruiting coup two years ago out of South Carolina, to quickly rise as a pro prospect.

Yes, Les Miles will return next season despite the loss to Ole Miss, and Gary Crowton will be back as well. The offense will be better, the defense will be worse, and the record won't change much.

See you there.

Coming conflicts for Edwards

What kind of governor will John Bel Edwards be? Entering office from a minority party and facing a \$1.6 billion hole in the state budget, he will have to walk a tightrope. Many believe the conservative lawmakers at the Capitol will likely keep him on a short leash, and yet the fact their governor belongs to the other party gives them an out they never had under Bobby Jindal.

Edwards can do the sort of liberal things that conservative legislators may fuss about, then swallow, things even conservative governors of years past have done, governors like Mike Foster for example, who raised revenues to keep the budget balanced. Bobby Jindal's "revenue neutral" policies, which actually did little more than raid funds, sell off state property and kick the can down the road, will give way to a more balanced approach of looking at every option.

The governor and lawmakers can get a deal done, one that neither side is crazy about, but both can accept because everyone will have to share some pain. Yet the deal should stabilize the state's fiscal posture and get us out of an era of perpetual crisis.

The biggest change will be the expansion of Medicaid, which Edwards crusaded for to no avail while Jindal was governor and determined to keep his conservative credentials as a presidential candidate squeaky clean. The expansion of Medicaid, part of the hated Obamacare program, will insure an additional 240,000 people and benefit the state's coffers with the infusion of an estimated \$16 billion in federal dollars over the next decade. Republican lawmakers may oppose this, but now they have the governor to blame, so everyone can move on.

An easier deal, likely the product of a special session to fix the budget, will reevaluate tax breaks, so-called "corporate welfare," and possibly open up wider areas of the budget to discretionary spending to take the targets off of education and health care that bear the brunt of every economic downturn. This approach enjoys widespread agreement among state leaders that crosses party lines.

Another interesting scenario opens up in the conflict over education reform that has produced some strange bedfellows. Religious conservatives and patrons of thriving suburban public school systems like ours find themselves allied with teacher unions and squared off against big business when it comes to common core, charter schools, vouchers and even the choice of a state education superintendent. The majority of the incoming Board of Elementary and Secondary Education supports incumbent John White and his reform agenda, while Edwards has sided with education leaders and teachers and wants a new point man. It will be fascinating to watch how these sides work out their differences, if they do.

Louisiana's short Beltway careers differ greatly from tradition

It appears as if U.S. Sen. Bill Cassidy will become Louisiana's senior senator in January of 2017, following what will be just two years in the nation's upper chamber. It's being made possible by U.S. Sen. David Vitter, who will not seek re-election next year after being handed a major loss for governor this fall. Vitter will step down with 12 years of Senate experience under his belt and another six from the House.

With his own six years in the House, it also looks like Cassidy, a Baton Rouge Republican, will become one of the longest serving members of Louisiana's congressional delegation when this happens. There's no doubting Cassidy can handle the load, but it's a far cry from the time when our elected D.C. surrogates spent decades building careers on Capitol Hill.

In the Senate, Russell B. Long put in 39 years, J. Bennett Johnston served 25 years, Mary Landrieu had 18 years before leaving and so did John Breaux, following an additional 15 years in the House. Also from the lower chamber, Billy Tauzin chalked up 25 years and Jim McCrery and Richard Baker spent 21 years each in Washington representing Louisiana.

While the state's congressional delegation could certainly benefit from a bit more time in office to catch up to the stature of these Beltway giants, Cassidy would reach the age of 94 before being able to match Long's tenure in the Senate. There are signs, though, that a Louisiana politician doesn't have to make it through nearly four censuses to move up the leadership ladder.

Look no further than Majority Whip Steve Scalise, R-Jefferson, for proof. With Vitter's exit, he will officially become the dean of the delegation. Scalise was sworn in just seven years ago and took over the third most powerful position in the entire chamber in 2014. He is on a career track in Congress and helps offset any serious concerns about the loss of Louisiana's clout in D.C.

Nonetheless, it's clear our congressional members are serving shorter terms than any other time in recent memory. Within the last eight years, Louisiana has turned over every House seat, has had two congressmen whose terms can be counted in months and another two congressmen who have separately served just a single term and one and a half terms.

Scalise, for example, was preceded by Gov. Bobby Jindal, who served only three years in the House. New Orleans Congressman Cedric Richmond, the delegation's lone Democrat and the youngest at age 42, assumed office in 2011 and followed Joseph Cao, who held the seat for just two years.

Congressman Ralph Abraham, R-Mangham, took office for the first time in January

and replaced Vance McAllister, who was a congressman for roughly 14 months due to a special election and a classic Louisiana dilemma. For his own part, Abraham isn't looking for a political career and has promised voters only six years on the Hill, so he'll make way for new blood no later than the 2021-2022 term.

Congressman Garret Graves, R-Baton Rouge, who is second in age to Rich-

mond at 43, was also elected last year to fill Cassidy's vacancy and took office in January. In 2008, though, Cassidy did beat Don Cazayoux, who was in office for just eight months.

Then there's Congressman Charles Boustany, R-Lafayette, who assumed office in 2005 to succeed Chris John's eight-year term. And, as a byproduct of redistricting, Boustany took out Jeff Landry in 2012 after a single Washington term. (Landry landed a decent consolation prize this fall and is now Louisiana's next attorney general.)

There could be more fresh faces in the delegation with both Boustany and Congressman John Fleming, R-Shreveport, who was sworn in back in 2009, looking to run for Vitter's open Senate seat next year. Already there's a large slate of candidates lining up for the post and the possibility of losing both Boustany and Fleming is notable. Boustany just landed the chairmanship of the Ways and Means Committee's Tax Policy Subcommittee and Fleming has become an important voice in the conservative Freedom Caucus.

For lobbyists and others who depend on longterm relationships with elected officials, it must be like changing dates on the night of the prom. For bureaucrats in state government who need consistent lines to federal contracts and pots of money, it's an excruciating waiting game. But for fans of term limits, it surely seems like a dream come true.

Back home in Louisiana, the changing of the guard continues with a new governor in the form of John Bel Edwards, while Billy Nungesser prepares to take over as lieutenant governor and Landry preps for the role of Louisiana's top attorney. In the Legislature, a new speaker of the House will soon be selected as well and a wave of new committee chairs are expected.

It's yet another rebuilding year in the Bayou State, especially on the federal level. It's too early to tell whether this trend points to the death of Louisiana's career Beltway politicians, but it's certainly a model that's on life support.

Are Trump and Putin right?

Monday, MSNBC’s “Morning Joe” hosted a spirited discussion with Donald Trump on whether he was right in asserting that Muslims in New Jersey celebrated as the towers came down on 9/11. About Muslim celebrations in Berlin, however, there appears to be no doubt. In my chapter “Eubria,” in “State of Emergency: The Third World Invasion and Conquest of America,” [2006] is this quote from *The New York Times Magazine*, exactly 10 years ago.

“Parallel to the declarations of ‘unconditional solidarity’ with Americans by the German majority, rallies of another sort were taking place in Neukolln and Kreuzberg. Bottle rockets were set off from building courtyards, a poor man’s fireworks, sporadic, sparse and joyful; two rockets here, three rockets there. Still, altogether, hundreds of rockets were shooting skyward in celebration of the attack, as most Berliners were searching for words to express their horror.”

Neukolln and Kreuzberg are neighborhoods of “gastarbeiters,” Muslim Turkish workers who came to Germany in the millions to work in menial jobs beginning around 1960.

While the flap over what Trump saw persists, a more serious question has arisen: Is Turkish strongman President Recep Erdogan trying to draw the United States in on his side in the war in Syria, and into a confrontation with Vladimir Putin’s Russia?

A little history is in order. Not until 1952 did Turkey join the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, all but two of whose original 12 members were on the Atlantic or North Sea.

Yet bringing in Turkey was a ten-strike, putting NATO on the Dardanelles and Bosphorus and on the southern coast of the Black Sea, right up to the border of Stalin’s Soviet Union.

But the world that made Turkey such a strategic asset has vanished. Armenia and Georgia are no longer Soviet republics but free nations. The Soviet Empire, Warsaw Pact, and Soviet Union no longer exist, and Balkan nations as well as the Baltic States are members of the EU and NATO.

Turkey is no longer the secular nation-state of Kemal Ataturk, but increasingly hearkens to the Islamic Awakening. In Syria’s civil war, her behavior has not been what one might expect of an ally.

The Turks left the door open for jihadists to join ISIS. They are accused by two Turkish journalists, now facing life in prison, of shipping arms to ISIS. The Turks are charged with permitting ISIS to move oil from the Islamic State into and across Turkey. Russia, which joined the U.S. in bombing the tanker trucks that move the oil, charges Erdogan’s son with being involved in the black market trade with the caliphate.

Instead of battling ISIS, Erdogan is fighting Kurds in Turkey and Iraqi Kurd-

istan and is threatening to attack Syria’s Kurds if they cross to the west bank of the Euphrates.

Ankara is also becoming dictatorial and repressive.

Erdogan has dismal relations with Egypt and Israel and appears hell-bent on bringing down Bashar Assad in Syria. Yet, Assad’s army remains the sole force standing between ISIS and Damascus.

Erdogan’s Turkey has its own separate national agenda. While understandable, what is of concern is that Erdogan could escalate his clash with Assad’s regime into a clash with Putin’s Russia, which is backing the Syrian regime — and drag us into his war.

And the longer this war goes on, the greater the likelihood of something like this happening.

For the operative premise of NATO is that an attack against one is an attack against all. What do we do should Erdogan provoke a Russian attack on his aircraft, and then invoke Article V and call on all NATO nations to come to Turkey’s defense against Putin’s Russia in Assad’s Syria?

Turkey’s shoot-down of the Russian Sukhoi Su-24 makes this more than a hypothetical question.

While the Russians have indicated they are not going to make this a *casus belli*, Putin charges that the U.S. was given advance notice of the flight plan of the Russian plane.

Were we? Did we authorize, know about, or suspect Erdogan was planning to shoot that Russian plane down? This is no small matter. And Americans have a right to know.

Then there is the geostrategic question.

The world of 2015 is nothing like Truman’s world of 1952 or Reagan’s world of 1982. The adversary we confronted then, the Soviet Empire and Soviet Union, has not existed for a quarter century.

Why then does NATO, created to defend Western Europe against that adversary, still exist?

Why are we still committed to fight Russia not only to defend Germany, but Estonia and Erdogan’s Turkey, and if the neocons get their way, to be committed in perpetuity to fight Russia for Georgia, South Ossetia, Abkhazia, Moldova, Ukraine, Crimea, Donetsk and Luhansk?

If the history of the 20th century teaches anything, it is that war guarantees all too often lead to war.

But in this war against “radical Islamic terrorism,” who is the real ally: Erdogan, who has been aiding and abetting Islamic jihadists in Syria, or Putin, who has been bombing them?

Old-timers recall their first fire training was real blaze

outside quietly as they prepared for their first blaze.

Denham Springs resident Darian Jarreau, 20, pursued a career as a firefighter after she completed a First Responder class when she finished high school.

She was calm as other firefighters helped her with her gear and regulator mask.

“Right now, I feel the adrenaline,” said Jarreau, a nursing student. “I want to do this because I like to volunteer, so this was just another new thing to try.”

“The main thing I anticipate out of this is a lot of heat,” she said.

Josh Johnson, a District 4 firefighter, has worked outdoor fires at an area chemical plant, but he realizes he will soon face a different beast.

“I’ve never worked anything like this on the inside, so I looked through the house all I can,” he said. “This is all about showing us rookies how to be safe on the inside.”

His wife Peggy admits she may be nervous down the line, but it’s not that way for her husband’s first fire.

“He’s excited and likes that he can do this training before he gets into the real deal,” she said. “I’m excited for him because these are all professionals and they’ve all done this before.”

It’s a much less stressful way to experience a first blaze than what Koczowski endured.

He fought his first blaze with Fire District 5 when he and other firefighters extinguished a fire at a two-story house in Shadow Springs Subdivision.

Koczowski and other firefighters had very limited training and had started the fire department only one month earlier.

“We were nervous as hell and we didn’t have the formal training these firefighters have now,” he recalled. “We had old gear donated to us by the Exxon Refinery and we were without any real training, so it was scary.”

Neither the rookies nor veteran firefighters should ever lose the fear that comes with working a blaze, Koczowski said.

Some parts of the firefighting process become second nature, but otherwise every fire is different, he said.

“If you ever lose that little twinge of nervousness or fear, it’s time to quit,” Koczowski said. “If you get too confident, it’s going to get you.”

“The day you think you can go through a fire and you’re certain you’ll come out alive, it’s time to find another

career,” he said.

Firefighters used hay bales and pallets to ignite the blaze.

They avoid use of diesel, oil or gasoline to start the fire.

“It’s all natural combustibles,” District 4 Fire Chief Charlie Weaver said.

The firefighters worked the blaze from 8 a.m. on a rainy Saturday until late in the evening.

The rain dealt firefighters an additional challenge.

“Rain actually fuels the fire because it carries oxygen with it, and the oxygen actually helps fuel the fire,” Koczowski said. “We’ve

been in downpours in which people thought rain would put the fire out, but the fire takes on a whole new life once it starts to rain.”

Fire Protection District 5 received the home as a donation from Kehvn and Wendy Petrig, who recently moved from Gonzales to Denham Springs.

The donation saved the couple upwards of \$10,000 in demolition costs for the three-bedroom house, which was approximately 50 years old.

The couple never lived in the house, so no emotional ties existed.

“We bought the prop-

erty to build a house here because this one was beyond repair,” Wendy Petrig said. “We figured it would be a good way to help the fire department and save us on demolition costs at the same time, and they said it fit all the right criteria.”

The house donation helped the fire departments in another way.

“It’s going to save us on tens of thousands in training, and this comes after we spent almost a million dollars to replace two 30-year-old pumpers, which we bought without going up on millage rates or borrowing a single dime,”

Koczowski said.

Aside from the training, it helped improve communications with another fire district, he said.

“This just so happened to be the perfect deal for us, and it’s good cross training with another fire district so that the guys learn to work well, get to know each other and how to interact,” Koczowski said. “They have to have enough confidence in each other to know that they will protect each other during the fire.”

“When you train together, you become accustomed to one another,” he said.

For Johnson and Jarreau, the experience showed them both the exhilaration and danger involved.

“The whole process is pretty exciting, but I see what they say about the breathing. You have to regulate the breathing because that becomes much harder in that kind of heat, but that’s something you pick up over time,” Johnson said.

Jarreau felt the same way.

“It’s tough, and I’m still getting my breath,” she said. “At the same time, it’s exhilarating. I can’t wait to do it again.”

DS Police offer drug disposal

DENHAM SPRINGS – A service now offered by the Denham Springs City Police Department enables residents to dispose of unwanted prescription drugs in a safe manner.

Residents can dispose of unused, unwanted or out-of-date prescription drugs in a drug box placed in the lobby of the police department, Police Chief Scott Jones said.

An evidence officer and a detective will be

charged with clearing out the box, but they must sign off on it before they begin the process, he said.

“We have to make a report of it every month since it is abandoned property and send a report in,” Jones said.

The National Association of Drug Diversion Investigators placed the box at the DSPD headquarters.

The Louisiana State Police approached the DSPD about obtaining a drug box after the NADDI placed a box at

the Livingston Parish Sheriff’s Office, Jones said.

The United States Drug Enforcement Administration has a drug pickup once a year, but the box at the department will be available for residents throughout the year, 24 hours a day, he said.

The box is under surveillance at all times.

“It’s all secure for us and it’s safe,” Jones said.

The box was put into place last week.

Pick and keep a fresh tree

It was a warm Thanksgiving but we did get a big frost that is showing up in warm season grasses and helping with some leaf color in the hardwoods.

One of the post-Thanksgiving rituals for many is getting the family Christmas tree. It is a great memory to load up the children and go out to a local Christmas tree farm and let everyone get involved in selecting just the right tree.

The key to getting a good Christmas tree is to make sure it is fresh. The easiest way to tell is to select one that is still growing and cut it that day or at a later day when you are ready. Buying from local choose-and-cut Christmas tree farmers can give you assurance of a fresh tree.

You can also buy a tree from a Christmas tree lot or nursery that retails Christmas trees, but you will need to pay more attention to detail in order to get a fresh tree. You know that many of the traditional Christmas tree species are not native to our area so they have to be cut and then shipped here. There has to be some lead time for the grower to cut them, ship the tree and finally get the trees to retail outlets.

One of the best indicators of freshness is the smell of the tree. Is there a strong fragrance coming from the tree? The quality that most of us are looking for in a live tree is the fragrance that permeates the home, so it should smell like a Christmas tree.

Next, look at the color. It should have a good green color not a lot of

yellow or brown. The needles can also tell you a lot about freshness. Fresh trees will have pliable needles that will bend without breaking. If you gently pull the needles, they should not pull out. You can also shake the tree lightly, you will always have a few needles fall but it should not be raining needles if the tree is still fresh.

Once you have established the tree is fresh, look at some other

common problems. Size matters and when you get on the lot the bigger trees always look better. Be sure to keep the height of the tree under your ceiling limitation. Do not forget to take into account the height of the tree stand and

any tree topper, which all have to fit in between the floor and ceiling.

Check the straightness of the tree trunk. Most people are only going to decorate three sides of the tree and one side will be up against a wall. If you have a large bend in the trunk it can throw the center of balance off and the tree can be more vulnerable to falling. A tree falling can be a traumatic and loud experience in the middle of the night. Straight trunks are best.

When you get the tree home, cut the end of the butt of the tree and immediately set it in the stand and fill it with water. If you are not ready to put it in the stand, set it in a bucket of water. This cut will open up the vascular system of the tree and allow it to uptake water and rehydrate the tree to keep it fresh.

Trees will take up a lot of water initially so check the water level morning and evening the first few days and then once daily. If you allow the tree to run out of water the butt will callus over and it will not continue to take in water and become very dry and dangerous. We just got a new tree and it took up 1.5 gallons of water in the first 12 hours.

Now just keep the tree away from heat sources such as fireplaces, vents, heaters, spot lights and candles and it should last the entire holiday season.

A Rural Life Christmas

The first weekend of December brings a few hours of escapism to a handful of Livingston Parish residents.

Several local folks volunteer their time each year to the annual 19th Century Christmas at the LSU Rural Life Museum.

The annual event runs Sunday from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the LSU Rural Life Museum on Essen Lane, just west of Interstate 10. Festivities include blacksmithing, choirs, wagon rides, traditional dancing demonstrations and other events.

The day ends with a bonfire at dusk, a performance by a youth orchestra and a visit from Papa Noel.

"It's a way for me to get away from the fast-paced life we live today," Denham Springs Fire



Chief Melvin Wheat said. "If we could do that era all over again, it would be fine for me – I love that lifestyle."

Wheat works the weekend burning and processing sugarcane for cane syrup, which is sold in jars at the event.

"It's a long process, but we made it just the way they made it there in the 19th Century," said Wheat, who first worked

the event in 1996.

He has also worked the wagon rides, but now spends his time at the sugarcane area.

Wheat considers the Rural Life Museum one of the greatest attractions in Louisiana tourism.

"It's a hands-on museum that is great for Louisiana and an event with something for the whole family," he said. "It's the only kind of museum we

have like this in Louisiana."

Wheat credits museum director David Floyd for the success of the event.

"He's always been dedicated to this museum – it's his pride and joy and he gives it his all for this museum," Wheat said.

For Walker resident Ray Sibley, the event is proof that at 90, he's not too old to have fun.

"It's fun to show every-

one the way others used to travel and how they lived in that era," he said.

"I also love to get the kids at the front of the wagon and visit with them.

"I still get around pretty good ... maybe bad knees, but I go anyway," he said. "I just hope it doesn't rain Sunday."

French Settlement resident Darrell Jones, another museum mainstay, also handles wagon

rides each year at the festival.

The sight of families enjoying themselves keeps him coming back year after year.

"It's just something I love to do," he said. "The kids are the most fun, no doubt. They have a blast – and I love every minute of it."

Admission is \$9 for visitors 10 and older. Kids 10 and under enter free.

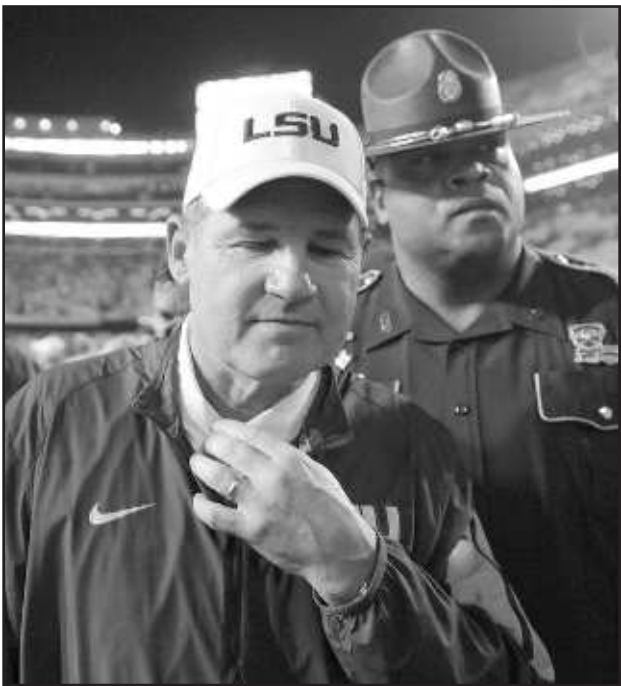

get the dignified exit he deserved, Alleva looked inept, and our wonderful Louisiana politicians got involved. All of this begs the question — who's in charge? The old adage “follow the money” doesn't ring true here. If that were the case, the boosters, who had raised \$19 million privately to buy out Les Miles, would have gotten their way, and Miles would be out the door, Jimbo Fisher would be heading in, and those of us peasants, who do not donate millions to the school

the train right into the station. 4 million dollars a year, with the highest paid assistants in the NCAA. Is the product worth the price? For those who watch on TV only, probably. After the A&M game, Miles said that changes will come to the offense, then immediately said that the “engine” (Leonard Fournette) was perfect and that things would continue. So, will the Tigers ditch Cam Cameron? Find a new offensive identity? We'll find out, but probably not until after the Citrus Bowl, as the offensive coordinators contract lasts until

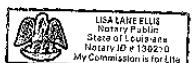

The Business Combination transaction was approved on August 26, 2015. On September 14, 2015, the Louisiana Public Service Commission ("LPSC") issued Order No. U-33244-A formally approving the business combination of Entergy Gulf States Louisiana, L.L.C. ("Old EGSL") and Entergy Louisiana, L.L.C. ("Old ELL"), through which Old EGSL and Old ELL requested to combine substantially all of their respective assets and liabilities into a single operating company, Entergy Louisiana, LLC ("New ELL"). On October 1, 2015 (the "Effective Date") the business combination was consummated. The September 1, 2015, filing was updated on November 19, 2015, to incorporate the non-fuel effects of flowing through Guaranteed Customer Credits as required by LPSC Order No. U-33244-A. The filing reflects the resulting FRP factors to be applied to each of New ELL's rate classes (except those excluded under ELL Rider Schedule FRP) effective for customer bills rendered on and after the first billing cycle of December 2015.

The proposed adjustment in rates will have the following estimated effects on applicable Legacy ELL customers' typical monthly bills: a typical monthly bill for a Residential customer using 1,000 kWh would decrease approximately \$2.31, from \$101.55 to \$99.24; a typical monthly bill for a Small General Service customer using 50 kWh and 12,500 kWh would decrease approximately \$34.69, from \$1,442.24 to \$1,407.55; a typical monthly bill for a Large General Service customer using 1,000 kWh and 500,000 kWh would decrease approximately \$771.91, from \$39,249.85 to \$38,477.94.

The proposed adjustment in rates will have the following estimated effects on applicable Legacy EGSL customers' typical monthly bills: a typical monthly bill for a Residential customer using 1,000 kWh would decrease approximately \$0.47, from \$122.02 to \$121.55; a typical monthly bill for a Small General Service customer using 500 kWh would decrease approximately \$2.66 from \$698.25 to \$695.59; a typical monthly bill for a Large General Service customer using 500 kWh and 255,500 kWh would decrease approximately \$80.00, from \$25,328.25 to \$25,248.25.

ORDINANCE NO. 15-13

An Ordinance providing for the incurring of debt and issuance of not to exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) of Revenue Refunding Bonds of the City of Denham Springs, State of Louisiana; prescribing the form, terms and conditions of said Bonds, designating the date, denomination and place of payment of said Bonds; providing for the payment thereof in principal and interest; authorizing the agreement with the Paying Agent, and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, the City of Denham Springs, State of Louisiana (the "Issuer"), has heretofore entered into (i) a Loan Agreement dated May 1, 2008 (the "2008 Loan Agreement") in conjunction with the issuance by the Louisiana Local Government Environmental Facilities and Community Development Authority (the "Authority") of its \$9,100,000 Revenue Bonds (City of Denham Springs Sewer Project), Series 2008, of which approximately \$7,985,000 is currently outstanding (the "Series 2008 Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, in order to provide debt service savings, the Issuer, acting through its governing authority, the City Council of the City of Denham Springs, State of Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), is authorized to and believes it to be in its best interest to refund all or a portion of the Series 2008 Bonds (the "Refunded Bonds"), pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 14 and 14-A of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended and La. R.S. 39:1430 and other constitutional and statutory authority (collectively, the "Act"), through the issuance of its refunding bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer now desires to incur debt and issue not to exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) of its Revenue Refunding Bonds (the "Bonds"), in the manner authorized and provided by the Act, as hereinafter provided for the purpose of (i) refunding the Refunded Bonds; (ii) funding a reserve fund or purchasing a reserve fund surety, if necessary; and (iii) paying Costs of Issuance of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Bonds will be secured by and payable from an irrevocable pledge and dedication of the net revenues derived from the operation of the Issuer's water, sewer, gas and sanitation systems (the "Combined Utility Enterprise Fund Net Revenues") and if such revenues are insufficient, from any other income, revenues and receipts of the Issuer derived from any source whatsoever so long as such income, revenues and receipts are not legally dedicated for purposes incompatible with those authorized by the Bonds ("Unrestricted Revenues" and together with Combined Utility Enterprise Net Revenues, "Pledged Revenues"); and

WHEREAS, the Bonds will be issued on a parity with the Issuer's outstanding obligations (i) pursuant to the 2006 Loan Agreement relating to the Series 2006 Bonds that mature in years 2015-2018 (the "Series 2006 Bonds"); (ii) pursuant to the 2008 Loan Agreement relating to those Series 2008 Bonds that are not refunded by the Bonds (the "Unrefunded Series 2008 Bonds"); (iii) pursuant to a Loan Agreement dated November 1, 2009 (the "2009 Loan Agreement") in conjunction with the issuance by the Authority of its \$23,750,000 Revenue Bonds (Denham Springs Sewer District No. 1 Project), Series 2009, of which approximately \$23,750,000 is currently outstanding (the "Series 2009 Bonds"); (iv) pursuant to the Issuer's \$9,145,000 Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2014 (the "Series 2014 Bonds"); and (v) pursuant to the Issuer's \$9,440,000 Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2015 (the "Series 2015 Bonds") and together with the Series 2006 Bonds, the Unrefunded Series 2008 Bonds, the Series 2009 Bonds, and the Series 2014 Bonds, collectively the "Outstanding Parity Obligations"); and

WHEREAS, the State Bond Commission, by action taken on March 19, 2015, has given final approval for the issuance of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this Governing Authority to fix the details necessary with respect to the issuance of the Bonds and to provide for their authorization and issuance; and

WHEREAS, it is further the desire of this Governing Authority to provide for the sale of the Bonds at the price and in the manner herein provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council (the "Governing Authority") of the City of Denham Springs, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority of the Issuer, as follows:

ARTICLE I
DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION

SECTION 1.1. Definitions. As used herein, the following terms shall have the following meanings, unless the context otherwise requires:

"Act" means Chapters 14 and 14-A of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, La. R.S. 39:1430 and other constitutional and statutory authority.

"Additional Parity Obligations" means obligations of the Issuer which are issued hereafter on a parity with the Bonds as authorized in Article 7 of this Bond Ordinance.

"Annual Principal and Interest Requirement" shall mean the sum of the payments required to be made by the Issuer in any Calendar Year with respect to the principal of, mandatory sinking fund payments, if any, and interest on such Bonds and any Additional Parity Obligations.

"Authority" means the Louisiana Local Government Environmental Facilities and Community Development Authority, as the issuer of the Series 2006 Bonds, the Series 2008 Bonds and the Series 2009 Bonds.

"Bond" or "Bonds" means any bond of the Issuer authorized to be issued by this Bond Ordinance, whether initially delivered or issued in exchange for, upon transfer of, or in lieu of any Bond previously issued.

"Bond Insurer" means, if applicable, the issuer of the Municipal Bond Insurance Policy, if any.

"Bond Register" means the records kept by the Paying Agent at its office in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, in which the registration of the Bonds and transfers of the Bonds shall be made as provided herein.

"Bond Ordinance" means this ordinance of the Governing Authority authorizing the issuance of the Bonds, as it may be further supplemented and amended.

"Bond Year" means the one-year period ending on the principal payment date for the Bonds.

"Business Day" means (a) any day other than Saturday or Sunday, (b) a day of the year on which banks located in Baton Rouge, Louisiana are not required or authorized to remain closed, and (c) any day on which the New York Stock Exchange is not closed.

"City Clerk" means the Clerk of the City of Denham Springs, Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana.

"Code" means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

"Combined Enterprise System" means the systems and facilities comprising the Issuer's water, sewer, gas and sanitation systems.

"Combined Utility Enterprise Fund Net Revenues" means the Combined Utility Enterprise System Revenues, less Operation and Maintenance Expenses related to the applicable utility system. Such operation and maintenance costs shall not include depreciation or amortization.

"Combined Utility Enterprise System Revenues" means, collectively, the Water System Revenues, the Sewerage System Revenues, the Gas System Revenues and the Sanitation System Revenues.

"Costs of Issuance" means all items of expense, directly or indirectly payable or reimbursable and related to the authorization, sale and issuance of the Bonds, including but not limited to printing costs, costs of preparation and reproduction of documents, filing and recording fees, initial fees and charges of any fiduciary, legal fees and charges, fees and disbursements of consultants and professionals, fees and charges for preparation, execution, transportation and safekeeping of the Bonds, costs and expenses of refunding, and any other cost, charge or fee payable by the Issuer in connection with the original issuance of the Bonds.

"Debt Service Reserve Requirement" means the lesser of (i) 10% of the proceeds of the Bonds, (ii) 125% of the average annual debt service on the Bonds, or (iii) 100% of Maximum Annual Debt Service with respect to the Bonds.

"District" means Denham Springs Sewerage District No. 1 of Livingston Parish, State of Louisiana, or its successors and assigns.

"District's Net Revenues" means the revenues of the District, including, but not limited to, sewerage user fees, less operation and maintenance costs, collected by the District, pursuant to the provisions of La. R.S. 33:1331, and an ordinance duly adopted by the Governing Authority of the District on February 25, 2013.

"Escrow Agreement" means the Escrow Deposit Agreement between the Issuer and the Paying Agent, acting as Escrow Trustee, and providing for the deposit of certain proceeds of the Bonds.

"Executive Officers" means the Mayor of the Issuer, the Chairman of the Governing Authority and the City Clerk.

"Fiscal Year" means the one (1) year period ending June 30 of each year, or such other period as may be designated by the Governing Authority as the fiscal year of the Issuer.

"Gas System Revenues" means the fees and charges levied by the Issuer to customers of its gas system pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Section 106-31 of Chapter 106 of the Denham Springs Code of Ordinances, as amended, pursuant to an Ordinance of the Issuer adopted by the Governing Authority on February 25, 2013.

"Governing Authority" means the City Council of the City of Denham Springs, State of Louisiana.

"Interest Payment Date" means June 1 and December 1 of each year in which the Bonds are outstanding, commencing June 1, 2016, or such other date as specified in the Purchase Agreement.

"Issuer" means the City of Denham Springs, State of Louisiana.

"Lawfully Available Funds" means, collectively, the funds, income, revenue, fees, receipts or charges of any nature from any source whatsoever on deposit with or accruing from time to time to the Issuer, provided that no such funds, income, revenue, fees, receipts or charges shall be so included in this definition which have been or are in the future legally dedicated and required for other purposes by the electorate, by the terms of specific grants, by the terms of particular obligations issued or to be issued (to the extent pledged or budgeted to pay debt service on such other obligations) or by operation of law, and provided further that neither the full faith and credit of the Issuer nor any specific tax of the Issuer is pledged and there is no obligation to levy or increase taxes or other sources of revenue above any legal limits applicable to the Issuer from time to time.

"Maximum Annual Debt Service" means, as of the date of calculation, the highest aggregate annual debt service requirement and debt service payable on the Bonds during the then current or any succeeding Fiscal Year over the remaining term of the Bonds.

"Municipal Bond Insurance Policy" means, if any, the municipal bond insurance policy issued by the Bond Insurer guaranteeing the scheduled payments of principal and interest on the Bonds.

"Operation and Maintenance Expenses" means the reasonable and necessary costs of operating, repairing, maintaining and insuring the applicable system.

"Outstanding" or "outstanding" when used with respect to the Bonds means, as of the date of determination, all Bonds theretofore issued and delivered under this Bond Ordinance, except:

- (1) Bonds theretofore cancelled by the Paying Agent or delivered to the Paying Agent for cancellation;
- (2) Bonds for which payment or redemption sufficient funds have been theretofore deposited in trust for the owners of such Bonds, provided that if such Bonds are to be redeemed, immediate notice of such redemption has been duly given or provided for pursuant to this Bond Ordinance or waived;
- (3) Bonds in exchange for or in lieu of which other Bonds have been registered and delivered pursuant to this Bond Ordinance;
- (4) Bonds alleged to have been mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen which have been paid as provided in this Bond Ordinance or by law; and
- (5) Bonds for the payment of the principal (or Redemption Price, if any) of and interest on which money or Qualified Investments or both are held in trust with the effect specified in this Bond Ordinance.

"Outstanding Parity Obligations" means, collectively, the Issuer's obligations with respect to the Unrefunded Series 2006 Bonds, the Unrefunded Series 2008 Bonds, the Series 2009 Bonds, the Series 2014 Bonds and the Series 2015 Bonds.

"Owner" or "Owners" or "owner" or "owners" or "Bondholder" when used with respect to any Bond means the person in whose name the Bond is registered in the Bond Register.

"Parity Bond Agreements" means, collectively, the Series 2006 Loan Agreement, the Series 2008 Loan Agreement, the Series 2009 Loan Agreement, the Series 2014 Bond Ordinance and the Series 2015 Bond Ordinance.

"Paying Agent" means Whitney Bank, in the City of Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana.

"Paying Agent Agreement" means the agreement to be entered into between the Issuer and the Paying Agent pursuant to this Bond Ordinance.

"Person" or "person" means any individual, corporation, partnership, joint venture, association, joint-stock company, trust, other juridical entity, unincorporated organization or government or any agency or political subdivision thereof.

"Pledged Revenues" means Combined Utility Enterprise Fund Net Revenues and, if such revenues are insufficient, Unrestricted Revenues.

"Purchase Agreement" means the agreement between the Underwriter and the Issuer regarding the purchase and sale of the Bonds.

"Qualified Investments" means investments permitted by La. R.S. 33:2955 or any investment authorized by the laws and Constitution of the State.

"Record Date" (or the interest payable on any Interest Payment Date means the fifteenth (15th) calendar date of the month next preceding such Interest Payment Date.

"Redemption Price" means, when used with respect to a Bond, the principal amount thereof plus the applicable premium, if any, payable upon redemption thereof pursuant to this Bond.

"Reserve Fund Alternative Investment" means an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a bank or surety bond issued by an insurance company meeting the requirements set forth herein to secure the Bonds in lieu of satisfying the Debt Service Reserve Requirement.

"Sanitation System Revenues" means the fees and charges levied by the Issuer to customers of its sanitation system pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Section 86-31 of Chapter 86 of the Denham Springs Code of Ordinances, as amended, pursuant to an Ordinance of the Issuer adopted by the Governing Authority on October 25, 2010.

"Series 2006 Bonds" means the Authority's \$23,765,000 Revenue Bonds (City of Denham Springs Sewer Project), Series 2006 that mature in years 2015-2018, currently outstanding in approximately the amount of \$2,410,000.

"Series 2006 Loan Agreement" means the Loan Agreement dated as of December 1, 2006 by and between the Issuer and the Authority, governing the payment obligations of the Issuer with respect to the Series 2006 Bonds.

"Series 2008 Bonds" means the Authority's \$9,100,000 Revenue Bonds (City of Denham Springs Sewer Project), Series 2008, currently outstanding in the amount of \$7,985,000.

"Series 2008 Loan Agreement" means the Loan Agreement dated as of May 1, 2008 by and between the Issuer and the Authority, governing the payment obligations of the Issuer with respect to the Series 2008 Bonds.

"Series 2009 Bonds" means the Authority's \$23,750,000 Revenue Bonds (Denham Springs Sewer District No. 1 Project), Series 2009, currently outstanding in approximately the amount of \$23,750,000.

"Series 2009 Loan Agreement" means the Loan Agreement dated as of November 1, 2009 by and between the Issuer and the Authority, governing the payment obligations of the Issuer with respect to the Series 2009 Bonds.

"Series 2014 Bonds" means the Issuer's \$9,145,000 Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2014, currently outstanding in approximately the amount of \$9,145,000.

"Series 2014 Bond Ordinance" means the ordinance adopted by the Issuer on May 14, 2013, as amended by the ordinance adopted on October 27, 2014, governing the issuance of the Series 2014 Bonds.

"Series 2015 Bonds" means the Issuer's \$9,440,000 Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2015, currently outstanding in approximately the amount of \$9,440,000.

"Series 2015 Bond Ordinance" means the ordinance adopted by the Issuer on March 23, 2015, governing the issuance of the Series 2015 Bonds.

"Sewerage System Revenues" means the fees and charges levied by the Issuer to customers of its sewage system pursuant to Section 106-38 of Chapter 106 of the Denham Springs Code of Ordinances, as amended, pursuant to an Ordinance of the Issuer adopted by the Governing Authority on February 25, 2013, including impact fees levied by the Issuer to customers of its wastewater treatment system pursuant to Section 106-66 of Chapter 106 of the Denham Springs Code of Ordinances, as amended, pursuant to an Ordinance of the Issuer adopted by the Governing Authority on February 25, 2008.

"State" means the State of Louisiana.

"Unrefunded Series 2008 Bonds" means any outstanding Series 2008 Bonds not refunded with proceeds of the Bonds.

"Unrestricted Revenues" means the income, revenues and receipts of the Issuer derived from any source whatsoever so long as such income, revenues and receipts are not legally dedicated for purposes incompatible with the Bonds.

"Water System Revenues" means the revenues derived from the fees and charges levied by the Issuer to customers of its water system pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Section 106-56 of Chapter 106 of Denham Springs Code of Ordinances, as amended, pursuant to an Ordinance of the Issuer adopted by the Governing Authority on February 25, 2013.

SECTION 1.2. Interpretation. In this Bond Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires, (a) words importing the singular include the plural and vice versa; and (b) words of the masculine gender shall be deemed and construed to include correlative words of the feminine and neuter genders.

ARTICLE 2
AUTHORIZATION AND ISSUANCE OF BONDS

SECTION 2.1. Authorization of Bonds.

(a) This Bond Ordinance authorizes the issuance of bonds of the Issuer, in one or more series, to be designated "Revenue Refunding Bonds of the City of Denham Springs, State of Louisiana." The Bonds may carry such series designation as may be determined by an Executive Officer depending on the circumstances or date of their delivery.

(b) The Bonds issued under this Bond Ordinance shall be issued for the purpose of (i) refunding the Refunded Bonds; (ii) funding a reserve fund or purchasing a reserve fund surety, if necessary; and (iii) paying Costs of Issuance of the Bonds.

SECTION 2.2. Bond Ordinance to Constitute a Contract. The provisions of this Bond Ordinance shall constitute a contract between the Issuer and the Owner or Owners from time to time of the Bonds, and any Owner of the Bonds may either at law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceedings, enforce and compel the performance of all duties required to be performed by the Governing Authority as a result of issuing the Bonds.

SECTION 2.3. Obligation of Bonds. The Bonds shall be payable on a parity with the Outstanding Parity Obligations, and shall be secured by and payable in principal, premium, if any, and interest solely from Pledged Revenues. The said Pledged Revenues are hereby irrevocably pledged in an amount sufficient for the payment of the Bonds and the Outstanding Parity Obligations in principal and interest as the installments thereof fall due, and the Pledged Revenues thus pledged shall remain so pledged for the security of the Bonds, the Outstanding Parity Obligations and any Additional Parity Obligations in principal and interest until they shall have been fully paid and discharged. Until the Bonds shall have been paid in full in principal and interest, the Issuer does hereby obligate itself and its successors in office, to budget annually a sum of money sufficient to pay the Bonds, the Outstanding Parity Obligations, any Additional Parity Obligations and the interest thereon as they respectively mature, including any principal and/or interest therefore matured and then unpaid, all within the limits prescribed by law.

In the event the Issuer should, in its discretion, levy and collect any tax, the proceeds of which are available for the payment of Operation and Maintenance Expenses of the Issuer or the Combined Enterprise System, such expenses shall be first paid from the proceeds of said tax to the extent that such tax proceeds may be so applied legally.

The Bonds are not general obligations of the Issuer, and neither the full faith and credit of the Issuer nor the taxing power of the Issuer is pledged for the payment of the Bonds. The issuance of the Bonds shall not directly, indirectly or contingently obligate the Issuer to levy or to pledge any ad valorem taxes whatever therefor, and any owner of the Bonds shall have no recourse to the power of ad valorem taxation for payment of principal of and/or interest on the Bonds.

SECTION 2.4. Authorization and Designation. In compliance with the terms and provisions of the Act, there is hereby authorized the incurring of indebtedness of not to exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) for, on behalf of, and in the name of the Issuer, for the purpose of (i) refunding the Refunded Bonds; (ii) funding a reserve fund or purchasing a reserve fund surety, if necessary; and (iii) paying Costs of Issuance of the Bonds. The Bonds shall be issued in fully registered form, and shall be dated the date of delivery. The Bonds shall bear interest at the rates set forth therein and in the Purchase Agreement, not to exceed five percent (5.00%) per annum.

SECTION 2.5. Denominations, Dates, Maturities and Interest. The Bonds shall be issued in denominations of not less than \$5,000, or integral multiples in excess thereof as set forth therein (each an "Authorized Denomination"). The Bonds shall bear interest from the date thereof or from the most recent Interest Payment Date to which interest has been paid or duly provided for, payable on each Interest Payment Date, commencing and at the rates (using a year of 360 days comprised of twelve 30-day months), as set forth in Section 2.4 hereof. The Bonds shall mature no later than December 1, 2038. The Bonds will be as substantially the form set forth in EXHIBIT A hereto, with such necessary or appropriate variations, omissions and insertions as are required or permitted by the Act and this Bond Ordinance.

SECTION 2.6. Payment of Principal and Interest. The principal and premium, if any, of the Bonds shall be payable in such coin or currency of the United States of America as at the time of payment is legal tender for payment of public and private debts at the office of the Paying Agent in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

The principal of the Bonds, upon maturity or redemption, shall be payable at the office of the Paying Agent in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, upon presentation and surrender hereof, and interest on the Bonds shall be payable by check of the Paying Agent mailed by the Paying Agent to the Owner (determined as of the close of business on the Record Date) at the address shown on the Bond Register. Each Bond delivered under this Bond Ordinance upon transfer of, in exchange for or in lieu of any other Bond shall carry all the rights to interest accrued and unpaid, and to accrue, which were carried by such other Bond, and each such Bond shall bear interest (as herein set forth) so neither gain nor loss in interest shall result from such transfer, exchange or substitution.

No Bond shall be entitled to any right or benefit under this Bond Ordinance, or be valid or obligatory for any purpose, unless there appears on such Bond a certificate of registration, substantially in the form set forth in EXHIBIT A to this Bond Ordinance, executed by the Paying Agent by manual signature.

SECTION 2.7. Book-Entry Only System. The Bonds will be issued by means of a book-entry system with no distribution of physical bond certificates made to the public. One bond certificate for each maturity will be issued to The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"), or its nominee, and immobilized in its custody. The book-entry system will evidence beneficial ownership of the Bonds in Authorized Denominations with transfers of beneficial ownership effected on the records of DTC and its participants pursuant to rules and procedures established by DTC and its participants. Bond certificates registered in the name of Code & Co. will be deposited with DTC. Interest on the Bonds will be paid semiannually on June 1 and December 1 and principal on the Bonds will be paid annually on December 1 to DTC or its nominee as registered owner of the Bonds. Transfer of principal and interest payments to beneficial owners by participants of DTC will be the responsibility of such participants and other nominees of beneficial owners. The Issuer will not be responsible or liable for maintaining, supervising or reviewing the records maintained by DTC, its participants or persons acting through such participants.

DTC may discontinue providing its services as securities depository with respect to the Bonds at any time by giving reasonable notice to the Issuer. Under such circumstances, in the event that a successor securities depository is not obtained, Bond certificates are required to be prepared, executed and delivered.

The Issuer may decide to discontinue use of the system of book-entry transfers through DTC (or a successor securities depository). In that case, either a successor depository will be selected by the Issuer or Bond certificates will be prepared, executed and delivered.

Installments of principal and interest on the Bonds, whether paid at maturity, by prepayment or otherwise, are payable in lawful money of the United States of America, by check or draft mailed or delivered to the Owner at the address appearing on the registration book of the Paying Agent or at such other address as is furnished to the Paying Agent in writing by such Owner; provided, however, that payment of the final installment of principal and interest thereon shall be made only upon presentation and surrender of the Bonds at the corporate office of the Paying Agent in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Said payments shall be noted on the Payment Record made a part of the Bonds, and the Paying Agent shall provide the Issuer with proof of such notations. Upon surrender of any Bonds for transfer pursuant to the provisions hereof, the Paying Agent shall verify the accuracy of the payment record made a part of the Bonds.

No Bonds shall be entitled to any security, right or benefit under this Bond Ordinance or be valid or obligatory for any purpose, unless there appears on such Bonds a certificate of registration, substantially in the form provided in this Bond Ordinance, executed by the Paying Agent by manual signature, and such executed Bonds of the Paying Agent upon such Bonds shall be conclusive evidence that such Bonds have been executed, registered and delivered under this Bond Ordinance.

ARTICLE 3
REDEMPTION PROVISIONS

SECTION 3.1. Optional Redemption Provisions. The Bonds may be callable for redemption prior to their stated maturity, as set forth in the Purchase Agreement and/or the Bonds.

SECTION 3.2. Mandatory Sinking Fund Redemption. The Bonds may be subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption as set forth in the Purchase Agreement and/or the Bonds.

The principal amounts of mandatory sinking fund payments, if any, shall be reduced as specified by the Issuer or as provided herein, by any principal amounts of the Bonds redeemed pursuant to an optional redemption as set forth herein. In the event of a partial redemption of the Bonds, the amount of future mandatory sinking fund redemptions with respect to the Bonds will be reduced to take into account such partial redemption.

SECTION 3.3. Partial Redemption of Bonds; Selection of Bonds. If less than all of the Bonds of a particular maturity are called for redemption, the Bonds within such maturity to be redeemed will be selected by DTC or any successor security depository pursuant to its rules or procedures or, if the book-entry system is discontinued, will be selected by the Paying Agent by lot in such manner as the Paying Agent in its discretion may determine.

In the event a Bond to be redeemed is of a denomination larger than \$5,000, a portion of such Bond (\$5,000 or any multiple thereof) may be redeemed. Any Bond which is to be redeemed only in part shall be surrendered at the corporate trust office of the Paying Agent in Baton Rouge, Louisiana and there shall be delivered to the Owner of such Bond, a Bond or Bonds of the same maturity and of any authorized denomination or denominations as requested by such Owner in aggregate principal amount equal to and in exchange for the unredeemed portion of the principal of the Bond surrendered.

SECTION 3.4. Notice of Redemption. Official notice of such call of any of the Bonds for redemption other than pursuant to Section 3.2 hereof, shall be given by means of first class mail, postage prepaid, by notice deposited in the United States mails not less than thirty (30) days prior to the redemption date addressed to the Owner of each Bond to be redeemed at their address as shown on the Bond Register, or by accepted means of electronic communication.

ARTICLE 4
CONCERNING FIDUCIARIES

SECTION 4.1. Book-Entry System of Bonds. The Issuer has executed and delivered a Blanket Letter of Representations with The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York (the "Securities Depository"), and the terms and provisions of said Letter of Representations shall govern in the event of any inconsistency between the provisions of this Bond Ordinance and said Letter of Representations. On the issuance date, the Bonds will be issued as a single Bond for each maturity in the name of The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York (the "Securities Depository"), or its nominee, which will not act as depository for the Bonds. Bonds will be issued to the Securities Depository pursuant to the terms hereof shall constitute "Book-Entry Bonds." During the term of the Book-Entry Bonds, ownership and subsequent transfers of ownership will be reflected by book entry on the records of the Securities Depository and those financial institutions for whom the Securities Depository effects book-entry transfers (collectively, the "DTC Participants"). No person (other than a DTC Participant) has an interest in any Book-Entry Bond (a "Beneficial Owner") shall receive a bond certificate representing an interest in the Book-Entry Bonds except in the event that the Securities Depository or the Issuer shall determine, at its option, to terminate the book-entry system described in this section.

Payment of principal of and interest on Book-Entry Bonds will be made by the Paying Agent to the Securities Depository which will in turn remit such payment of principal and interest to its DTC Participants which will in turn remit such principal and interest to the Beneficial Owners of the Book-Entry Bonds unit and unless the Securities Depository or the Issuer elects to terminate the book-entry system, whereupon the Issuer shall deliver bond certificates to the Beneficial Owners of the Book-Entry Bonds or their nominees. Bond certificates issued under this section may not be transferred or exchanged except as provided in this section.

For so long as the Securities Depository shall continue to serve as securities depository for the Bonds as provided herein, all transfers of beneficial ownership interests will be made by book-entry only, and no investor or other party purchasing, selling or otherwise transferring beneficial ownership of Bonds is to receive, hold or deliver any Bond certificate.

For every transfer and exchange of the Bonds, the Beneficial Owner may be charged a sum sufficient to cover such Beneficial Owner's allocable share of any tax, fee or other governmental charges that may be imposed in relation thereto.

The Issuer and the Paying Agent will recognize DTC or its nominee as the Bondholder for all purposes, including notices and voting.

Neither the Issuer nor the Paying Agent are responsible for the performance by DTC of any of its obligations, including, without limitation, the payment of moneys received by DTC, the forwarding of notices received by DTC or the giving of any consent or proxy in lieu of consent.

Whenever during the term of the Bonds the beneficial ownership thereof is determined by a book-entry at DTC, the requirements of this Bond Ordinance of holding, delivering or transferring Bonds shall be deemed modified to require the appropriate person to meet the requirements of DTC as to registering or transferring the book-entry to produce the same effect.

Upon the reduction of the principal amount of any Book-Entry Bonds, in accordance with the Letter of Representations, the Securities Depository (or the Paying Agent on behalf of the Securities Depository through the Fast Automated Transfer delivery services of the Securities Depository) may either (i) make a notation of such redemption on the Book-Entry Bond, striking the amount so redeemed, or (ii) may return the Book-Entry Bond to the Paying Agent for exchange for a new Book-Entry Bond, authenticated by the Paying Agent in a proper principal amount. If the Securities Depository makes a notation on the Book-Entry Bond, such notation may be made for reference only, and may not be relied upon by any other person as being in anyway determinative of the principal amount of such Book-Entry Bond Outstanding, unless the Paying Agent has initiated the notation on the Book-Entry Bond.

Upon delivery of Book-Entry Bonds to the purchasers thereof on the delivery date, such purchasers shall deposit the bond certificates representing all Bonds with the Securities Depository (or the Paying Agent on behalf of the Securities Depository through the Fast Automated Security Transfer delivery services of the Securities Depository). The Securities Depository, or its nominee, will be the sole Bearer of the Book-Entry Bonds so delivered, and the investor or other party purchasing, selling or otherwise transferring ownership of any Book-Entry Bonds will receive, hold or deliver any bond certificates as long as the Securities Depository holds Book-

The Pledged Revenues are hereby irrevocably and irrevocably pledged and dedicated to the payment of principal, of premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds and the Outstanding Party Obligations as they shall respectively become due and payable, as set forth herein, Combined Utility Enterprise System Revenues shall be set aside in a separate and special fund and shall be remain so pledged for the security and payment of the principal and interest on the Bonds, the Outstanding Party Obligations and any Additional Party Obligations until the same are paid in full.

SECTION 6.2. Rate Covenant. The Issuer, through its Governing Authority, hereby covenants to fix, establish, maintain and collect, so long as any principal and interest is unpaid on the bonds, such rates, fees, rents or other charges for the services and facilities of the Combined Enterprise System, and all parts thereof, and to revise the same from time to time whenever necessary, as will always provide Combined Utility Enterprise Fund Net Revenues combined with the District's Net Revenues in such Fiscal Year sufficient to (i) make payments and deposits required by the Party Bond Agreements and this Bond Ordinance for the payment of the principal and interest on the Bonds, Outstanding Party Obligations and any Additional Party Obligations issued hereafter; (ii) equal one hundred twenty-five (125%) of the required deposits to the debt service funds established for the security and payment of the Bonds, Outstanding Party Obligations and any Additional Party Obligations; (iii) make all other payments required by this Bond Ordinance; and (iv) pay all other obligations or indebtedness payable out of the Combined Utility Enterprise Fund Net Revenues for such Fiscal Year. The Issuer further covenants that such rates, fees, rents or other charges shall not at any time be reduced so as to be insufficient to provide adequate revenues for such purposes.

SECTION 6.3. Funds and Accounts.

A. **Fund of Funds.** All Combined Utility Enterprise System Revenues shall continue to be deposited daily as the same may be collected or become available in a separately identifiable fund or account to be maintained with the regularly designated fiscal agent bank of the Issuer, and such fund shall be maintained and administered in the following order of priority, and for the following express purposes:

- Payment of Current Expenses.** Current Operation and Maintenance Expenses of the Combined Enterprise System from month to month as the same shall become due shall be paid. Current Operation and Maintenance Expenses will not exceed the reasonable and necessary amount thereof.
- Payments Pursuant to Party Bond Agreements; Debt Service Fund.** After making the payments set forth in (i) above, the Issuer shall make any payments due under the Party Bond Agreements, as well as required payments into the Debt Service Fund (as hereinafter defined), on a pro rata basis. In the event there are insufficient funds to make payments from the Combined Utility Enterprise System Revenues, the payments shall be made from Unrestricted Revenues. There is hereby established to be maintained with the Paying Agent, a separately identifiable fund or account, designated the "Series 2016 Revenue Refunding Bond Debt Service Fund" (the "Debt Service Fund"). On or before the twentieth (20th) day of each month, or, if such day is not a Business Day, the next succeeding Business Day, commencing as set forth in the Bonds and the Purchase Agreement, the Issuer shall transfer or cause to be transferred to the Debt Service Fund, one-sixth (1/6) or such other proportionate amount as set forth therein, of the amount required to pay interest payable on the Bonds on the next Interest Payment Date and one-twelfth (1/12) or such other proportionate amount as set forth therein, of the amount required to pay principal payable on the Bonds on the next Principal Payment Date.
- Payments Following a Draw on the Reserve Fund.** Following any draw on the Reserve Fund, on the twentieth (20th) day of each month, or, if such day is not a Business Day, the next succeeding Business Day, an amount sufficient to bring the balance in the Reserve Fund to the Debt Service Reserve Requirement in twelve (12) months. The Issuer will also repay any draws under the Reserve Fund Alternate Investment, in accordance with the provisions thereof. In the event there are insufficient funds to make payments from the Combined Utility Enterprise System Revenues, the payments shall be made from Unrestricted Revenues.

B. **Reserve Fund.** There is hereby established with the Paying Agent a separately identifiable fund or account designated the Series 2016 Revenue Refunding Bond Reserve Fund (the "Reserve Fund"). The Outstanding Party Obligations are not secured by the Reserve Fund. In no event shall funds in the Reserve Fund be used to make payments on the Outstanding Party Obligations. The money in the Reserve Fund is to be retained solely for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Bonds, as to which there would otherwise be a default.

If cash held in the Reserve Fund, including interest earnings, exceeds the Debt Service Reserve Requirement on the Bonds, an amount equal to such excess shall be transferred by the Paying Agent to the Debt Service Fund. The Paying Agent shall value the Reserve Fund annually on each November 15. Earnings on amounts in the Reserve Fund shall be transferred to the Debt Service Fund and applied as a credit against the Issuer's next installment of the interest on the Bonds. The Paying Agent shall not be required to liquidate any investment before its maturity to make such transfer. Whenever the amount on deposit in the Reserve Fund is less than the Debt Service Reserve Requirement on the Bonds, the Paying Agent shall notify the Issuer of the amount of such deficiency. The Issuer shall remedy such deficiency as set forth in Section 6.3(A)(iii).

The Issuer may, in connection with the original funding of the Reserve Fund, or at any time thereafter, with written consent of the Bond Insurer, if any, in order to satisfy all or any portion of the Debt Service Reserve Requirement, deposit with the Paying Agent, instead of cash in the Reserve Fund (or to replace cash in the Reserve Fund, in which case the replaced cash shall be paid to the Issuer) or to meet the requirements herein that it deposit additional amounts in the Reserve Fund, a Reserve Fund Alternate Investment. If such Reserve Fund Alternate Investment expires prior to fifteen (15) days after the final maturity of the Bonds, it must provide, that if not renewed within fifteen (15) days prior to its expiration date in an amount equal to the undrawn amount thereof (other than because of a reduction in the Debt Service Reserve Requirement or the deposit of cash in the Reserve Fund to replace it), the Paying Agent may draw the full amount of such Reserve Fund Alternate Investment. The Paying Agent shall draw down the full amount of such Reserve Fund Alternate Investment and deposit such amount in the Reserve Fund fifteen (15) days prior to expiration of such Reserve Fund Alternate Investment if it is not renewed as provided for in the preceding sentence. The Reserve Fund Alternate Investment must be able to be drawn upon at any time that cash could be withdrawn from the Reserve Fund. Prior to accepting any such Reserve Fund Alternate Investment obtained subsequent to the Closing Date, the Paying Agent, the Issuer and the Bond Insurer, if any, must receive a Bond Counsel opinion that such acceptance and any payment of funds in the Reserve Fund to the Borrower is authorized by this Bond Ordinance and will not adversely affect the exclusion of interest on the Bonds from gross income for purposes of federal income taxation.

If a disbursement is made under a Reserve Fund Alternate Investment deposited in the Reserve Fund, the Issuer shall be obligated to reimburse the maximum limits of such surety bond immediately following such disbursement as required by the terms of the Reserve Fund Alternate Investment.

SECTION 6.4. Funds to Constitute Trust Funds. The Debt Service Fund and the Reserve Fund provided for in Section 6.3 hereof shall be and constitute trust funds for the purposes provided for in this Bond Ordinance and the owner(s) of the Bonds issued pursuant to this Bond Ordinance. The Revenue Fund securing the Bonds on a parity with the Outstanding Party Obligations. The monies in such funds shall at all times be secured to the full extent thereof by the bank or trust company holding such funds to the extent and in the manner required by the laws of the State of Louisiana and this Bond Ordinance.

At the written direction of the Issuer, all monies in any of the funds created hereunder may be invested in Qualified Investments, the principal of and interest on which are payable not later than the dates on which it is estimated such monies will be required hereunder. All income derived from such investments shall be added to the amounts in the respective funds, if required, or to the Reserve Fund, and such investments shall be liquidated to the extent at any time necessary to apply the proceeds thereof to the purpose for which the respective funds have been created.

Qualified Investments acquired as an investment of monies in any fund and account created hereunder shall be credited to such fund or account for the purpose of determining the amount in any fund or account at any time in accordance with this provision. All Qualified Investments credited to such funds or accounts shall be valued at the lesser of amortized cost (exclusive of accrued interest) or fair market value. Any and all funds of the Issuer which may be placed on deposit with any bank in compliance with any provision of this Bond Ordinance, or any resolution of the Issuer supplemental hereto, shall be secured by said bank at all times to the full extent thereof by direct obligations of the United States of America or the State of Louisiana having a market value of not less than the money then on deposit.

ARTICLE 7 ADDITIONAL PARTY OBLIGATIONS

SECTION 7.1. Additional Party Obligations. The Bonds shall enjoy complete parity of lien on the Pledged Revenues with the Outstanding Party Obligations. The Issuer shall issue no other bonds or obligations of any nature payable from or enjoying a lien on the Pledged Revenues or Lawfully Available Funds having priority over or parity with the Bonds and the Party Obligations except that bonds may be hereafter issued on a parity with the Bonds and the Party Obligations under substantially the following conditions:

(a) The Bonds or any part thereof, including interest and redemption premiums thereon, may be refunded and the refunding bonds so issued shall enjoy complete equality of lien with the portion of the Bonds which is not refunded. If there be, and the refunding bonds so issued shall enjoy priority over the portion of the Bonds over subsequent issues may have been enjoyed by the Bonds refunded; provided, however, that if only a portion of the Bonds outstanding is so refunded and if the refunding bonds require Annual Principal and Interest Requirements during any Bond Year in excess of the principal and interest which would have been required in such Bond Year to pay the Bonds refunded thereof, then such Bonds may not be refunded without the consent of the Owners of the unfunded portion of the Bonds issued hereunder (provided such consent shall not be required if such refunding bonds meet the requirements set forth in (b) below).

(b) Additional Party Obligations may also be issued on parity with the Bonds and the Outstanding Party Obligations as follows:

(i) Additional Party Obligations secured by Combined Utility Enterprise Fund Net Revenues may be incurred if the Combined Utility Enterprise Fund Net Revenues combined with the District's Net Revenues for the most recently completed Fiscal Year immediately preceding the issuance of the additional bonds, notes, or other obligations have been not less than 125% of the Maximum Annual Debt Service for the Bonds, Outstanding Party Obligations and the proposed Additional Party Obligations secured by Combined Utility Enterprise Fund Net Revenues. The calculations of "Combined Utility Enterprise Fund Net Revenues" and the "District's Net Revenues" may be adjusted to reflect (1) adopted rate increases, as though such rate increases had been in continuous effect during the most recently completed Fiscal Year, and (2) projected customer increases based on the report of a consulting engineer.

(ii) Additional Party Obligations secured by Unrestricted Revenues or Lawfully Available Funds may be incurred if the average annual Unrestricted Revenues or Lawfully Available Funds for the two (2) Fiscal Years immediately preceding the issuance of the additional bonds, notes, or other obligations were not less than 150% of the Maximum Annual Debt Service on all debt secured by Unrestricted Revenues or Lawfully Available Funds and the proposed Additional Debt secured by Unrestricted Revenues or Lawfully Available Funds. For purposes of calculating "Maximum Annual Debt Service" on obligations secured by or payable from Unrestricted Revenues or Lawfully Available Funds, "Maximum Annual Debt Service" shall not include any debt service on bonds, notes or other obligations that are payable from a dedicated revenue stream which would not otherwise be a component part of the Issuer's Unrestricted Revenues or Lawfully Available Funds and which dedicated revenue stream for each of the two (2) Fiscal Years immediately preceding the issuance of the proposed Additional Party Obligations must (1) have been not less than 125% of the maximum annual debt service on the bonds, notes or other obligations that are payable from the dedicated revenue stream and (2) secure the bonds, notes or other obligations payable from such dedicated revenue stream until paid in full.

ARTICLE 8 EVENTS OF DEFAULT AND MUNICIPAL BOND INSURANCE

SECTION 8.1. Events of Default. Each of the following events is hereby declared an "Event of Default" hereunder:

- payment of the principal of any of the Bonds or Party Obligations shall not be made when the same shall become due and payable, either at maturity or by earlier redemption;
- payment of any installment of interest on any Bonds or Party Obligations shall not be made when the same shall become due and payable;
- payment of any installment of either principal or interest into the Debt Service Fund pursuant to Section 6.3(A)(ii) hereof shall not be made when the same shall become due and payable;
- payment of any installment of either interest or principal of any junior or subordinate lien bonds shall not be made when the same becomes due and payable or any other event of default shall exist with respect to any junior or subordinate lien bonds;
- the Issuer shall for any reason be rendered incapable of fulfilling its obligations hereunder;
- an order or decree shall be entered with the consent or acquiescence of the Issuer appointing a receiver or trustees of its properties, or of the revenues thereof, or any proceedings shall be instituted with the consent or acquiescence of the Issuer for the purpose of effecting a composition between the Issuer and its creditors whose claims relate to its properties, or for the purpose of adjusting claims of such creditors, pursuant to any Federal or State statute now or hereafter enacted, or if such order of decree, having been entered without the consent or acquiescence of the Issuer, shall not be vacated or discharged or stayed on appeal within sixty (60) days after entry thereof, or if such proceeding having been instituted without the consent or acquiescence of the Issuer, shall not be withdrawn or any orders entered shall not be vacated, discharged, or stayed on appeal within sixty (60) days after the institution of such proceedings, or the entry of such orders; or
- the Issuer shall fail to operate, or cause to be operated, its properties in an efficient and businesslike fashion or shall default in the due and punctual performance of any other of the covenants, conditions, agreements or provisions contained in the Bonds or in this Bond Ordinance, and such default as to efficient operation or otherwise shall continue for sixty (60) days after written notice, specifying such default and requiring the same to be remedied, shall have been given to the Issuer by any Bondholder, provided that in the case of default specified in this paragraph (g), if the default be such that it cannot be corrected within the said sixty (60) days period, it shall not constitute an event of default if corrective action is instituted by the Issuer within said sixty (60) day period and diligently pursued until the default is corrected.

Upon the happening and continuance of any Event of Default, the owners of the Bonds, or the Paying Agent on their behalf, shall be entitled to exercise all rights and powers for which provision is made in the Act or any provision of law.

After payment of reasonable expenses of the Paying Agent, the application of funds realized upon default shall be applied to the payment of expenses of the Issuer or rebate only after the payment of past due and current debt service on the Bonds.

The foregoing provisions of paragraph (g) are subject to the following limitations: if by reason of force majeure the Issuer is unable in whole or in part to carry out its agreements herein contained, the Issuer shall not be deemed in default during the continuance of such inability. The term "force majeure" as used herein shall mean, without limitation, the following: acts of God; strikes; lockouts or other industrial disturbances; acts of public enemies; orders of their departments, agencies, or officials; or any civil or military authority; insurrections; riots; epidemics; landslides; lightning; earthquake; fire; hurricanes; storms; floods; wash-outs; droughts; arrests; restraint of government and people; civil disturbances; explosions; breakage or accident to machinery, tunnels or canals; partial or entire failure of utilities; or any other cause or event not reasonably within the control of the Issuer, it being agreed that the settlement of strikes, lockouts or other industrial disturbances shall be entirely within the discretion of the Issuer, and the Issuer shall not be required to make settlement of strikes, lockouts or other industrial disturbances by acceding to the demands of the opposing party or parties when such course is in the judgment of the Issuer unworkable to the Issuer.

SECTION 8.2. Municipal Bond Insurance Policy. If there is a Municipal Bond Insurance Policy in effect guaranteeing the scheduled payments of principal of and interest on the Bonds, the specific requirements of said policy shall be set forth either in a separate insurance agreement or as an attachment to the Paying Agent Agreement and the Executive Officers are hereby authorized to execute and deliver such agreement, in a form acceptable to bond counsel to the Issuer.

ARTICLE 9 PARTICULAR COVENANTS OF THE ISSUER

SECTION 9.1. Tax Covenants. To the extent permitted by the laws of the State of Louisiana, the Issuer will comply with the requirements of the Code to establish, maintain and preserve the exclusion from "gross income" of interest on the Bonds under the Code. The Issuer shall not take any action or fail to take any action, nor shall it permit at any time or times any of the proceeds of the Bonds or any other funds of the Issuer to be used directly or indirectly to acquire any securities or obligations the acquisition of which would cause the Bonds to be an "arbitrage bond" as defined in the Code, or would result in the inclusion of the interest on the Bonds in "gross income" under the Code, including without limitation, the failure to comply with the limitation on investment of the proceeds of said Bonds, the failure to pay any required rebate of arbitrage earnings to the United States of America, or the use of the proceeds of the Bonds in a manner which would cause the Bonds to be a "private activity bond" under the Code.

of the Bonds in a manner which would cause the Bonds to be a "private activity bond" under the Code.

SECTION 9.2. Bonds as a "Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligation." The Issuer may designate the Bonds as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" within the meaning of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code in the tax agreement executed at closing, if appropriate.

SECTION 9.3. Rates and Charges. Except as provided herein, nothing in this Bond Ordinance or the Bonds shall be construed to prevent the Issuer from altering, amending or repealing from time to time as may be necessary any resolution or ordinance setting up and establishing a schedule or schedules of rates and charges for the services and facilities to be rendered by the Combined Enterprise System, and said alterations, amendments or repeals to be conditioned upon the continued preservation of the rights of the Owners with respect to the Combined Utility Enterprise Fund Net Revenues, not alone for the payment of principal and interest on the Bonds, but to give assurance and insure that said Revenues shall be sufficient at all times to meet and fulfill the other provisions stated and specified in this Bond Ordinance. It is understood and agreed, however, that the Issuer shall fix and maintain and collect rates and charges for the services to be rendered by the Combined Enterprise System, irrespective of the user thereof, and that no free service shall be furnished to any Person or even to the Issuer itself.

The Issuer agrees that the failure of any person to pay the charges for any service rendered by the Combined Enterprise System within thirty (30) days of the date on which it is due shall cause such charge to become delinquent; that if such delinquent charge, with interest and penalties accrued thereon, is not paid within thirty (30) days from the date on which it became delinquent, the Issuer, to the extent allowed by law, will shut off utility services to the affected premises, and the Issuer and this Governing Authority and its officials agents and employees will do all things necessary and will take advantage of all remedies afforded by law to collect and enforce the prompt payment of all charges made for services rendered by the Combined Enterprise System. All delinquent charges for services shall on the date of delinquency have added thereto a penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount of the charge and the amount so due, including the penalty charge, shall, after thirty (30) days from the date of delinquency, bear interest at the rate of at least six percent (6%) per annum. If services shall be discontinued as above provided, the customer shall, in addition to paying the delinquent charges, penalties and interest, pay, as a condition precedent to the resumption of service, a reasonable re-connection charge.

SECTION 9.4. Budget Audit. Not later than six (6) months after the close of each Fiscal Year, unless such date is extended pursuant to the laws of the State of Louisiana or by virtue of an Executive Order of the Governor of the State of Louisiana in the event of a natural disaster or similar event, the Issuer shall cause an audit of its books and accounts by an independent firm of certified public accountants showing the receipts and disbursements made by the Issuer during the previous Fiscal Year. Such audit shall be available for inspection by the Owner of any of the Bonds. The Issuer further agrees that the Paying Agent and the Owner(s) of the Bonds shall have at all reasonable times the right to inspect the Combined Enterprise System and the records, accounts and data of the Issuer relating thereto.

SECTION 9.5. Right to Pledge Revenues; Bank in Lien. In providing for the issuance of the Bonds, the Issuer does hereby represent and covenant that it is lawfully seized and possessed of the System, that it has a legal right to pledge Pledged Revenues as herein provided. The Issuer will at all times maintain the System in first class repair and working order and condition.

SECTION 9.6. Application of Proceeds. The Executive Officers are hereby empowered, authorized and directed to do any and all things necessary and incidental to carry out all of the provisions of this Bond Ordinance, to cause the necessary Bonds to be printed, to issue, execute and seal the Bonds, and to effect delivery thereof as hereinafter provided, including the execution of an Escrow Agreement and other documents necessary to secure the issuance of the Bonds. The proceeds derived from the sale of the Bonds, along with certain other proceeds of the Issuer, shall be received by the Paying Agent and deposited into the Bond Proceeds Fund held pursuant to the Paying Agent Agreement and allocated in accordance therewith.

SECTION 9.7. Rights of Owners in Event of Default. The Owners of the Bonds from time to time shall be entitled to exercise all rights and powers for which provision is made in the laws of the State of Louisiana. The Owners or any trustee acting for such Owners in the manner hereinafter provided, may, either in law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceeding in any court of competent jurisdiction, protect and enforce any and all rights such owners have under the laws of said State, or granted and contained in this Bond Ordinance, and may enforce and compel the performance of all duties required by this Bond Ordinance, or by any applicable statutes to be performed by the Issuer or any agency, board or officer thereof, including the fixing, charging and collecting of rentals, fees or other charges for the use of the Combined Enterprise System, and in general to take any action necessary to most effectively protect the rights of the said Owners.

In the event that default is made in the payment of the interest on or the principal of the Bonds as the same becomes due, or in the payments into the Debt Service Fund or the Reserve Fund or any other payments required to be made under this Bond Ordinance, or in the event that the Issuer or any agency, board, officer, agent or employee thereof shall fail or refuse to comply with the provisions of this Bond Ordinance or shall default in any covenant made herein and in the further event that such default shall continue for a period of thirty (30) days after written notice, any Owner or any trustee appointed to represent such Owner as hereinafter provided shall be entitled as of right to the appointment of a receiver of the Combined Enterprise System in an appropriate judicial proceeding in a court of competent jurisdiction.

The receiver so appointed shall forthwith directly or by his agents and attorneys, take possession of the Combined Enterprise System and shall hold, operate and maintain, manage and control the Combined Enterprise System, and in the name of the Issuer shall exercise all rights and powers of the Issuer with respect to the Combined Enterprise System as might be done the Issuer itself. Such receiver shall collect and receive all fees, rentals and other revenues, maintain and operate the Combined Enterprise System in the manner provided in this Bond Ordinance, and comply under the jurisdiction of the court appointing such receiver, with all of the provisions of this Bond Ordinance.

Whenever all debt service payments due on the Bonds into the Reserve Fund, Debt Service Fund or other funds and upon any other obligations and interest thereon having a charge, lien, or encumbrance on the Pledged Revenues, shall have been paid and made good, and all defaults under the provisions of this Bond Ordinance have been cured and made good, possession of the Combined Enterprise System shall be surrendered to the Issuer upon the entry of an order of the court to that effect. Upon any subsequent default, any one of the Owner of the Bonds or any trustee appointed for the Owner as herein provided, shall have the same right to secure the further appointment of a receiver upon any such subsequent default.

Such receiver shall in the performance of the powers hereinabove conferred upon him be under the direction and supervision of the court making such appointment, shall at all times be subject to the orders and decrees of such court, and may be removed thereby and a successor receiver appointed in the discretion of such court. Nothing herein contained shall limit or restrict the jurisdiction of such court to enter such other and further orders and decrees as such court may deem necessary or appropriate for the exercise by the receiver of any function specifically set forth herein.

Any receiver appointed under the provisions herein shall hold and operate the Combined Enterprise System in the name of the Issuer and for the joint protection and benefit of the Issuer and the Owner of the Bonds. Such receiver shall have no power to sell, assign, mortgage or otherwise dispose of any property of any kind or character belonging or pertaining to the Combined Enterprise System but the authority of such receiver shall be limited to the possession, operation and maintenance of the Combined Enterprise System for the sole purpose of the protection of both the Issuer and the Owner and the curing and making good of any default under the provisions of this Bond Ordinance, and the title to and the ownership of the Combined Enterprise System shall remain in the Issuer, and no court shall have any jurisdiction to enter any order or decree permitting or requiring such receiver to sell, mortgage or otherwise dispose of any property of the Combined Enterprise System except with the consent of the Issuer in such manner as the court shall direct. The Owners of the Bonds in an aggregate principal amount of not less than twenty-five percent (25%) of the principal amount of the Bonds then Outstanding may by a duly executed certificate appoint a trustee for the Owners with authority to represent such Owners in any legal proceedings for the enforcement and protection of the rights of such Owners. Such certificate shall be executed by such Owners, or by their duly authorized attorneys or representatives, and shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk.

Until an Event of Default shall have occurred, the Issuer shall retain full possession and control of the Combined Enterprise System with full right to manage, operate and use the same and every part thereof with the rights appertaining thereto, and to collect and receive and, subject to the provisions of this Bond Ordinance, to take, use, enjoy and distribute the earnings, income, rent issue and profits accruing on or derivable from the Combined Enterprise System.

SECTION 9.8. Limitations on the Sale, Lease or Other Disposition of Property. So long as any of the Bonds are Outstanding in principal or interest, the Issuer shall be bound and obligated not to sell, lease, encumber or in any manner dispose of the Combined Enterprise System or any substantial part thereof, provided, however, that this covenant shall not be construed to prevent the disposal by the Issuer of property which in its judgment has become worn out, unserviceable, unsuitable or unnecessary in the operation of the Combined Enterprise System or when other property of equal value or capacity is substituted therefor.

SECTION 9.9. Prohibition on Encumbrances. Except as herein provided in Article 7 of this Bond Ordinance, the Issuer hereby covenants it will not voluntarily create or cause to be created any debt, lien, pledge, mortgage, assignment, encumbrance or any other charge whatsoever having priority over or a parity with the lien and pledge of Pledged Revenues securing the Bonds as provided in this Bond Ordinance.

SECTION 9.10. Utility Charges and Connections. The Issuer shall take action to urge every owner, tenant or occupant of each lot or parcel of land in the Issuer which abuts upon a street or other public way containing a water line and upon which lots or parcels a building shall have been constructed for residential, commercial or industrial use, to connect said building with the Combined Enterprise System and to cause to use any other method for obtaining utilities which can be provided by the Combined Enterprise System. All such connections shall be made in accordance with the rules and regulations to be adopted from time to time by this Governing Authority, which rules and regulations may provide for an inspection charge to assure the proper making of such connection.

In addition to all other rights and remedies available to be used for the collection and enforcement of utility charges, the Issuer shall exercise and enforce promptly and efficiently all rights given it under the laws of the State of Louisiana for the enforcement and collection of such charges.

SECTION 9.11. Competitive Franchises. So long as any of the principal and interest on the Bonds is outstanding and unpaid, the Issuer obligates itself not to grant a franchise to any utility or other person for operation within the boundaries of the Issuer which would render services or facilities similar to those of the Combined Enterprise System, and also obligates itself to oppose the granting of any such franchise by any other public body having jurisdiction over such matters. Further, the Issuer shall maintain its corporate identity and existence as long as any of the Bonds remain outstanding.

SECTION 9.12. Covenants Regarding the Combined Enterprise System. The Issuer hereby covenants and agrees:

- That it shall maintain or cause to be maintained the Combined Enterprise System, and each and every portion thereof, including all additions and improvements adjoining and/or appurtenant thereto, in good operating order and condition, reasonable and ordinary wear and tear alone excepted, and make all necessary repairs thereto, interior and exterior, structural and non-structural, ordinary and extraordinary, foreseen and unforeseen, and otherwise to make all replacements, alterations, improvements and modifications to the Combined Enterprise System necessary to ensure that the same at all times shall be suitable for the efficient operation thereof for the purpose intended;
- That it shall have full and sole responsibility for the condition, repair, replacement, maintenance and management of the Combined Enterprise System;
- That no construction undertakings shall be commenced until the Issuer shall have first procured, so far as the same may be required from time to time, all necessary approvals and authorizations from municipal departments and governmental subdivisions having jurisdiction, and all construction undertakings shall be made and effected promptly and in a good and workmanlike manner and in full compliance with all applicable permits, authorizations and laws and in accordance with all such requirements as insurers of the Combined Enterprise System and all components thereof may reasonably establish;
- That it shall pay, as the same respectively become due, all taxes and assessments, whether general or special, and governmental charges of any kind whatsoever that may at any time be lawfully assessed or levied against or with respect to the Combined Enterprise System. The Issuer shall not allow any part of the Combined Enterprise System to become or remain subjected to any mechanics', laborer's or materialmen's liens of record. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Issuer may, as its own expense and in its own name, contest any item of tax, assessment, liens or other governmental charge and, in the event of such contest, may permit the lien so contested to remain unpaid during the period of such contest and any appeal therefrom unless, in the opinion of rationally recognized bond counsel by nonpayment of any such items the security afforded the Bonds pursuant to the terms of this Bond Ordinance will be materially endangered, in which event such taxes, assessments or charges shall be paid forthwith.
- That it shall comply promptly with all material provisions of present and future laws, ordinances, orders, rules, regulations and requirements of every duly constituted governmental authority or agency and all material orders, rules and regulations of any regulatory, licensing, insurance underwriting or rating organization or other body exercising similar functions. The Issuer shall likewise perform and comply with all duties and obligations of any kind imposed by law, covenant, condition, agreement or easement and the requirements of all policies of insurance at any time in force with respect to the Combined Enterprise System;
- That it shall not use or allow the Combined Enterprise System to be used or occupied for any unlawful purpose or in violation of any private covenant, restrictions, condition, easement or agreement covering or affecting the use of the Combined Enterprise System. The Issuer likewise shall not suffer any act to be done or any condition to exist in the Combined Enterprise System or any article to be brought therein or thereon which may be dangerous, unless safeguarded as required by law, or which, under law, constitutes a nuisance, public or private, or which may make void or voidable any insurance then in force with respect thereto;
- That it shall provide all equipment, furnishings, supplies, facilities, services and personnel required for the proper repair and maintenance of the Combined Enterprise System in an economical and efficient manner, consistent with standards of maintenance generally acceptable for projects of comparable size and scope of operations;
- That it shall take all action, if any, that may be required to obtain such consents, exceptions, exemptions or approvals of governmental authorities as may be necessary to permit it to comply fully with all covenants, stipulations, obligations and agreements of the Issuer contained in this Bond Ordinance; and
- Except as provided herein, nothing in this Bond Ordinance or in the Bonds shall be construed to prevent the Issuer from altering, amending or repealing from time to time as may be necessary any resolution or ordinance setting up and establishing a schedule or schedules of rates and charges for the services and facilities to be rendered by the Combined Enterprise System, said alterations, amendments or repeals to be conditioned upon the continued preservation of the rights of the Owners with respect to the Pledged Revenues, not alone for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds, but to give assurance and insure that the Pledged Revenues shall be sufficient at all times to meet and fulfill the other provisions stated and specified in this Bond Ordinance. It is understood and agreed, however, that the Issuer shall fix and maintain and collect rates and charges for the services and facilities to be rendered by the Combined Enterprise System, irrespective of the user thereof, and that no free service shall be furnished to any Person or even to the Issuer itself.

SECTION 9.13. Bonds Legal Obligations. The Bonds shall constitute legal, binding and valid obligations of the Issuer and shall be the only representations of the indebtedness as herein authorized and created.

SECTION 9.14. Bond Ordinance a Contract. The provisions of this Bond Ordinance shall constitute a contract between the Issuer, or its successor, and the Owners from time to time of the Bonds, and any such Owners may, at law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceedings, enforce and compel the performance of all duties required to be performed by this Governing Authority or the Issuer as a result of issuing the Bonds.

No material modification or amendment of this Bond Ordinance, or any resolution amendatory hereof or supplemental hereto, may be made without consent in writing of the Owners of two-thirds (2/3) of the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds then outstanding; provided, however, that no modification or amendment shall permit a change in the maturity or redemption provisions of the Bonds, or a reduction in the rate of interest thereon, or in the amount of the principal obligation, or affecting the obligation of the Issuer to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds as the same shall come due from the Pledged Revenues pledged and dedicated to the payment thereof by this Bond Ordinance, or the percentage of the owners required to consent to any material modification or amendment of this Bond Ordinance, without the consent of the Owners of the Bonds.

SECTION 9.15. Severability. Application of Subsequently Enacted Laws. In case any one or more of the provisions of this Bond Ordinance or the Bonds shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions of this Bond Ordinance or of the Bonds, but this Bond Ordinance and the Bonds shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provisions had not been contained therein. Any constitutional or statutory provision enacted after the date of this Bond Ordinance which validate or make legal any provision of this Bond Ordinance and/or the Bonds which would not otherwise be valid or legal, shall be deemed to apply to this Bond Ordinance and to the Bonds.

ARTICLE 10 DEFERANCE

SECTION 10.1. Discharge of Bond Ordinance. Discontinuance. If the Issuer shall pay or cause to be paid, or there shall otherwise be paid to the Owner, the principal of and interest on the Bonds, at the times and in the manner stipulated in this Bond Ordinance, then the pledge of the money, securities, and funds pledged under this Bond Ordinance and all covenants, agreements, and other obligations of the Issuer to the Owner shall thereupon cease,

terminate, and become void and be discharged and satisfied, and the Paying Agent shall pay over or deliver all money held by it under this Bond Ordinance to the Issuer.

Bonds or interest installments for the payment of which money shall have been set aside and shall be held in trust (through deposit by the Issuer of funds for such payment or otherwise) at the maturity date thereof shall be deemed to have been paid within the meaning and with expressed above in this Section if they are delivered in the manner provided by Chapter 14 of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended.

ARTICLE 11 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

SECTION 11.1. Successors and Assigns. Wherever in this Bond Ordinance the Issuer is named or referred to, it shall be deemed to include its successors and assigns and all the covenants and agreements in this Bond Ordinance contained or on or behalf of the Issuer shall bind and enure to the benefit of the successors and assigns whether so expressed or not.

SECTION 11.2. Publication. This Bond Ordinance shall be published one time in the official journal of the Issuer.

SECTION 11.3. Headings. The headings of the various sections hereof are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall not control or affect the meaning or construction of any of the provisions hereof.

SECTION 11.4. Effective Date. This Bond Ordinance shall become effective immediately.
