McCarthy rejects Senate plan, shutdown imminent

Speaker won't take up Senate bill despite not having his own

WASHINGTON (AP) — A government shutdown appeared all but inevitable as House Speaker Kevin McCarthy dug in Thursday, vowing he will not take up Senate legislation designed to keep the federal government fully running despite

House Republicans' struggle to unite around an alternative.

Congress is at an impasse just days before a disruptive federal shutdown that would halt paychecks for many of the federal government's roughly 2 million employees, as well as 2 million active-duty military troops and reservists, furlough many of those workers and curtail government services.

But the House and Senate are pursuing different paths to avert those consequences even though time is running out before government funding expires after midnight on Saturday.

The Senate is working toward passage of a bipartisan measure that would fund the government until Nov. 17 as longer-term negotiations continue, while also providing \$6 billion for Ukraine and \$6 billion for

U.S. disaster relief.

The House, meanwhile, has tied up votes on four of the dozen annual spending bills that fund various agencies in hopes that would cajole enough Republicans to support a House-crafted continuing resolution that temporarily funds the government and boosts security at the U.S. border with Mexico. It's a longshot, but McCarthy predicted a deal.

"Put your money on me; we're going to get this done," he said in a CNBC interview. "I think we can work through the weekend. I think we can figure this out."

Lawmakers were already weary from days of late-night negotiating. The strain was evident at McCarthy's closed-door meeting with Republicans Thursday morning, which was

Running to recovery

DUI Court group runs the Jack 15

BROOKINGS — Brookings resident Gordon Opatz says that he was always athletic, but wasn't a "school athlete." When life decisions led him to the Brookings County DUI Court, he was looking for something he could do to both occupy some time and improve his life at the same time.

"I started running for some exercise," Opatz said Saturday, after completing the 15.2 mile 'Jack 15' road race. "That year in May there was a challenge that came out — to run 90 miles in May for veteran's

suicide awareness. I thought that was a good goal; three miles a day is one I thought I could manage." Opatz said although he didn't hit three miles each day, he did complete the 90-mile challenge.

That was the first step in what became an outpouring of support and led eleven people to don blue t-shirts with white 'Recovery Runners' lettering on the front and participate in the run. It was a fitting gesture, as September is National Recovery Month.

The Brookings Drug and DUI Court are part of the seventeen Problem-Solving Courts within the framework of the Unified Judicial System of South Dakota. There are also Mental Health Courts and Veterans Courts.

Participants, if approved, are sentenced to a problem-solving court by a circuit court judge, and begin a treatment program that includes intensive supervision, treatment for substance use disorder and mental health, court appearances, getting a job and maintaining a place to live. In lieu of being incarcerated in the prison system, participants remain in their hometown and earn a living, often with family nearby as support, as they address their addiction.

The Jack 15 is a road race from the small town of White north and east of Brookings, conducted by the Prairie Striders Running Club of Brookings. The racecourse uses county roads and ends at the very recognizable

Man jailed on assault charge

Police used taser on suspect to subdue him

BROOKINGS — A local man is in county jail after he allegedly assaulted another person Wednesday afternoon.

Sean Franklin, 35, was tased and arrested across town from where the alleged assault occurred around 4:45 p.m. Wednesday. He was checked out by medical personnel before being taken to the Brookings County Detention Center, where he remained Thursday in lieu of \$5,000 bond.

Franklin faces charges of aggravated assault, misdemeanor obstruction of a law enforcement officer and violation of probation.

Aggravated assault is a Class 3 felony, with a maximum possible sentence of 15 years in the penitentiary, a \$15,000 fine, or both.

According to the probable cause statement, Franklin and three other people were drinking Wednesday when Franklin became angry with another person. Franklin then allegedly punched the other person, put him in a choke hold and eventually kicked him in the face.

The probable cause statement said the reporting party had significant bruising around his right eye and it was almost completely swollen shut.

Also according to the statement, when law enforcement made contact with Franklin he would not listen to law enforcement commands, and he was subsequently tased.

A portable breath test used on Franklin registered .15.

Franklin is on probation after he pleaded guilty to breaking into a woman's

Ivy Closet still overflowing

Donation surge continues to benefit area residents

BROOKINGS — A massive influx of donations to the Ivy Closet in the wake of a March 1 story in The Brookings Register continues to have ripple effects as autumn arrives.

"The outpouring of support for that was real-

ly incredible," Mary Beth Fishback said. She is the executive director of Brookings Behavioral Health & Wellness, 211 Fourth St., the agency that Ivy Closet belongs to. "We did put a hold on donations for that and we continue to have a hold on that right now."

Yup. You read that correctly — so many donations were received that Ivy Closet continues to prepare and distribute them to community members in need.

Fishback said Ivy Closet did a large, one-day give-away about a month and a half or so ago where more than 150 residents were served. The items arranged rummage sale-style and were given away at no cost.

"We served a large number of individuals in our community that needed those types of support — clothing, shoes, household items, that sort of thing," Fishback noted. "We were able to give away a lot of our

items. Where we're at in the

building project, we're going to keep a hold on taking donations for the time being until we have an appropriate mechanism to store and manage that to be able to continue to serve the community."

The project she mentions is the expansion of the Ivy Center, which houses Brookings Behavioral Health & Wellness. It's set to expand the center from 6,000 square

marked by a tense exchange between the speaker and Rep. Matt Gaetz, R-Fla., according to those in the room.

Gaetz, who has taunted McCarthy for weeks with threats to oust him from his

post, confronted the speaker about conservative online influencers being paid to post negative things about him. McCarthy shot back that he wouldn't waste his time on something like that, Gaetz told reporters as he exited the meeting.

McCarthy's allies left the meeting fuming about Gaetz's tactics.

With his majority splintering, McCarthy is scrambling to come up with a plan for preventing a shutdown and win Republican support. The speaker told

Republicans he would reveal a Republican stopgap plan, known as a continuing resolution or CR, on Friday, according to those in the room, while also trying to force Senate Democrats into giving some concessions.

But with time running

out, many GOP lawmakers were either withholding support for a temporary measure until they had a chance to see it. Others are considering joining Democrats, without McCarthy's support, to bring forward a bill.

feet to roughly 20,000 square feet.

Fishback said they're using two agency-owned homes, to the west of the center, as storage sites for the remaining donations. At some point in the building project, though, those homes are going to have to be cleared out and will no longer be able to serve as storage/giveaway sites for the Ivy Closet.

At the current time, there are no other rummage sale-type events scheduled. Fishback said inventory work is underway to see what's available in order to prioritize appropriate items to give away as summer transitions into fall and winter. These items, she said, include things like outerwear, snow gear and backpacks for children.

In parting, Fishback also pointed out that September is National Suicide Prevention Month.

"Brookings is not immune to these challenges, and I would love for people to know that we're here for support. 988 is the National Suicide and Crisis Lifeline," she said. "If you or someone that you know is having thoughts of suicide, 988 is an available resource to help. We are an available resource to help — call our mainline number, 605-697-2850, 24/7/365 someone will answer the phone. We're here to help you."

campanile on the South Dakota State University Campus. Modest cash prizes are awarded to the top finishers in the race. The run can be done alone or as part of a relay team. Each participant receives a T-shirt and those who run alone receive a medal at the completion of the course.

The race has been held for more than 60 years, making it one of the longest road races in the state. Runners of all skill levels and a handful of walkers test themselves over the 15.2 mile course, cheered on by family and friends who drive ahead and wait for them to pass.

Shouts of "Way to go!" "You got this!" and "You're almost there!" ring out as exhausted runners struggle past. For many, those calls of support keep them plodding toward the finish. It is not hard to draw a parallel between putting one foot in front of the other until the race is finished and working one day at a time to battle an addiction.

For Opatz, the support not only came from those

along the side of the road, but from the ten people who made the commitment to run with him.

Judge Abigail Howard, who oversees the Drug and DUI Courts in both Brookings and Huron, remembers how the challenge began.

"Early on in his program, Gordon had mentioned that the last time he felt good about himself was when he was able to exercise," Judge Howard recalled. "He had previously been active in Crossfit when he was sober and was looking to try to get active again." Howard noted that Opatz had shared with her about how he was trying to meet the challenge for Veterans Suicide Awareness.

"I was so impressed with his conviction that I told him if he stuck with running, I would run a 5K with him." The goal was for the pair to run in the Hobo Day 5K, but when discussion began on the Jack 15, Opatz found that there were others who would willingly lend their support.

Teams formed within the DUI/Drug Court family — one team of participants

in the program, as Opatz is, and another made up of some of the Drug & DUI Court Team professionals who oversee the program, including Judge Howard. While Opatz completed the race on his own, the teams broke the course into five segments, with each team member running at least a 3-mile leg. Several also jumped back in for the final leg, to finish the race with other team members.

They may not have been as vocal, but the support for each other was tangible. Sometimes, that is what it takes.

Gordon struggled with many losses during the program, and with the many ups and downs that come with so much loss," Howard said. She said when that occurs, it is very hard for a participant to build consistency and even harder to remain physically active. Participants must work within the program or face the prospect of being terminated. Howard said Opatz was up for termination twice, but that she decided both times to deny the motion and keep him in the program.

"He has been sober the ENTIRE time he's been in our program," she added. "He simply struggled with creating basic routines and consistency in life to follow through with some of his goals."

Howard and the team noticed a change in Opatz as he entered the final two phases of the program. He was beginning to feel better and build routines.

"Once I saw him get a good handle on a few pieces, I told him we could commit to running the Jack 15," Howard said. Opatz encouraged other participants to join in and trained by himself and with others to prepare for the race. "I also told him that I would start training as well — and I did — to show that we practice what we preach in these programs!" Howard said.

"There is a great deal of support from other participants and those within the program," Opatz said as he relaxed after the race. "Many wouldn't have done this if there wasn't someone egging them on and supporting them. Heck, there are some of the team

members who don't run at all! It is great to see them come out and try, to be supportive."

"To say I am proud of the participants and the Team is an understatement," Judge Howard said, after sprinting the final 50 yards of her leg, the finish of the race. "To have so many participants show up in support of Gordon, and so many Team members rally and agree to run the race with us, felt like a real movement for recovery in our community."

Creating the teams humanizes those struggling with a substance use or alcohol use disorder, and it humanizes the professionals working with these folks Howard said. "It is an honor to work with these programs and get to walk — or in this case run — beside folks on this journey.

And I think if you would ask each of them, although they may have signed up for this race because of Gordon, like I did, they likely each got something much more profound out of the experience as well. It is certainly a memory that I will carry with me forever."

home and assaulting her in February of 2022.

In that case, the charges say that on or about Sept. 19, Franklin entered or remained in an occupied Brookings residence with the intent to commit assault, and that Franklin attempted to induce a fear of death or imminent serious bodily harm to the victim by impeding normal breathing or circulation by applying pressure on the throat or neck, or by blocking the nose and mouth.

Franklin pleaded guilty and his attorney told the court he had gone off his medications for bipolar disorder and admitted issues with alcohol and

drug addiction.

He was sentenced to two five-year prison sentences, to run concurrently. All but 120 days were suspended and Franklin hard served 113 at the time. He was also sentenced to four years probation.

As part of that sentence, Franklin was required to undergo mental health and chemical dependency evaluations, remain on his medication as prescribed throughout his entire probation, and ordered not to consume or be around illegal drugs or alcohol.

Create your own garden soil

The bottom layer of a Hügelkultur garden consists of logs, branches, and fall leaves.

Fall is filled with preparing gardens for the following season, raking leaves, and harvesting. Use plant trimmings and fall leaves to create raised beds and a quality planting mix without disturbing the existing soil. When you minimize or eliminate tilling, you'll increase organic matter in the soil, maintain and over time improve soil health and structure, save water, and boost plant growth.

This no-dig gardening technique employs sheet composting, also known as lasagna gardening, to create planting beds. Plant trimmings are used to create multi-layered beds like you would when building a compost pile. The mixture used is not as precise and you do not turn it like you would a compost pile.

Start your lasagna garden by measuring and marking the garden bed. Edge the outline of the garden bed, if needed, to slow the infiltration of the surrounding grass and weeds. Cut any grass and weeds in this area very short and cover with moist newspaper or cardboard to smother these unwanted plants. The grass, weeds, and paper layer will eventually decompose adding organic matter to the soil.

Sprinkle a layer of compost over the initial layer, if needed.

ed, to hold the newspaper or cardboard in place. Top this with 4 to 10 inches of plant trimmings such as fall leaves, plant-based kitchen scraps, herbicide-free grass clippings, straw, or other similar materials. Sprinkle a low nitrogen, slow-release fertilizer over this layer to feed the microorganisms that will help convert the trimmings to a rich planting mix. Cover with an inch of compost. Repeat the layers, just like making lasagna, until your garden is 18 to 24 inches high.

Fall is a great time to create your beds since you have an abundant supply of the needed ingredients. Or stockpile these ingredients until you have time to build the garden beds. You can plant transplants directly in your lasagna garden bed at the start of the season, even in a freshly built garden bed. Just sprinkle compost or potting mix on top of the beds when planting seeds.

Hügelkultur, or mound gardens, have been used in Germany for many years and take this one step further by placing the garden at a lower elevation and perpendicular to water runoff. The garden can be started in a trench or on the soil surface. Starting the garden below ground captures more stormwater runoff but may require extra tools, equipment or help with digging.

The garden can be any size and height depending on the available materials and your gardening goals. The sides can be steep or more gently sloped which reduces the risk of freshly planted seeds washing out during rainfall.

The bottom layer is made of logs, branches, and fall leaves. Do not include black walnut, which is toxic to many plants, or cedar and black locust which are very slow to decompose. The rotting logs and branches absorb water, making it available to the plants in the garden. As the tree trimmings decompose, they add nutrients to the soil. Research and experience show these woody plant materials do not deprive plants of needed nitrogen. Instead, it will provide the plants with needed nutrients for five to ten or more years.

Next, add the layers of a lasagna garden atop the bottom layer. Then top it all off with several inches of soil.

You can also use these methods to create the planting mix needed to fill raised bed structures. Not only will you save money, but you will put landscape trimmings to work, creating a quality planting mix for growing your favorite vegetables and flowers.

These beds gradually settle but the benefits remain. Add compost or repeat the sheet composting process as needed to maintain the desired depth.

Building a healthy soil foundation is a long-term solution to growing productive gardens with fewer pest problems that require less ongoing maintenance.

SDSU volleyball falls in long awaited home opener

BROOKINGS - After playing its first 14 games on the road, the South Dakota State volleyball team finally had its home opener on Thursday night as the Jackrabbits hosted Denver. Unfortunately for SDSU, the Pioneers spoiled the Jacks homecoming as they defeated SDSU in four sets.

The Jacks had to play their first 14 games on the road because of renovations that are being made to Frost Arena. SDSU lost the first set 25-21 and then bounced back with a 25-21 win in set two. The Jacks then lost the final two sets each by the score of 25-23.

SDSU fell to 3-12 on the season and are now 1-2 in Summit League play. Jackrabbit head coach Dan Georgalas said the first 14 games on the road were challenging, but he likes how his players are not hanging their heads after the tough start to the season.

"It was brutal. I mean 14 games on the road has to be the most in the country to start this year and that's on me. We can certainly blame the arena [renovations], but we wanted to challenge this team. We have a lot of youth and a lot of new pieces in our system. We have a lot of injuries. Our best lineup is not in there right now, but our team is believing and they're fighting to the end. You see these close scores and how close the statistics are. There are just

some controllable things that we need to keep improving on in practice to make that two-point difference at the end."

SDSU led 14-11 in the first set and Denver then scored three straight points to tie the set. The Pioneers (4-7, 3-0) then went on a 9-3 run to go up 23-17 and eventually took a 1-0 lead with a 25-21 victory.

The Jacks then jumped out to a 7-5 lead in the second set and would go on a 6-0 run to make it 13-5. Denver scored five straight points to cut the lead to three but the Jacks stood tall and 21-17 later in the set. They would then close out the set and pull even with a 25-21 victory.

SDSU then led 5-0 and 8-3 in the third set. Denver fought its way back and tied the set at 13-13. The Jacks then led 20-18 but Denver scored seven of the next 10 points and would go up 2-1 with a 25-23 win in set three.

Georgalas said his team failed to keep its composure when Denver went on a couple runs.

"I think we started up 8-3 and 5-0 in that set and that's just kind of the funny way that volleyball works. It's a game of momentum and runs and we didn't do a good enough job of withstanding their push back at us and their response. There were some lapses in side out that we just have to get to the film [and look at it]. Us coaches, we have to do a better job of figuring out, if we start strong like that, we need to withstand it and

come out on top in the end," Georgalas said.

Set four was a back-and-forth affair. SDSU led 22-20 but Denver scored four straight to set up a match point scenario. SDSU was able to score one point but it wasn't enough and the Pioneers won the match with a 25-23 victory in set four.

The stat that stood out for Georgalas after the match was errors. Each team had 27 errors, but 20 of those errors for the Jacks came on either their own serves or on Denver serves.

"For us, I think terminal serving is the area where [Denver] beat us. And there's not many [areas they beat us]. This was a game where both teams were sloppy and high error. But we had 11 service errors and nine receptions errors. So, 20 errors on the first contact there for us and I think that was the phase of the game where they did better than we did," Georgalas said.

The Jacks were led by Katie Van Egdom who had 17 kills and seven digs. Rylee Martin had 14 digs and Stella Winterfeld had 13 digs. Sydnie Schetnan had nine kills, six digs and four blocks. Elyse Winter had six kills and six digs. Raegen Reilly 38 assists and Sylvie Zgong had nine kills.

Denver was led by Cadi Boyer who had 12 kills and four blocks. Cassie Davis had nine kills and nine digs. Molly Mirabelli had 10 kills and Gianna Bartalo had 15 digs. Alayna Finucan had 10 digs and Briley Decker had

42 assists. Ava Reynolds had nine kills and Ryan Wilkens had eight digs.

SDSU was without its top returner heading into the season in sophomore outside hitter in Mesa Scheierman and its only senior in Akeela Jefferson. Georgalas said it's tough because his team is young, but he believes they are showing signs of winning volleyball and eventually things will come together for SDSU.

"We have to keep siding and figuring out how to get net zero's in serve receive," he said. "We feel like that's a consistent theme for us. Again, it's just youth. We have a freshman libero, a freshman sixth rotation outside, our other outside is a sophomore, our other outside is a transfer who's never played for us, we have a freshman middle and a freshman defensive specialist. I mean, we just have so many pieces and are going through a lot of growing pains. I just think our team has a lot of resiliency and we keep growing from match to match. We haven't gotten to hang a lot of wins in the win column as we have liked, but it's not because we aren't good. We're just going through some growing pains and it's going to pay off eventually."

SDSU will continue conference play at home next week as the Jacks host North Dakota State on Thursday at 7 p.m. and play Omaha in Brookings on Saturday at 1 p.m.


Jocelyn Tanner saved all of them.

Lions take down Packers in Lambeau

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — David Montgomery never beat the Green Bay Packers during his four seasons with the Chicago Bears.

Now with a different NFC North team, Montgomery made the most of his new situation and helped the Detroit Lions take early command of the division with a 34-20 victory at Lambeau Field on Thursday night.

Montgomery carried the ball 32 times after sitting out the Lions' victory over the Atlanta Falcons on Sunday with a thigh bruise. He became the first Lion to rush for three touchdowns at Green Bay and the first Detroit player to top 100 yards rushing with three TDs since James Stewart in 2000.

"He was ballin'," Lions receiver Amon-Ra St. Brown said. "We can count on him whenever. Give him the ball, he's going to make something happen."

The Lions (3-1) beat the Packers (2-2) for a fourth straight time, a streak that also includes the final game of last season, when Detroit denied Green Bay a playoff spot in Aaron Rodgers' last game with the Packers.

Detroit has built on the momentum from that season-ending victory by getting off to a fast start this year that now includes road victories over the Packers and the reigning Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs.

"Send us anywhere, line us up against anyone and we feel like we can go in there and beat them," said Lions quarterback Jared Goff, who went 19 of 28 for 210 yards with a touchdown and an interception. "That's a good feeling to have."

Rodgers' replacement, Jordan Love, threw for a touchdown and ran for another as he tried to rally the Packers in the second half. He finished 23 of 36 for 246 yards

and was picked off twice by Jerry Jacobs.

Detroit led 27-3 at halftime and had outgained Green Bay 284 yards to 21 as the half ended with boos from the crowd. It was the Lions' highest-scoring first half against the Packers in the series' 188-game history.

The Packers had staged an improbable rally five days earlier, trailing New Orleans 17-0 before scoring 18 points in the final 11 minutes for a one-point victory.

Green Bay faced a halftime deficit of at least 17 points in back-to-back weeks for the first time in franchise history. This time, it was too much to overcome.

Jayden Reed ended the third quarter with a 44-yard catch that set up Love's 9-yard touchdown run with 14:52 left in the game to make it 27-17.

Detroit responded with a 14-play, 75-yard drive, capped by Montgomery's 1-yard touchdown run on fourth-and-goal, that took nearly nine minutes off the clock and put the game away.

The Lions were prepared to settle for a 30-yard field goal that would have kept it as a two-score game, but they got a first down when Green Bay's Quay Walker received an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty for running forward and leaping across the line in an attempt to block the kick.

Goff's 24-yard touchdown pass to a wide-open St. Brown put the Lions ahead for good. Montgomery scored on runs of 3 and 2 yards, while Riley Patterson kicked field goals of 33 and 37 yards.

The second quarter was nearly halfway over and the Lions already led 24-3 when the Packers finally got their initial first down thanks to a Detroit penalty. The Packers didn't get a first down on their own merits until 7 seconds remained before halftime.

Flandreau outlasts Sioux Valley in five sets

VOLGA - The Flandreau Fliers moved one step closer to clinching a winning season and avenged an early loss in the Big East Conference Tournament as they defeated Sioux Valley in five sets at the Cossack Center on Thursday night.

The win helped Flandreau improve to 13-8 on the season and also marked a measure of revenge after the Fliers fell to the Cossacks in three sets back on Sept. 9.

"It was very exciting," Flandreau head coach Julia Fargen said of the win. "Especially since we lost to them during the conference tournament, it was a big win for us."

The Fliers' path to victory wasn't a clear one as the Cossacks got off to a strong start. Sioux Valley started the match by jumping out to a 7-1 lead and used that advantage to pick up a 25-20 win in the first set.

"We had a lot of confidence in our game plan and what we were going to do in the first set," Sioux Valley head coach Jill Vincent said. "To their credit, they made a few more errors than they usually do but we were really on point and were attacking the ball."

Fargen also credited the Cossacks' quickness which made it tough for

the Fliers to get a read defensively in the opening set.

"They're very quick and our defense was working hard to get to that short stuff," Fargen said. "Basically we learned that we win when we swing, so as soon as we got our offense tolling, I felt confident that we would get them."

That process started to happen for the Fliers at the beginning of the second set as they jumped out to a 13-9 lead but the Cossacks rallied to take a 14-13 lead before both teams went back and forth.

Flandreau jumped back in the lead with a 21-20 lead late in the set before tying the match with a 25-22 victory and that momentum carried over to the fourth set as the Cossacks struggled to communicate and dropped the third set 25-21.

"Sometimes when we make a mistake, we just don't talk on the next ball," Vincent explained. "That really kills us sometimes so we need to move on faster from that and be able to bounce back."

The Cossacks were able to regroup for the fourth set thanks to an increased presence at the net by outside hitter Kaedyn Sapp (20 kills) and middle

hitter Adison Renkly (12 kills) and Sioux Valley's passing also picked up during a 25-17 victory in

the fourth set. The Fliers and Cossacks were tied at 4-4 early in the final frame but Flandreau rallied for four straight points and was able to win the fifth set 15-11 to secure the victory.

"Consistency is something we struggle with, but we know we want that W, we're going to fight really hard for it," Fargen said. "It's an awesome team to coach and I knew when we hit that fifth set we were going to get [the win]."

Lizzie Pavlis led the Fliers with a team-high 16 kills while Claire Sheppard had 15 kills, Sadie Iott had 10 kills, Abby Schoeberl had eight kills and Lily Klein had five kills.

Schoeberl led Flandreau with 42 assists while Iotta had four aces. Sheppard and Klien also had one ace each.

Klein had 27 digs while Addy Hammer had 17 digs, Hayden Neises had 12 digs, Schoeberl had 10 digs, Sheppard had seven digs and Iotta had five digs.

Pavlis led Flandreau with nine blocks, Schoeberl had five blocks and Sheppard had three blocks.

Allie Hofer had 12 kills in the loss for Sioux Valley while Keyra Kruse had five kills. Sunny Hesby had 30 assists while Machaela Gerasch had 19 assists. Sapp had 26 digs,

Hofer and Renkly had nine digs and Gerasch had eight digs. Emma Gorvin and Caitlin Russell had five digs each.

Renkly had nine blocks while Keyra Kruse had five blocks and Hofer had three blocks. Gerasch had four aces while Hesby, Allie and Renkly had one ace each.

For the Cossacks, the loss dropped them to 12-7 on the season but Vincent has still seen improvement in how they've played throughout the season.

"Anytime we step on the court, we get better," Vincent said. "We try different things. We have to keep mixing it up. Everyone needs to be able to kill the ball and hopefully, we can find the confidence to that."

Meanwhile, the Fliers improved to 13-8 on the season and closed out a busy week after defeating Deuel in three sets on Monday night and falling to Elkton-Lake Benton on Tuesday night. By winning two out of three matches, the Fliers are closing in on one of their goals to end the year with a winning record.

"It's been a long time since we've had a winning season," Fargen said. "We've played some big games this week and I'm just feeling good because a winning season is exciting for us."

Harry S. Truman said, "I have found the best way to give advice to your children is to find out what they want and then advise them to do it."

This deal isn't child's play. South and West must pay close attention to the spot cards.

If everyone plays perfectly, what is the result in six spades doubled after West leads a top heart?

South ruffed the opening lead low and cashed the spade ace. He wasn't surprised when East discarded the club ace. Now South led the spade seven and finessed dummy's nine. Next came a successful diamond finesse. South cashed the spade king, led his last spade to dummy's

queen and finessed again in diamonds. He cashed the diamond ace, then announced he would run the rest of the diamonds before conceding a club at trick 13. Six spades doubled and made, but how many errors were committed?

The answer is two. West's error was easier to avoid. When declarer led the spade seven at trick three, West should have put in the jack.

He knew declarer was left with the K-10-7 of spades. So, by inserting the jack, he could reduce the dummy's entries to one. South would be unable to bring in the diamond suit without loss and would go down.

However, declarer could avoid this fate. Just in case West had all four spades, South should have ruffed the



I.

Dacotah Bank Center Advisory Committee

Sec. 2-180. Established.

There is hereby established in and for the city, a Dacotah Bank Center Advisory Committee to act in an advisory capacity to the city council concerning the Dacotah Bank Center.

Sec. 2-181. Composition, appointment and initial terms.

The Dacotah Bank Center Advisory Committee shall be composed of seven (7) members selected as follows: five (5) persons shall be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the city council, with one (1) additional person from South Dakota State University and one (1) additional person recommended by the Visit Brookings Board also appointed by the Mayor, subject to the advice and consent of the City Council.

Sec. 2-182. Compensation; terms, vacancies.

a. The members of the Dacotah Bank Center Advisory Committee shall serve without compensation.

b. All terms after the initial appointment shall be staggered three (3) year terms. The initial terms shall be established based on the current terms of the Brookings Event Center, Inc. Each person who is a member of the initial Dacotah Bank Center Advisory Committee may be re-appointed for an additional three (3) year term.

c. If a member resigns or is disqualified prior to the end of their term, the mayor, with the advice and consent of the city council or Visit Brookings, as the case may be, shall appoint a new member to complete the resigning member's term.

d. If a member shall miss more than 50 percent of the meetings annually without authorization of the committee, they shall automatically be disqualified from serving on the committee, and a replacement shall be appointed.

Sec. 2-183. Quorum, action, liaison representatives.

A majority of the Dacotah Bank Center Advisory Committee shall constitute a quorum and it shall be necessary that all official action of the Dacotah Bank Center Advisory Committee.

In addition, the city council of the City of Brookings may appoint a representative as a non-voting liaison to the Dacotah Bank Center Advisory Committee.

Sec. 2-184. Meetings.

The Dacotah Bank Center Advisory Committee shall hold meetings at a time and place to be designated by the Dacotah Bank Center Advisory Committee.

Special meetings may be called at any time by the chairperson or by a majority of the Dacotah Bank Center Advisory Committee by giving 24 hours' advance notice to the public and other members of such committee.

Notice of a special meeting shall be given a minimum of 24 hours prior to meeting time and shall state the reason for requesting the special meeting.

Only business stated as the reason for calling a special meeting shall be transacted.

Sec. 2-185. Officers.

The Dacotah Bank Center Advisory Committee shall annually elect from its number a chairperson and vice-chairperson, each of whom shall hold their office respectively for one year and until their successors have been elected from their number.

Sec. 2-186. Duties of the chairperson.

The chairperson shall preside over all meetings and, as appropriate, make committee or special assignment appointments.

The chairperson shall be kept advised of the general affairs of the Dacotah Bank Center and monitor the implementation of resolutions and policies with appropriate procedures.

The chairperson shall have other usual powers and duties customarily vested in the

Biden intentionally has created a crisis

■ The administration continues to allow illegal immigrants cross the border.

try — and remember, in a long-ago era, when Barack Obama was president, a tenth of that was considered a crisis.

The current emergency can be attributed entirely to President Joe Biden. In word and deed, from the 2020 campaign on, Biden sent a message to would-be illegal border crossers around the world: If you come to the United States, you will be allowed to stay. And millions have.

Lately, though, Biden's welcome-to-illegal-crossers policy has become a burden on some important Democrats. New York City Mayor Eric Adams is screaming about the arrival of an estimated 110,000 new asylum seekers in his city. The cost of caring for the new residents will "destroy New York City," Adams said. And even though Adams tried to blame Texas Republican Gov. Greg Abbott for sending illegal border crossers to New York, the fact is that Abbott has sent just 13,000. In any event, the presence of all 110,000 in New York is the result of Biden policies.

Now that some Democrats are complaining, news reports say Biden is beginning to feel some pressure. Can

he do something to lower the heat? In response, Biden has come up with a way to address the problem: Rush more inadmissible migrants into the United States.

It seems crazy, and it is. But it is more than that. It is also perhaps the best indicator we have of Biden's intentions in the border crisis. Look at the 10,000-a-day flow of illegal crossers over the border. The president of the United States has the authority and means to protect the U.S. border. The only way a president would allow this to go on for years is if the president wanted this to happen. And it appears that Biden does, in fact, want this to happen.

Early in the border crisis, I wrote, "The president is not trying to stop the flow of illegal crossers. Instead, he is trying to accommodate the flow, scrambling to find housing and living arrangements for those coming in. The message has gotten out to the world, and the world is coming."

And now Biden is going one step further. With the flow at historic levels, he will use U.S. government resources to speed it up, not to slow it down. This is an entirely intentional crisis.

The New York Times reports that nearly half a million migrants from Venezuela will "be allowed to immediately apply for work authorization." The purpose of the move, the Times said, is this: "By allowing them to legally earn income, the change could alleviate the costly burden of housing the refugees in major cities across the country. The migrants also will be protected from deportation for at least the next 18 months."

Maybe that will mollify Mayor Adams for a while. It will certainly increase the incentive for Venezuelans to come to the U.S. as soon as possible. But how, one might ask, did the migrants arrive in the United States from Venezuela in the first place? The answer lies with a Biden administration program known as CBP One. It is what is called a "parole" program, that is, it is designed to release migrants into the United States quickly and without public scrutiny. This is from the Center for Immigration Studies: "A little-known part of the Biden administration's CBP One parole program permits inadmissible aliens to make an appointment to fly directly to airports in the interior of the United States, bypassing the border altogether."

The Biden program "allows migrants to take commercial passenger flights from foreign countries straight to their American cities of choice." The program

applies to migrants from Venezuela, Cuba, Nicaragua and Haiti. The migrants, according to the Center, "request 'advance travel authorizations' through the CBP One mobile app and take commercial flights (at their own expense) directly into U.S. airports, where U.S. Customs officers parole them into the nation, sight unseen, and in numbers publicly unknown."

The numbers are big. Through the Freedom of Information Act, the Center for Immigration Studies, which supports stricter immigration laws, got information on the flights so far in 2023. The administration has allowed in 221,456 migrants through the program this year. There were 29,120 in May, 29,506 in June, 28,669 in August, and so on. The flow continues.

Where are they going? The administration would not disclose which airports have received the migrants. If any local leaders want to know how thousands of new people are arriving in their towns virtually overnight, courtesy of the U.S. government — well, if they want to know that, they can't find out.

Now the White House is offering immediate work authorization, not just to migrants who crossed the land border illegally but to those who took part in the administration's secretive flight program. That will surely lure more to come, whether by foot over the border or to an undisclosed airport.

If you ever hear an administration official say that President Biden is trying to get the border situation under control — don't believe it.

GOP created — and must clean up — shutdown mess

Even Speaker Kevin McCarthy acknowledges the threats from far-right Republican representatives. Programs in Minnesota are at risk.

At first glance, the unnecessary, unwanted federal government shutdown that could begin Sunday may seem to be yet another manifestation of Republican-Democrat, conservative-liberal congressional dysfunction. But it's really the result of a band of about 20 extremist House Republicans (egged on by former President Donald Trump) holding the institution — and the nation — hostage.

That's not just the professional assessment of political scientists, or even Democrats. It's apparent to no less an expert than Republican House Speaker Kevin McCarthy, who told the New York Times that "This is a whole new concept of individuals that just want to burn the whole place down."

So it's now up to McCarthy and what passes nowadays as ostensibly more mainstream Republican representatives to play firefighter on this crisis, and on a longer-term basis take the matches away from the likes of Florida's Matt Gaetz, Colorado's Lauren Boebert and Virginia's Bob Good, who told the Times that "Most of what Congress does is not good for the American people."

Really? Tell that to those defending our nation at home or abroad, whether they wear a military uniform or hospital scrubs. Or the millions of senior citizens who earned, or are depending on, federal benefits such as Social Security or Medicare. Or families depending on nutritional assistance programs like SNAP for their children — who the GOP has long claimed to champion. Or the many Minnesotans who benefit from the \$39.5 billion over the next biennium for state-administered, federally funded programs. Congress has done "good" for all them, and the arsonists impersonating representatives shouldn't

be allowed to show such nihilism toward government and the country.

In Minnesota, the impact of a shutdown would be felt most immediately in terms of furloughed federal workers who may struggle to pay their mortgages and other bills. While previously received grants would keep cuts at bay for now for some programs, others might face an immediate hit — including, according to U.S. Department of Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack, the Women, Infants & Children nutritional program. "If we have a shutdown, WIC shuts down," Vilsack said at a Monday White House briefing. "And that means nutrition assistance to those moms and children shuts down."

What "we know right now is, the longer a shutdown lasts, the greater the impact to state programs and services will be," Patrick Hogan, director of communications for Minnesota Management and Budget, told an editorial writer in an email exchange. "Our focus is on minimizing impacts to Minnesotans where we can."

While Democrats have a group of more left-wing supporters, the so-called "Squad" did not shut down the federal government even though then-House Speaker Nancy Pelosi also had a narrow governing margin. "Her skill at keeping different factions within the Democratic Party together was extraordinary," Kathryn Pearson, a professor of political science at the University of Minnesota, told an editorial writer.

Pearson, an expert on Congress, added that "the extent to which some Republicans are willing to prevent their party and then ultimately the institution and ultimately the government from fulfilling their role, which is to pass the 12 appropriation bills to keep the government open, is really astounding."

As Pearson rightly described, "this is a new extreme, but the dynamic is not new." GOP leaders must be willing to work with the remaining rational members of their party as well as across the aisle with Democrats to keep the government running. They took an oath to serve the country, not the party, after all. To date, in order to avoid the shutdown and secure McCarthy the speakership (after 15 rounds of voting), it's been nothing but concessions, including an impeachment inquiry of President Joe Biden not based on evidence but rather in an attempt to find it — a gross abuse of the gravest action the legislative

branch can take against the executive branch.

Deflecting blame to Democrats is not the answer. Just ask Gaetz, who recently told Fox News: "We will have a government shutdown, and it is absolutely Speaker McCarthy's fault. We cannot blame Joe Biden for not having moved our individual spending bills. We cannot blame House Democrats. We can't even blame Chuck Schumer in the Senate."

Indeed, the Republican caucus caused this crisis, and thus must solve it. Temporarily, to avoid a shutdown on Sunday, and permanently, to avoid this tyranny of the minority from further hurting the country.

Funeral services were held at Batesland, SD, on Sept. 23, and burial was at the Knight Family Cemetery near Batesland. Doris was a force for change and an inspiration to all who had the privilege of knowing her.

In her early years, Doris joined a convent, and she worked at Holy Rosary Mission, where she was a greatly appreciated high school typing teacher and a volleyball coach. Having left the convent, Doris's career in journalism began in 1981, when she co-founded The Lakota Times. Her vision and determination shone brightly there until 1986, when she made the decision to pursue her Bachelor of Science in Journalism at South Dakota State University. She was a devoted mother of two young children, but also passionately committed to her pursuit of knowledge and excellence.

After completing her undergraduate degree in journalism, Doris went on to the University of Kansas, where she obtained her Master's Degree in 1992. Having increased her expertise and having further pursued her passion for storytelling, Doris returned to Brookings to become a member of the SDSU Journalism Department. At SDSU, Doris soon became an admired and respected professor, always having an enduring impact on her students and her

colleagues.

As director of the South Dakota High School Press Association, she recognized the importance of providing opportunities for Native American students and helped them feel at home in a new environment. She dedicated herself to breaking down barriers and bridging cultural gaps, and she was remarkably successful. Doris's dedication to promoting diversity in scholastic media programs earned her numerous accolades and distinctions. For example, in 2009, she was awarded First Place by the Association for Education in Journalism and Mass Communications for her innovative journalism program titled "High School Journalism for South Dakota Indian Students."

Her commitment to giving tribal stories prominence in the curriculum ensured that indigenous students found representation and validation. Beyond her work in the classroom, Doris extended her advocacy to the larger community. She was recognized with the Dorothy and Eugene T. Butler Human Rights Award in 2017 for her unwavering commitment to fighting for the rights of Native Americans in South Dakota. Her passionate spirit was also exemplified through her involvement with groups such as the Brookings Reconciliation Council and SDSU's Native American Advisory Committee, where she continued to champion social and political causes affecting tribal communities. While Doris poured her heart into her professional endeavors, she also cherished her personal life. She found solace and joy in her hobbies of quilting, gardening, crocheting, and baking — her culinary skills were renowned among her loved ones. She was a devoted fan of SDSU's men's and women's basketball teams, and she was also always a Jayhawks fan as well. Doris's greatest love was spending time with her beloved granddaughter, Juneau.

Doris is survived by her daughter, Marie Giago of Lawrence, KS; her son, Timothy Giago of Brookings, SD; her siblings, Dennis Brewer of Pine Ridge, SD, and Richard Brewer of Tulsa, OK; her grandchild, Juneau Gallagher of Lawrence, KS, and many other relatives and friends.

Doris was preceded in death by her parents, David O. and Barbara P. (O'Rourke) Brewer; her sisters, Colleen M. Brewer and Judith E. Clifford; and her brothers, David L. Brewer, Charles "Dean" Brewer, Duane Brewer, Sr. and Delmar "Fudd" Brewer.
