## Sheriff Addresses ESH Family Community Council



Spink County Sheriff Frank Krumm was the guest speaker at the Eastern Star Home Family Community Council Meeting held on Thursday evening, March 16, 2023. Approximately 25 residents and family members representing the nursing home, assisted living unit and independent apartments attended this regular quarterly meeting of the group.

Sheriff Krumm's main message to those present focused on how senior citizens can protect themselves from fraud and scammers who attempt to contact them via the mail, telephone and internet. Krumm encouraged everyone to feel free to contact the Sheriff's Office anytime they are contacted with suspicious requests. He advised to never give out personal information such as Social Security numbers and bank account numbers over the phone, online or through the mail.

Krumm also updated those present regarding the main duties of the Sheriff and his staff, the general budget of the office and some of the challenges encountered by his staff. He invited and encouraged individuals and their families to tour the new facilities located adjacent to the Spink County Court House.

A business meeting followed Sheriff Krumm's most interesting presentation. 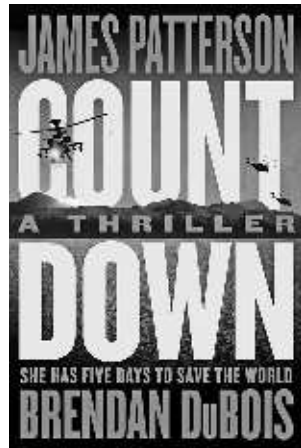

## “Tourist Town”

The Postscript by Carrie Classon  
My husband, Peter, and I are staying in San Miguel de Allende, Mexico, which is, according to a lot of folks, a tourist town. Sometimes, the person saying this means it is not a place they would want to spend time. This puzzles me. I’m not sure why a town known for meatpacking or manufacturing would be a better place to spend time than a town known for tourism. But I respect anyone’s right to spend time wherever they want, and Peter and I are happy in San Miguel, in large part because it is a tourist town. A lot of the tourists are from the United States. A surprising number are from Canada.

“Is there anyone left up there in the winter?” I asked a Canadian visitor I met at the writers’ conference last week. There were more Canadians in the audience than folks from the U.S. and Mexico combined. I found this astonishing, considering that all of Canada has only as many people as Mexico City. “Did you leave someone up there to turn off the lights?” I asked. But more common than either Canadians or Americans are, of course, the Mexican tourists who come to town to enjoy the year-round festivities of San Miguel. There is always a party of some sort going on. There is music in the streets, religious celebrations, parades of zombies, costumed indigenous dancers, fireworks and

giant puppets—amazing surprises that appear every day, surprises that appear as if by magic. And there’s no mistaking Mexican tourists for their northern counterparts. U.S. tourists tend to look as if they are braced for calamity. They constantly refer to their maps. They wear sunscreen under their oversized hats, have trousers filled with zippered pockets, secret money belts and hiding places for their passports. They wear shoes intended for hiking up mountains and carry water in case they should make a wrong turn at the ice cream shop and inadvertently end up marooned in the desert. Mexican tourists are always better dressed, often in high heels, and never lost. They wear sequins and carry small dogs and, even when I don’t know what they are saying, I can hear them using a lot of exclamation points to say it. Mexicans do not take photos of the sights, but of one another, smiling

broadly, and usually holding their small dogs. They zip in on Friday nights and start partying immediately, hiring the mariachi bands to play songs they love and lining up at restaurants to have their favorite meals. The U.S. tourists generally look less cheerful. They are also older. I noticed, on a rare occasion that a store advertised in English, the sign read, “Spare parts for crutches, wheelchairs and walking sticks.” Clearly, they knew their market. Mexican tourists would be unlikely to need any of the above, despite the high heels, and would be more inclined to buy festive costumes for their tiny dogs. By Monday morning, most of the Mexican tourists are gone, leaving only traces of confetti on the cobblestones, which the street cleaners work diligently to remove until they are, again, pristine and ready for the next party. I’m trying to learn

from the Mexican tourists. I’m trying to remember to smile at strangers and worry less about falling on the cobblestones (even if I keep wearing practical shoes). I’m trying to put a little more glitter in my life and a few more sequins. Being prepared for an emergency is a good thing, of course. But being prepared for a party is

every bit as important. Till next time, Carrie

## Johnson Leads Work Requirements Fight in the U.S. House

The America Works Act closes loophole states have used to ignore existing work requirements

Washington, D.C. – Today, U.S. Representative Dusty Johnson (R-S.D.) introduced the America Works Act, a bill to reform work requirements for able-bodied Americans receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits. Current federal law requires Able Bodied Adults Without Dependents (ABAWDs) younger than 49 years old on SNAP to participate in work, training, or education for 20 hours a week.

Currently, 18 states utilize waivers to exempt individuals from work requirements. Unfortunately, many states abuse these waivers and ignore work requirements for ABAWDs. Johnson's bill would close the loophole allowing those waivers. According to data prior to the pandemic, 1.36 million ABAWD households reported zero dollars in gross income – meaning they did not work at all.

“Work is the best pathway out of poverty,” said Johnson. “Work requirements have proven to be effective, and people who can work should work. With more than 11 million open jobs, there are plenty of opportunities for SNAP recipients to escape poverty and build a better life.”

The America Works Act of 2023:

- Emphasizes and amends work requirements for Able Bodied Adults Without Dependents (ABAWDs) requiring childless adults, unless exempted, to work or participate in work-related training or education, for at least 20 hours per week in order to receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits.
  - o This bill maintains current law which states that ABAWDs are subject to a three-month limit of SNAP benefits unless they work 80 hours per month.
- Raises the age limits of an ABAWD from 18 to 49 to 18 to 65, consistent with the age individuals become eligible for Medicare.



Before my junior year in high school, I returned from a Boy Scout canoeing trip to discover my sister had been killed in a car crash. I will never forget the sadness of the moment when I walked into the house that was filled with what seemed like half the caring and wonderful town of De Smet to find my mom and dad there grieving. It was near the end of that summer, but the beginning of a long period of mourning for my family and me.

There were lessons that came to me after my sister's death. I realized how important support from a community could

be. Consolation came from our friends, neighbors, church community, as well as people we barely knew. It seemed more about their presence and not their words. I noticed there were people who had trouble themselves dealing with such loss, and they sort of disappeared.

Also, I realized that a funeral is not exactly a time of closure for a family, but really just the beginning of a time to accept reality and forge ahead with the difficult changes that life can and does deal out. It took me years to think about my sister and relish in her memory rather than cringe from the pain of the loss. In that sense, I know I will never have closure and that's good.

## What do you say?

Some 14 years after her death, while I was on the faculty of a medical school in Georgia, I found myself having to advise medical students how to talk to patients or family about sad news. I reviewed the medical literature on the subject at the time and concluded that there is no right way to do it except to be 100 percent honest and to say whatever is needed with compassion.

Through the years those guidelines have sustained me while I have had the burden of sharing awful news.

Bottom line, it is being there, more than words that consoles. Never worry about what to say, just show up, be honest, and care.

Richard P. Holm, MD passed away in March of 2020 after a battle with pancreatic cancer. 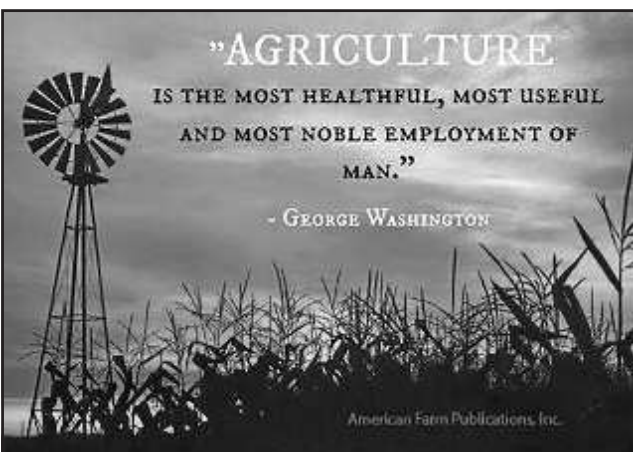

## “The Farcical Scam called HB1137”

Many years before becoming a pastor, I graduated from SDSU with an undergraduate degree in Commercial Economics. But you don't need to have a degree in Economics to know that the current tax bill (which is awaiting a prospective signature from our governor) is a total scam. What began as a grassroots effort to help the poorest within our communities to weather this difficult period of high inflation through the elimination of the sales tax on groceries, has morphed into HB1137, a meaningless farce of a general tax cut. And calling it a tax cut is also disingenuous and cynical, because the language in the bill causes it to expire in four years. If you haven't been paying attention to the specifics, this bill that has now passed the SD House and Senate and is waiting for Kristi Noem to either sign it, veto it, or leave it unsigned, where it would still become law. The original intent of this movement to eliminate the sales tax on groceries, was to make a real difference in the proportion of South Dakotan's income which is spent on groceries. Of course, groceries are unlike

most other products or services we purchase. We can decide whether or not we want to purchase most other products or services (especially luxury items) but we all as humans must eat. We don't have a choice. The only thing we have a choice in, is how much we eat out at restaurants, versus how much we eat at home using the groceries we have purchased. Typically, the poorest within our communities spend a greater percentage of their income on groceries, because they can't afford to eat out as often as wealthier folks do. So the elimination of just the state sales tax on food would have amounted to \$4.50 per hundred dollars spent on groceries. However, if there was a total elimination of county and municipal taxes as well, that amount would have been \$6.50 per hundred dollars of groceries. That would have been a REAL savings that would have benefited all South Dakotans, but especially those with lower incomes. But now what does HB1137 do if it becomes law? It will change the overall state sales tax from 4.5% to 4.2%, saving us a whopping 30 cents per

hundred dollars spent on groceries, along with every other product and service purchased in SD. To put that in perspective, if a person wanted to buy a \$5,000 diamond ring for an engagement or a gift, under this new bill they would save a total of \$15. Oh Boy!!! Like anyone would even notice or care about that difference. In contrast, saving almost half that amount, \$6.50 per hundred dollars worth of groceries, would actually be a HUGE deal! So once again we can't trust the SD legislature to do the right thing for the right reason. Therefore, we will have to take things into our own hands as citizens. There is already discussion of creating an initiative to be put on the ballot in 2024 for all South Dakotans to vote on entirely repealing the sales tax on groceries. If it comes to that, I'm confident that we as citizens will do the right thing (as 37 other states already have) in eliminating this onerous sales tax on food which disproportionately affects and hurts the poor. ## Tightening SNAP Work Requirements Lift Americans Out of Poverty and Away from Dependence

I was that kid on food stamps—I know firsthand how government assistance can both help and hurt. Education, training, and work provide dignity and economic opportunity. Too many Americans are on the sidelines while we are facing a record labor shortage.

We have the jobs, but we don't have the people to fill them. There is no one-size-fits-all solution to this problem, but there are policy areas where government is hurting, rather than helping Americans re-enter the

workforce.

During the peak of the COVID-19 pandemic, the federal government waived all existing work requirements for government assistance programs like the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). In the fog of war, this made sense. Government was right to not stand in the way of getting food benefits to Americans who lost their jobs because of the pandemic—quickly.

However, we are three years removed from 2020 and these blanket waivers have gone on far too long. Long before the pandemic, work requirements for welfare programs like SNAP had

been abused. As we approach the end of the COVID-19 Emergency Authorization and previous laws go back into effect, it's past time for reform. It's time for my bill, the America Works Act.

Under existing law, Able-Bodied Adults Without Dependents (ABAWDs) are required to work or participate in work-related training or education for at least 20 hours per week in order to receive SNAP benefits. Unfortunately, states have long abused waivers for ABAWDs that allow them to suspend these very modest work requirements.

When the idea of work requirements gets brought up in Congress, many of my colleagues on the other

side are quick to call out Republicans for seeking to take away benefits from single mothers with young children and disabled Americans—that is not accurate.

1.36 million ABAWD households recorded zero gross income in 2020—if you have no children, no disabilities, no dependents, and no job—what are you doing with your day? People who can work, should work. Especially if they expect to receive government

assistance.

The America Works Act is simple. It restores the integrity of the SNAP state exemption waiver process by repealing language where the United States Department of Agriculture can simply grant a waiver for work requirements if a state “believes” it doesn't have enough jobs to provide employment to an individual. There are nearly 11 million open jobs in the United States, I'd challenge any state to prove with data


the “belief” that they can't find an American a job. Additionally, states can currently roll over their waivers from year to year. This has allowed states to rack up thousands of waivers, further abusing the program—my bill removes this rollover provision.

The America Works Act also changes age eligibility for SNAP waivers. Currently, if you are over 49 years old, you can receive SNAP benefits with no need for a waiver. As I approach 49 years old, I know I still have decades left of work ahead of me. My bill changes the maximum age rate of an ABAWD to be 65 years old, consistent with retirement and Medicare age.

Finally, the America Works Act limits the provision that exempts ABAWDs from work requirements if they have any dependent children to if they have any dependent children under the age of seven years old. By seven years old a child is in school nearly 35 hours a week. If a child can go to school nearly full-time, a parent with no other children under the age of seven can work 20 hours per week.

This bill is commonsense—and it continues to leave waivers in place for areas

with certain levels of unemployment. As Congress weighs solutions to our labor crisis, record government spending, and work requirements in the 2023 Farm Bill, I hope the America Works Act is strongly considered as a solution to lift Americans out of poverty and encourage work rather than government dependence.
