

PERRYVILLE AREA CHAMBER NEARING 100TH ANNIVERSARY

The first meeting of the newly organized Chamber of Commerce of Perryville was held at the Court House on January 19, 1923. The following were elected at the first Executive Board meeting: Phil Zoellner-President, Robert T. Brown-Vice President, Harry R. Phillips-Secretary and Ed. P. Krisler-Treasurer. From February 1923 through May 1936 the minutes were handwritten in a hardbound notebook. The current mission statement is: The mission of The Chamber of Commerce of Perryville, MO is to support and assist existing businesses; serve as the principal advocate for business in partnership with the community; act as the primary catalyst in promoting the economic health of the Perryville area, stimulating jobs and improving the quality of life.

The Perryville Chamber of Commerce celebrates 98

years this year. Can you even imagine all the changes the chamber has seen in those 98 years?

The February 1929 committees included: Entertainment; Telephone; Cow Day Program; Paving; City Limits Extension; Railroad; and Road Committee.

It is interesting to see over the past 98 years how committees under the Chamber have evolved. In 1940 Committees included: Road Sign & Highway Beautification; Merchants Interest; Agriculture; Airport; Streets and Roads; Parks. In 1956 the committees were Agriculture; Special Activities; Publicity and Signs; Merchants; and International Shoe Relations. 1979 Committees- Merchant, Agriculture, Industrial, Legislative, Social Events, Community Betterment, Membership, Highway & Publicity & Signs and the Finance Committee. 1992 Committees-Community

Betterment, Community Relations, Business, Mayfest.

Today our committees include: Networking & Education; Community Impact; Administration & Leadership; Mayfest; Xquisite Women's Conference. With a growing and continuously changing community each Board of Directors is constantly working to evolve the Chamber, so its programs are beneficial to all member businesses no matter their size.

Following are just a few things from the past: In 1935 meetings were held in the Ross Hotel. Items in the minutes included the International Shoe Factory, the Shoe Factory land lots that were for sale, and the Telephone Company made an interesting talk on the new telephone building and system that was to be installed assuring everyone that before the next annual

meeting the building would be completed and the new system in operation.

In 1950 items on meeting agendas included: notice of 123 chamber members; immediate need for additional outlets from the public square of the city of Perryville so as to connect with Highway No. 25 and an order was set to acquire right-of-way in order to assure the extension of North Jackson Street to Highway No. 25.

In 1963 the first Executive Secretary was hired. Viola Blechle came on board and was an important asset in the development of the permanent office of the Perryville Chamber of Commerce. Viola held her office until 1990. She saw many changes and improvements in the town that she so diligently served. Viola Blechle definitely left her mark on this organization and the Perryville community.

From the minutes of July 22, 1971: The Historical Society contacted the Chamber for funds to purchase the Faherty house. It was voted that the Chamber give \$100.00 to assist in the purchase.

From the minutes of April 28, 1983: Per-

ryville Soccer Cup Tournament was hosted and Perryville held the first soccer tournament in Southeast Missouri. Now we are home to the beautiful Bank of Missouri Soccer Complex. Soccer is a big part of the Perry County Community.

Today, the Chamber has more 360 business members, which include over 400 individual members. We value our members and strive to promote their businesses and their community activity. The Chamber office strives to inform this and surrounding communities on everything Perry County has to offer. We believe in shopping local and promoting everything in the community we live, work and play in. Including our small businesses, our schools, entertainment, industries, health and tourism. 2021 **MAYFEST****MAYFEST 5K LOOKS TO BE CROWDED ONCE AGAIN**

If a person wanted to kick the Mayfest off with a little morning jog, they are in luck.

The Perry Park Center will host its annual Mayfest 5K Run/Walk Saturday, May 8.

Registration is open from now until the time of the event. Signups begin at 6:45 a.m. on that Saturday and run until 7:45 a.m. The registration fee is \$20.

The course is typical of the 2019 event that started and ended at the Park Center and wound throughout the City Park. In past year's, there has been a kids race, but that will not happen until a later time.

"We haven't made any major changes to the route or the event itself," Recreation Supervisor Tessa Bollinger said. "We plan on having a kid's race later on down the road and make it its separate event."

A year ago, the Mayfest 5K was cancelled because of COVID-19 as the entire Mayfest was cancelled in 2020. Bollinger said it will be nice to have the event

back again in 2021.

"It will bring back a sense of normalcy," Bollinger said. "We are looking to bring the same event people have enjoyed for years."

Bollinger noted that there are already about 90 participants signed up, and they are expecting between 120-150 runners on race day.

"That's a great number for us," Bollinger said. "We just hope that we can have some good weather for the race."

Whatever weather the race day may have, Bollinger is eager for the day to arrive as she will be her first event she is in charge of after recently being hired at the Park Center.

"I couldn't be more excited," she said. "It will be fun to interact with all the runners and be involved in the community."

Each participant is guaranteed a t-shirt if they registered before the early bird date on April 25. Any entry received after the early deadline is not guaranteed a shirt on race day, but Bollinger said they can be



ordered. Awards will be handed out for the top overall male and top female runners as well as the top three in each age division.

CRAFT FAIR SET TO RETURN

The annual Mayfest Craft Fair will take place Saturday, May 8, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the downtown Square.

"We have many different hand-crafted items," said Renee Lottes, executive assistant and social media coordinator for the Perryville Area Chamber of Commerce. In addition to our many craft booths there will be "Direct sales, informational sales, the ADK cutest baby contest."

"It draws the people in, it really does because it's hard to find hand-crafted items," Lottes said. "There are just all kinds of different things that are made by hand, original pieces."

"We have 100-plus (vendors) signed up, and we have room for maybe 20 more," Lottes said.

Vendors will be set up around the courthouse, on Main Street, St. Joseph Street and Jackson Street.

As for this year's event, Lottes is optimistic and knows

others are ready as well.

"Very excited," Lottes said. "The crafters are raring to go. They have been working very hard for the last two years, getting items ready."

The craft fair offers a variety of purchase options.

"You can find anything from home decor to clothing to jewelry to bath items and even stuff for your pets," Lottes said. "It's a little something for everyone."

"There are a lot of unique items," she said. "We have 10x10 and 10x20 booth spaces available. Some of them can fill it up pretty full with different things. It seems like a majority of the things there are a lot of home decor, hand made, wooden items, candles and soaps."

Another part of the craft fair is the Alpha Delta Kappa baby photo contest, a local fund-raiser that helps the organization bring in money for scholarships.

"They set up Saturday," Lottes said. "Participants can enter a photo of their child, who's date of birth must between March 1, 2020 and February 28, 2021."

While many were disappointed that Mayfest was cancelled in 2020, one of the signature events is hoping to return for the first time since 2018. The pandemic wiped out all Mayfest activities a year ago and a thunderstorm prevented the annual decorated diaper contest and diaper derby from taking place in 2019.

"We're really hoping to get to have it this year," said Beth Yamnitz, one of the organizers.

The derby is about finding the quickest (or fastest) toddler.

"Our diaper derby is simply who can crawl to the finish line the quickest," Yamnitz said.

Five or six toddlers participate at a time. If a second heat is needed, they go ahead and do that.

"It's really cute," Yamnitz said. "It's amazing what they use to try and coax the kids over the line. It used to be keys. Now, it seems like it's cell phones."

In years past, the event has taken place on the street. This year, it'll take place on the stage.


"We're lucky enough to be able to have it on the stage," Yamnitz said. "If it's simply raining, we'll have it."

is that the diaper must be visible," Yamnitz said. "That's what you decorate. If you want to incorporate any other decorations, that is fine."

This year's theme is "Hometown Heroes", which will give participants a wide variety of options in terms of what they'll be wearing come Saturday, May 8.

Judges determine the winners in the decorated diaper contest.

"They go by the best costume, the best reaction from the crowd," Yamnitz said. "There are a couple of different

things that they judge on.

Both the decorated diaper contest as well as the diaper derby are opportunities to get the younger generation involved in Mayfest, according to Yamnitz.

"It's just a chance to bring more people in, participation from babies on up," Yamnitz. "They have things for the older people. This is for the younger ones."

"We're really excited, and it's cute," Yamnitz said. "People need to come out and watch it as well as participate."

A LOOK BACK AT THE INAUGURAL MAYFEST

Since 1985, the second weekend in May has been the annual Mayfest celebration in Perryville.

Portions of the article below appeared in the special section previewing the very first Mayfest.

Perryville will be abuzz with activity this week as the community readies itself for the first Mayfest.

Building on the area's strong German heritage, but leaving lots of room for local organizations to get into the act, the Mayfest

is designed to bring the community together for a few days of fun. The Mayfest will also be one of the main fundraisers of the year for the Chamber of Commerce and the Community Betterment Committee, so the proceeds will be set to work in a variety of civic efforts through the year.

The highlight of this year's Mayfest will be the appearance of "The Wendt Band," a duo which performs authentic German music and has made many appearances at community celebrations in the area.

The Mayfest is a street festival for the most part, centering in the area of North Jackson and Grand Avenue near the American Legion Hall (the area is one block northwest of the Courthouse square).

The core of the celebration is being built around the tradition "Chicken Dinner" hosted by the Community Betterment Committee.

Other entertainment scheduled includes a square dancing exhibition by the Perry Promenaders. The Perry County Historical Society will have an information booth on local German history. The Perry County Memorial Hospital will have an information booth and supply standby emergency services.

A display and slides on the Perry County Dave System will be presented by Tex Yokum, a noted spelunker.
