The public is invited to come support the 4-H members during the Perry County 4-H Fair and Chicken Dinner Wednesday, July 28 at the American Legion in Perryville.

Enjoy a meal at the annual event and see more than 400 projects and animals on display.

4-H members make the items or raise and train the animals, which will be on exhibit. The 4-H Chicken Dinner is set for Wednesday, July 28 from 3:30 to 7:30 p.m. in the American Legion Main Hall, 98 Grand Ave. in Perryville.

Carryouts will also be available from the Legion Walnut Room. All of the proceeds from the meal are used to pay 4-H members a small amount of premium money for their 4-H Fair exhibits.

The chicken dinner menu includes fried chicken, mashed potatoes and gravy, corn, slaw, and desserts.

The meal is \$10 for adults and all carryouts. Children (10 and younger) are \$6.50 for dine-in.

Tickets are available from any 4-H member. Individuals also can walk in and buy dinner tickets at the door.

A new feature of this year's event includes 4-H items on display in the American Legion Colonnade Room (Quonset Hut) building Wednesday, July 28 from 3 to 7:30 p.m. Animal judging will begin at 4 p.m. on the Legion grounds.

"Perry County 4-H members will showcase a variety of projects they have completed from beautiful arts and crafts to breathtaking photography to handmade woodworking pieces to shooting sports targets," said Dianna Koenig, 4-H Youth Program Associate with University of Missouri Extension.

The public is invited to come see 4-H members poultry, goats, bucket calves, dogs and more.

Animals and items will be on display until 7 p.m. Robotics judging is scheduled to take place at 5:30 p.m.

"We always have many 4-H alumni come back to the 4-H Fair each year to visit with friends and see what 4-H members are doing today," Koenig said. "Those who might be interested in joining 4-H are invited to come to the 4-H Fair and find out what in the world 4-H is all about. 4-H is more than a club, it is a community of young people who are learning leadership, citizenship and life skills. 4-H members are preparing themselves for the future while making new friends and having fun."
























Local 4-H projects to be on display

Dianna Koenig hopes that it is back and better than ever. The Perry County 4-H will hold its annual chicken dinner on July 28 from 3:30 to 7:30 p.m. at the American Legion Hall. The dinner returns as part of the annual Perry County 4-H fair after the dinner was cancelled in 2020 because of COVID-19.

The fair itself, which includes the students presenting their projects, was closed to the public last year.

"It's great to come back and actually have the dinner this year so that the money can go back to the kids this year." Koenig said. "Everything was so much smaller last year than in year's past. Every year we want to be able to show off the projects to community, and we weren't able to do that last year. We want to get back to that in 2021."

The proceeds from the meal go to provide a small premium toward the 4-H students projects.

"The premium is based on what ribbon the kids receive for their projects," Koenig said.

The meal is \$10 for adults, along with each carryout order, while children 10 and younger are \$6.50.

The meal consists of fried chicken, mashed potatoes, slaw, corn and desserts. 4-H members and their families will help serve during the meal.

"Who can deny themselves some of that famous American Legion chicken?" Koenig said. "It's some of the best around."

The hall will be set up a little differently for the din-

attend.. "It's really a culmination of all the work the members have put in over the course of the of the last year and
