



# On the Record March 1- March 3

## Savannah Police Dept.

The following items are derived directly from official Savannah Police Department reports and spokesmen.

### March 1

Shelby Marie Vinson, 570 Stag St., was arrested for DUI.

At approximately 1:10 a.m., an officer observed an SUV traveling on Wayne Road going 53 in a 35 mph speed zone. Witness the vehicle also crossing line onto the shoulder multiple times. Started to make a traffic stop when the vehicle accelerated and turned onto JI Bell Road. Officer used siren to stop vehicle and vehicle then ran over the divider onto the grass into Walmart's parking lot.

Officer asked driver, identified as Vinson to exit the vehicle and detected a strong smell of alcohol. When officer asked Vinson how much she had to drink, she replied, "too much," and "sorry." Officer also observed a half empty bottle of crown royal in passenger's side door. Vinson performed poorly on Standardized Field Sobriety Test and consented to a blood draw before being transported to jail.

Thomas Glenn Ross, 54, 145 Bellwood St., was arrested on charges of aggravated assault.

At approximately 9:30 p.m., police received a call for public service check at 135 Bellwood St. in regards to someone receiving threats of harm. Upon arrival victim told of-



ficer that Ross made threats to harm her and her grandmother, whose residence it was, after accusing them of being too loud. He then came at them with a knife while making threats of bodily harm. Call was cleared by arresting Ross.

Cameron Mitchell Davis, 51, 14180 Middleburg Road, Decaturville, was arrested for criminal simulation, driving while license was suspended, 6th, and improper use of vehicle registration.

At approximately 3:30 p.m., officer observed a 1999 red Chevrolet Sedan traveling West on Water St. with both the driver and passenger not wearing seatbelts. Conducted traffic stop

at 275 Pickwick St. and driver identified as Davis advised that his license was suspended and that he had five previous driving on a suspended license and dispatched informed that Davis had five previous driving while license was suspended and that the tag number was also registered to a different vehicle. Davis admitted to knowing the tag was wrong.

### March 2

Norman Casey Hansen, 53, 230 Ryan St., Apt E-8 was arrested for driving while license was suspended, canceled or revoked.

At approximately 2:30 p.m., an officer observed vehicle traveling West on Ryan St. and ran registration through dispatch and

it came back as not on file. Officer made traffic stop and driver identified as Hansen said he did not have license. Dispatch confirmed that Hansen's license has been suspended since September 2024.

Billy Dewayne Cummings, 33, 345 Gene Lane, was arrested for driving on revoked license for DUI, unlawful removal of registration and financial responsibility law.

At approximately 5:05 p.m., an officer who was patrolling Pickwick St. and Lacefield Drive when he observed a black Nissan traveling West on Lacefield with expired tag. Ran tag through dispatch, which came back registered to a different vehicle. Offi-

cer recognized driver, identified as Cummings, and knew he did not have a valid driver's license. When officer asked Cummings about why the tag didn't match the vehicle, he said that a friend was letting him use it until he could get the vehicle registered.

Brooklyn Paige Cannon, 25, 410 Horse Creek Road, was arrested for DUI, implied consent, and driving while license suspended, 2nd.

Officer received a call to 135 Bain Rd. at approximately 7:41 p.m. in response to a vehicle wreck. While en route officer advise that one vehicle left the scene and parked at a nearby store. Officer went to the store but the vehicle was empty but a witness informed him that driver was at the crash site in the small crowd that gathered there. Witness also told the officer there was an open container of alcohol beverage in the vehicle.

Officer returned to scene and announced

to the crowd that it is the driver's responsibility to report traffic accidents and Cannon stepped forward and said she was the driver. Officer could smell alcohol coming from her and she admitted to consuming alcohol before driving. Officer had Cannon perform the standardized field sobriety test and determined that she could not safely operate a vehicle. Cannon refused to take a blood test and when officer checked her license with dispatch he was notified that it was suspended for failure to maintain financial responsibility since May 2022 with no reinstatement.

An arrest was made for public intoxication at 45 Water St. at approximately 7:31 p.m.

### March 3

Carrie E. Grant, 40, 2255 Choate Creek Road, was arrested for disorderly conduct and resisting arrest due to not cooperating with officers and hospital staff at Hardin Medical Center.


